Italian Aeroplane Disaster
MILITARY MACHINE CRASHES IN EGYPT

All Occupants Killed
PASSENGERS INCLUDE CABINET MINISTER AND WELL-KNOWN EXPLORER

An Italian military aeroplane, while on a flight from Italy to Eritrea, crashed 12 miles from Heliopolis, in Egypt, and the four members of the crew and the three passengers were killed. The wreckage was discovered by British Air Force mechanics, which went out in search.

According to a message from Rome, sabotage is suspected as being the cause of the disaster, as the machine was in perfect order when it left Cairo and the weather conditions were good.

The victims of the disaster include Signor Luigi Razzani, the Minister for Public Works, and Signor Raimondo Franchetti, a well-known explorer, who had previously conducted expeditions in Abyssinia.

An Official Investigation

Labour Will Repudiate Carter Commission

OPPOSED TO RESERVATION OF KENYA HIGHLANDS

Colonial Vote Debate

"WE ARE NOT AT ALL SATISFIED WITH THE GOVERNMENT OF KENYA."

During the debate on the Colonial Office vote in the House of Commons, leading members of the Liberal and Labour Parties made it quite clear that they were opposed to the reservation of the Kenya Highlands for European settlers.

Mr. W. Lunn, one of the foremost Labour critics of Colonial policy, said: "It is bound to say that a Labour Government would never agree to that idea and we will repudiate it as soon as ever it is possible to do so."

At another stage in his speech Mr. Lunn declared: "We are not at all satisfied with the Government of Kenya and the domination of settlers in that area... We regard it as the worst form of a Government in the Empire."

Same speaker expressed the view that Income Tax ought to be imposed on the European people of Kenya and he asserted that the Kenya Treasury was being used as a milch cow by the white settlers to the detriment of the Africans.

Settlers Use Treasury as Milch Cow

London (By Air Mail). Many important references to the problems of the East African territories, especially those of Kenya, were made by members of all parties in the House of Commons during the debate on Colonial Office Estimates. On Saturday afternoon the "East African Standard" there appeared a report, the contents of which were summarized by the Secretary of State for the Colonies, Mr. Malcolm MacDonald, who stated that the economic condition of the Colonies is a factor to the Imperial "Caucasus Empire".

Liberal View

The first critic was Sir Robert Balfour, Liberal Member for Orkney and Shetland, and an ex-Chief Justice of Kenya and ex-Chief Secretary of State for the Colonies. Sir Robert referred to the proposal that an Order in Council should be issued defining and regulating the positions of the Highlands of Kenya and said he was afraid that a not very accurate idea existed as to the history of the matter. He briefly outlined the position stating that when the invitation was issued to the first to go to the Highlands it was on the understanding that an area would be reserved for them, that the country was then a Protectorate and the Indians who were there would have an opportunity of taking up land in that area. Lord Zetland, who was Colonial Secretary in 1901, was most unwilling to pass any legislation of a discriminatory character against British subjects and therefore directed that "as a matter of order only be issued to Europeans to the effect that any tract of land which should be subject to that approval."

The Highland Case

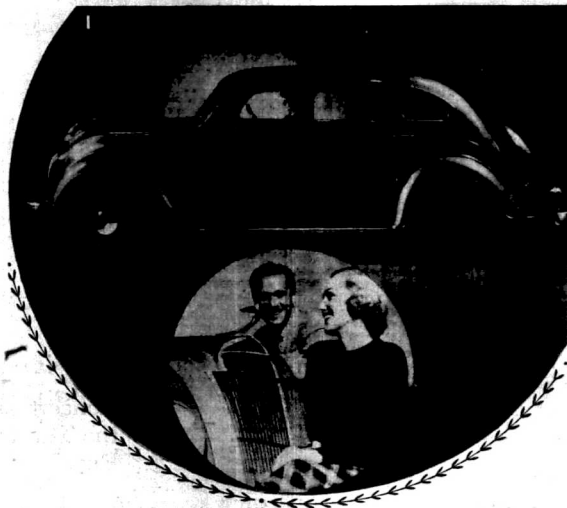

ACTIVITIES OF KENYA ASSOCIATION

Report for Month of July

MORE PUBLIC SUPPORT NEEDED

The following report has been issued on the activities during the month of July by the Kenya Association:—

Publicity

Brochures and pamphlets numbering 1,514 were issued during the month. There has been a marked increase in the demand from the United States for information about Kenya.

