## INDO-PAKISTAN 'CROSSROADS' Role of E.A.A. 'immense'

### Leaders differ in reaction to peace talks

WIDELY differing views on the Indo-Pakistan agreement to hold talks on Kashmir were expressed by the two countries' leaders yesterday as the Pakistan Parliament met and adjourned today, with the Government asking for time to draft a statement on the agreement.

In Lahore, President Ayub Khan of Pakistan telegraphed: 'I feel we are at the crossroads, both India and Pakistan, and if we can settle the Kashmir dispute — and I do not see why we cannot if there is the will — we can bring peace and happiness to the 550,000,000 people of the subcontinent.'

The President said he was hearing to know that there was a growing realisation in the minds of Indian leaders, especially Mr. Nehru, that a solution of the Kashmir problem would be beneficial to both countries.

### Change 'harmful'

In New Delhi, Mr. Nehru told a questioner that anything that meant upsetting the present arrangements in Kashmir would be 'very harmful'. He told the press there was no basis for reports that a settlement of the dispute would be based on the partition of Jammu and Kashmir.

Mr. Nehru said he had yet been set for the talks. He had explained India's position to Mr. Sardar, the British Commonwealth Secretary, and the American Secretary, U.S. Assistant Secretary of State, and told them it was not possible to bypass or ignore India's basic principles.

He referred to other reports that the talks would be held on a preliminary basis without a settlement of the Kashmir question, and said they were completely without concern for India. He said questions it was not for Mr. Sardar to answer any suggestion to suggest what kind of talks India should have.

In Rawalpindi, Opposition leaders in the Pakistan National Assembly criticized the agreement. Banoor Khan, leader of the Opposition and leader of the Government, and the Opposition said they were taking the agreement as a challenge to the country's leaders.

## Lowest-paid workers will benefit

### WAGE increases involving an expenditure of approximately £25,000 a year have been awarded to 18,300 railway employees in East Africa by the East African Railways and Harbours Staff Association.

The workers involved are those on the lowest wage scale — the Group C class — and will receive 50c a month increase if they are stationed in rural areas and 75c if employed in urban areas. The increase comes into effect today and the award is binding on both employees and employer for a period of one month. A spokesman for the E.A.R. and H. said yesterday that about 3,000 workers in rural areas and 1,200 in urban areas will receive the increase.

The tribunal, which sat under the chairmanship of Mr. W. C. Rodgers, also recommended that the basic wage of unskilled employees should not be less than 5c above the statutory minimum wage applicable in the area in which they are employed, if a wage register (General Order) is introduced.

The basic wage of unskilled employees in other areas should be not less than 10c more than the basic wage of employees in the area of employment.

FOOTNOTES: The award was announced this week in the weekly publication of the Railway Administration which will have a record circulation of 21,500,000 by the end of 1952.
