President welcomes surprise Cuba move

KENNEDY last night welcomed Mr. Khrushchev's surprise announcement to dismantle Soviet missile bases in Cuba as an "important and constructive contribution to peace."

Chairman Khrushchev's statesmanlike decision to stop dismantling offensive weapons and returning them under United Nations verification, Mr. Kennedy said.

The Presidential statement, read to reporters by the White House spokesman, said the United States would be in touch with U. Thant, U.N. Secretary-General, about measures to assure peace in the Caribbean sea.

As part of an agreement, President Kennedy has pledged in the Executive Order to give assurances against any U.S. invasion of the island.

U.S. told to leave base

Sir Edgar asks for time

THE Prime Minister of Southern Rhodesia, Sir Edgar Whitehead, asked the United Nations for "time" to build a non-racial State.

He said that it would be a "tragedy" if the European minority in his country disappeared. The 57-year-old Premier vigorously defended his government's policies in the Trusteeship Committee as 49 African and Asian nations sought to rush through a resolution before consultation comes into effect today.

Britain has not responded to Assembly resolutions calling on it to intervene in the territory, which it holds to be a self-governing colony.

Sir Edgar reaffirmed that the Constitution would act in effect as a platform and that solutions which are being proposed by African nationalists, would be held on December 14.

The Prime Minister said it was untrue to say that the White minority intended to cling to power for ever. But there was equality of ideas that "within one day what has been a White Government will change into an entirely Black Government."

Risking future

"That is not an approach at all," he added.

Realising that he had formed an African majority within 15 years, he said he had signed the political future to proceed this "deal" if the new Constitution was accepted in the spirit in which it was drafted, a genuine multi-racial society with common aims could be built in four to five years.

Sir Edgar said he had done more to reduce racial discrimination in four years office than others had done in 40 years, and he pledged himself to "complete the task."

Referring to his recent ban on the Zimbabwe African People's Union, which the assembly had repealed, he said he had consulted the Prime Minister, and certain "difficulties" in Southern Rhodesia had refused to allow any sort of life-or-let-live arrangement.

Murder of couple baffles police

SABDIHAN police investigating the murder of the Nakuru couple, Mr. and Mrs. Edmund Tsvonaly, admitted yesterday that they were mystified by the crime as there seemed to be no motive.

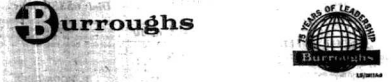

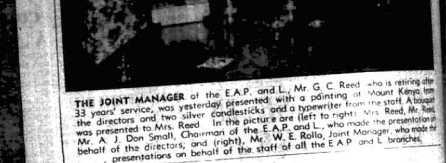

Nehru sad and grieved, says Tunku

Indian troops exchanged fire near Walong, near the border yesterday, to end a three-day lull in the border war. The first Indian aircraft carrying military supplies for India was on its way.

The plane, from Frankfurt, West Germany, was due in Calcutta last night after a refuelling stop at Adana, Turkey. It was the first of ten U.S. transport aircraft which will operate a round-the-clock airlift of equipment to India.

New Delhi, the Turkish Government has offered the Indian Army mountain howitzers and American aircraft to supply arms to India if they declare war with China, the Prime Minister, Tunku Abdul Rahman, said in Kuala Lumpur yesterday on his return from a tour of India and Pakistan.

"There is no purpose in giving arms since China and India have not declared war. To do so will tantamount to encouraging both sides to fight," he added. The Tunku said Mr. Nehru wanted a compromise with honour with the Chinese. "He is a very worried and sad man," he said.

Letter from Mr. Khrushchev

An External Affairs Ministry spokesman in New Delhi disclosed last night that the Prime Minister, Mr. Nehru, had received a communication from the Soviet Premier, Nikita Khrushchev. But its contents were not disclosed. Earlier, the Indian Ambassador to the Soviet Union, Mr. T. N. Kaul, flew back to Moscow.

India is maintaining a force of 4,000 Tibetan Stratum Kampas refugee fighters in the border region against the Chinese. It was reported from Kashmir, the Khamti, who fled to India when the Dalai Lama escaped from Tibet in 1959, have been used for the past three years to build roads in the Ladakh area.

"They have now offered to fight alongside Indian troops," the spokesman said. "They are experienced fighters, trained in guerrilla tactics and accustomed to the high altitudes of Ladakh, where conditions are similar to high-altitude Tibet."

CHINESE reinforcements were being moved up for an expected attack on a Ladakh airstrip last night as India announced further mobilisation plans.

At talks between the Home Minister, Mr. Bahadur Shastri, and the Chief Ministers of States it was decided that all able-bodied young men in the areas bordering China should be given rifle training. This applies to the States of West Bengal, Bihar, Uttar Pradesh, Punjab and Kashmir.

The Defence Ministry in New Delhi reported yesterday that Chinese reinforcements were arriving at positions a few miles from Chinali, Ladakh, the highest airstrip above ten of 12 miles south of the McMahon line.

This is the first time that the Chinese have been observed having crossed the McMahon line into the deep in Subansiri and Kamohimbi in the extreme eastern part of the Indian frontier. Indian troops were reported to have on a party of Chinese who tried to approach one of their positions in the vicinity of Chinali.

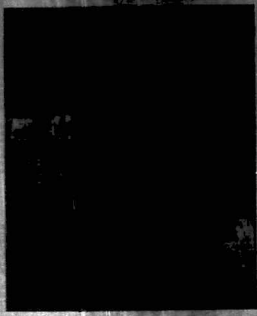

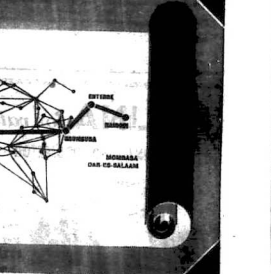