It is evident, however, that a very great deal of ignorance still exists, even in other parts of Africa about the Colony. A letter recently received from the Union was addressed "Nairobi, Northern Rhodesia" and asked for information about that territory which an enquiry from an Automobile Association in South Africa asked for information about the road between Nyasaland and Johannesburg.

Mr. J. I. Lipscomb's article in the "Small Farmer" appeared in the Johannesburg "Star" and it is hoped to follow this up with articles on the state of agricultural development in Kenya.

Photographs of the Agricultural Show have been forwarded to the Kenya Agent and there is an increasing demand for pictures of the Colony from South Africa, America, and elsewhere.

Through the courtesy of the Royal Agricultural and Horticultural Society, the Association was granted the use of a stand in a favourable position at the Agricultural Show in Nairobi. The same arrangement as at the last show was followed and the Agricultural Association joined in staging a very effective exhibit which attracted a large number of visitors.

The Kenya Agent has continued to be supplied with cuttings from the press every week by air mail, and 4,000 copies of the new issue of "Kenya: Britain's Most Attractive Colony" have been dispatched to him.

It has been arranged for the Secretary to give a welcome talk about the work of the Association on August 27.

Major Cawthorne's Tour

Through the courtesy of the "East African Standard," articles on the coming visit of Major Cawthorne, who is making a tour of Kenya after visiting Rhodesia and Nyasaland, have appeared in the daily press. The preparation of his itinerary has been a matter of considerable difficulty as invitations were received for him to visit a large number of areas and it was impossible to fit them all in during the course of a visit lasting less than four weeks.

The itinerary which has been finally approved by Government, however, will enable Major Cawthorne to see a great many centres and to seize of the opportunities of settlement for retired officers of the Indian Army in the Colony. It has been arranged for the Secretary of the Association to accompany him on his tour and this should prove of great assistance in the Association's work.

A special request was received from Army Headquarters in India that Major Cawthorne should visit as many schools as possible in the Colony in order to see how educational facilities are provided, and it is unfortunate that his visit should fall during the month of August when the schools are on holiday.

Numerous Vacancies in London

WIDE CHOICE OF JOBS

Few Juveniles Living Near Metropolitan Area

(STANDARD'S CORRESPONDENT)
London, July 30.
(By Air Mail.)

There is an enormous shortage of juvenile workers in London and over the whole of the south and eastern sections of England. Of the 20,000 boys and girls who left school only last Friday, those in the home-counties are being immediately absorbed in vocations that have been awaiting applicants for weeks, and in some cases for months.

Persons for the shortage of girl workers in the City and Central London were given by an official of the juvenile section of the Ministry of Labour. "London has spread so rapidly outward," he said, "that there are now comparatively few girls and boys living within a short distance of the metropolitan area. The parents, and, of course, the girls and boys themselves, try to find work in their own suburbs, as it will save them time in travelling and fare."

Another Reason

"Another reason is the great growth in industry and business in this section of the country. Occasionally, when figures are published, you may see that there are, say, 3,000 boys and girls unemployed in the London area. This is probably correct—but for a day or so. Usually they are registered as they go from one job to another. There are hundreds of boys and girls who make a choice always of a down job each."

"The number of children who will be employed by industry from now until 1927 will increase steadily, for they are the children born just after the war. Not until 1914 will the numbers drop to the war-level. From this increase we have plenty of jobs. That is why we are starting the scheme of transferring children from the depressed areas to these prosperous areas around London and in the Midlands."

Unions like the National Society of Operative Printers and Assistants and the National Union of Clerks, are beginning for girls to fill vacancies. They have offered to give girls brought from other places temporary union cards, so that they may have union wages.

Union-Castle Line Vessels

The announcement is made by the Union-Castle Line that the first of their two new mail vessels being built for the South African service, the "Shielding Castle" (25,000 tons) will sail outwards from Southampton on February 7, 1926. The second vessel, so far unnamed,—also of 25,000 tons—will sail outwards on May 22, 1926.

Membership

The paid up membership of the Association now stands at 375, an increase of 46, since the beginning of the year.

While the largest number by the public is still to some extent disappointing and many expressions of publicity are the early misadventure of shortage of funds, the usefulness of the Association in increasing the services which it is enabled to render to visitors and new settlers are becoming more appreciated.

