

BOMBAY PORT KILL FOUR RIOTERS Harbour paralysed by strikers

Four rioters were killed by police in Bombay yesterday in fresh demonstrations over the Government's decision to put the city under martial law.

Police opened fire on rioters who had blocked and interfered with transport services in Poona, in the industrial north of Bombay. The area was put under curfew.

Left-wing parties called a general strike in protest at the Government's plan. More than 2,000 dockers stopped work and the city's 62 tramlines were closed.

Police tried to set fire to buses and trams after warning them. Passengers were pulled out and made to wear black flags. Since the trouble began 64 people have been arrested.

Society makes a second protest

A statement issued by the Society in London said the first protest was sent to the Queen on 22nd Feb and was formally acknowledged.

"The Queen Mother may be unwell," the statement said, "which prevents tubbing and the Royal children are being taken to the meet in a flying silver car by one to be torn in pieces by strong hounds to blood them."

"We are sure more hope that the Royal children may not be encouraged to indulge in a sport which is a cruel and a blood-thirsty one."

Last week a similar protest was received by the League Against Cruel Sports.

New archdeacon takes over in Seychelles

Archdeacon J. D. Preece, former schoolmaster of Mauritius, has arrived in Mahe to take over the Anglican curacy of the Seychelles.

Mr. Preece, who was previously Charles Hoach, who was asked by the Bishop of Colombo to return to his post.

Mr. Henry Robinson, the Minister of State for Colonial Affairs, told the House of Commons last July that Archdeacon Hoach had "retired up a bit of trouble in a community where there is a very great difference between the different denominations."

Archdeacon Hoach, presenting himself at St. Paul's Cathedral in July, said he had been granted the newly freed freedom in the islands where Roman Catholics numbered only 90 per cent of the total population of 20,000.

East Africa's first nurses' school to open in March

THREE-YEAR STUDENT COURSES

FOR the first time in East Africa, girls are to be able to train as nurses from school. A new training college, opening in March at the European Hospital, Nairobi, will provide three-year courses which will take student nurses right through to their final examinations.

Previously, there have been two-year courses for student nurses in East Africa, these had to go to Britain or South Africa for all of their education.

Girls entering the course will study for nursing and theory in a preliminary school, which will be housed in a classroom at the hospital for the time being. After three months of preliminary study, they will then go to the main school for the remainder of their course.

Eight students

At the end of their first year, the successful girls will take a two-year course at the main school, which will be housed in a building at the hospital in staff quarters to be completed in 1955.

At first, there will be eight students.

After they have been the preliminary training school, a new group of 20 students will enter at the main school in 1955. A further 20 will enter in 1956 and a further 20 in 1957.

The school will see a maximum of 48 students at any one time, with a waiting list of 100.

132 OFFICERS READY FOR FARM PLAN

Satisfactory progress has been made with arrangements for the Department of Agriculture required for the Swynnerton Plan for African farming development, according to a report by the Minister for Agriculture.

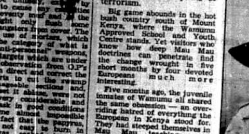

'SERIOUS SLOWING' OF MEDICAL DEVELOPMENT

Director blames Emergency

THE Emergency continued to affect adversely almost every activity of the Kenya Medical Department throughout the Colony during the year. The Director of Medical Services, Dr. T. Farworth Anderson, states in his report for 1951. "The financial straggle resulting from the Emergency has caused a serious slowing down of the long-term development programme which had been envisaged," the Director says.

"At this financial straggle... it would appear that the future will have to be even more severely curtailed."

The department's total expenditure... was £282,318 compared with £273,982 for half the year in 1951. The increase was due to expansion of medical services... About £220,000 was spent in 1951 on medical projects in the development plan.

Strain on staff
The Director says that the expansion of certain departments, notably police, prisons, and administration, threw a great strain on qualified medical staff already adversely affected by difficulties in recruiting.

It had been possible to replace... by engaging practitioners locally, either on a full-time or part-time basis. By the end of the year this source had ceased to exist.

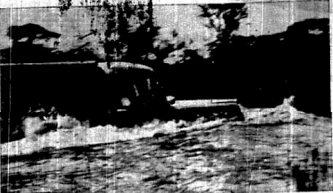

According to Mr. K. M. Cowley, the Secretary for African Affairs, about 60 members of the K.M.K. society were arrested after police investigations.

RELAX CONTROL ON RATING

More power proposed for local authorities

LOCAL authorities in Kenya will be able to raise a rate of up to four per cent of the unimproved value of land without getting the approval of the Government or Council of Ministers if a Bill repealing and re-enacting the Local Government Rating Ordinance is approved by the Legislature. The Bill aims to relax control on rates and to include a levy on improvements, raising the minimum rate from 1/6 to 1/12. The Bill seeks to make amendments designed to improve the method of rating property.

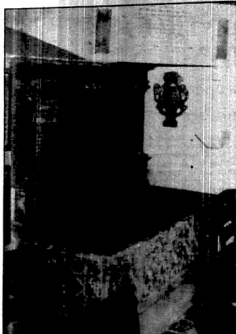