"EMPIRE REVIEW AND MAGAZINE"

Union Between Kenya and Tanganyika

An article by Mr. Eric Reid, of Montreal, entitled "Tanganyika, the Lincoln of Africa," is, to East Africans, the most interesting item in the June issue of the "Empire Review and Magazine."

It is clear that since 1924, when a threat was made to pull up the Moshi-Via railway link between Tanganyika and Kenya," he writes, "the recognition has ceased, and has grown stronger with every year, that these East African territories are in all essentials one and the same country.

It has been mentioned that the depression precipitated the present movement towards complete union. Flooded as he now is by the stark series of unbalanced budgets extending over the past year, staggering under the burden of heavy loan charges in railways and other capital expenditure in which he had no real votes; and saddled with an expensive and over-elaborate multiplication of government overheads—in both Tanganyika and Kenya the tax payer has started furiously to quit. Quite a modest amount of reflection shows that young and undeveloped countries such as these East African colonies can no longer support the scale of taxation needed to maintain these separate bureaucracies at their present high level."

Mr. Reid's article concludes: "The conviction is increasingly held that a form of union satisfactory to both States can be evolved by negotiation on the spot."

The Review includes, among interesting articles from all parts of the Empire, an article on South Africa by Sir Abo. Bailey, a well-known writer of former Government service states: "These colonies were lost to Germany by the just verdict of the sword."

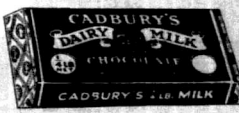
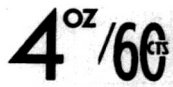

He had asked what saving could be effected by the Colonies if the interest on these loans could be reduced to 2 1/2 per cent. . . .

Colonel Wedgwood, Labour Newcastle-under-Lyme: "But conservation could only be made at an immense cost at this time. The loans are old."

Sir Edward Grigg: "I expected that intervention but I am grateful to my Right Hon. and gallant Friend for making it. Sir Edward turned to the economic side of the Colonial problem. The whole problem of Africa, he said, was how to make economic developments keep pace with the demands for services which were being made. The demand for services was going ahead of the power to provide them with the present economic development. . . .

guarantee and the stock traded as Trustee stock. He suggested that attention should be given to the possibility of producing some kind of guaranteed stock for the Colonial Empire as a whole which the Imperial Government and the Treasury could approve.

Sole Detraction

Another suggestion which he adopted the Colonial Secretary would say has most concerned the very rapid deterioration of the soil in Africa. The problem really required to be dealt with much more firmly. He remembered that a witty person in Kenya said that the greater benefit that could possibly be bestowed on the natives would be the demonstration of the great and there was a great deal of truth in that observation. . . .

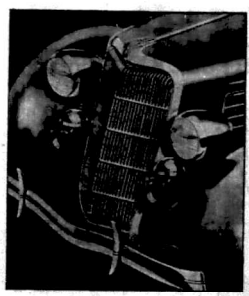

training useful services. "Take the Colonies, Mr. Malcolm MacDonald, said that the Hon. Member for Ilkesham, Mr. Lunn, had spoken about the proposed Order in Council with regard to the Kenya settlers and expressed a good deal of horror and expressed that European settlers only should be allowed to settle in the Colonies. "He said a "tolerate any legislation of the present position. In fact both Labour Governments intend the Administrative practice. In effect they European completely the practice with regard to the question of settlement. It is not possible to allow to the country, and even if an Ordinance were put through which laid the position to effect it would make no attention in practice. With regard to the question of legislation it is in an Order in Council, all I can say is that the matter is under consideration now and a decision on the actual point has been taken and I cannot say any more than that at present moment."

The Settler Mr. MacDonald then dealt with Sir Edward Grigg's speech particularly with certain questions put by him in "as usual an extraordinary interest and constructive contribution to the discussion." In regard to real estate, the Colonial Secretary said that question was being tackled and mentioned that the Colonial Development Fund had authorized a grant to Kenya of £25,000 for the establishment of a factory to turn some of the cattle into fertilizer. He (Sir Edward Grigg) raised the question of the White Paper and the position of their mortgage and suggested that the Government might come to their assistance in that matter. The Government have already come to their assistance a good deal. The Land Bank which he mentioned, and which we welcome, has already advanced to the settlers in the Colony £500,000 and under certain other authorities an additional £110,000 has been advanced to help them in their rather serious position. Actually they have been advanced an average of something like £300 a head already. Nevertheless there is no getting away from the fact that the position of many of them is very serious and it is not possible to do anything further at the moment than that a proposal has been put up for an addition to the funds of the Land Bank. This will require a loan and the whole matter is receiving consideration by the Colonial Office at the present time. Of course I cannot possibly myself either way. The matter is still under consideration."

Workers' Compensation In regard to the suggestion of the re-employment of Labour Department and Labour Officers, Mr. MacDonald said "I have already given instructions in the House which I think should be reviewed because the Office would like to satisfy myself in the organization of the administration where mining is going on and that the staffing of the Administration are such that the proper interests of native mine workers are protected. If I find that there is any case for the re-employment of additional Labour Officers I will certainly be anxious to see that that establishment takes place." Under my predecessor, the Colonial Office was taking a very great interest in the question of Workers' Compensation and during his period of office draft legislation for the African Colonies where the question is relevant has been drawn up in the office and has been circulated to the Colonies concerned. We have our draft model legislation for the African Colonies and we have also as a means of discussion between the Governments and the Colonies a Workers' Compensation Bill which is established throughout our African Colonies in the near future and after that we shall be able to extend the system steadily over all the other Colonies where it is appropriate.

United Kingdom itself has gained in relation to the Colonies. Let me give a few figures to prove that point. In 1931 the United Kingdom exported to the Colonies £33,000,000 worth of goods; that was before the adoption of the new economic policy. In 1954 that value of exports from the United Kingdom to the Colonies had risen from £39,000,000 to only £38,340,000. It is not "cases the total exports were 8.4 per cent of the whole. As regards the traffic coming the other way, the imports from the Colonies to the United Kingdom, there was a very substantial increase between 1931 and 1954 — from £26,000,000 to £48,000,000. Therefore this policy as a principle is certainly looking after and furthering the interests of the people in the Colonies."

Educational Development in Kenya

HISTORICAL SURVEY OF PROGRESS

Department's Annual Report

PROVISION FOR TRAINING OF TEACHERS IN THE COLONY

Feature of the annual report for 1964 of the Kenya Education Department, just issued, is a comprehensive historical survey of the progress and development of education in the Colony in respect of the various races.

The report states that in view of the fact that European primary teachers are included in the Local Civil Service, it is essential to provide some means for the training of teachers locally. Negotiations have since been opened with the National Frontier Union for that purpose.

The important question of compulsory education received a good deal of attention and publicity during the year, but the continued need for economy rendered it impossible to give practical effect to any of the recommendations made to the Department.

Economy and Efficiency

An interesting historical survey of educational development in Kenya is featured in the Kenya Education Department's annual report for 1964. The survey is divided into four sections and deals respectively with African, European, Indian and Arab education. The feature of the annual report for the African in Kenya, the Education Department, just issued, is a comprehensive historical survey of the progress and development of education in the Colony in respect of the various races.

African Education

The Education Department's first year in 1911, when the first Director, Mr. J. R. Gorr, was appointed, from that time Government has increasingly subsidised approved mission schools. The first Government school was opened at Mombasa in 1912. This was a primary school. The first secondary school was opened at Mombasa in 1913. In these two years the Government's interest in education was clearly expressed by the opening of two more primary schools and the opening of the first secondary school. mineral was not the only factor in reducing road costs, as a good road was also important...

Benefits to all Communities

Mr. Fletcher, vice-president of the Chamber of Commerce, presented a Memorandum from the Chamber as a whole, and also on behalf as Vice-President...

By the construction of this road 17 miles would be saved on the route generally used, and taking the transport of 30 tons of cargo, 1000 lbs. per ton, at 7/10 per mile, the cost of transport between Eldoret and Kakamega would be reduced by 24% per return journey, or 25 per cent.

The new road would cost £225 per annum in interest and redemption, and £720 per annum in maintenance on the new portion. There could be saved from this latter figure approximately £200 which would be devoted to maintenance of the 119 miles of existing roads which would no longer be required as main trunk roads, and which would revert to native council roads.

There were already certain firms using the road regularly aggregating at a minimum 400 lorry loads per annum, so that with the existing traffic more than half the annual expenditure was covered by the existing users of the road.

"This new road" he said "will mean benefit to the grower, the transporter, and the mining community, but since this again means savings on imported commodities, it is obvious that the country will benefit as a whole by the savings."

"This district has suffered more than any other during the last few years, and asks to be allowed to help itself towards recovery, economically and financially. There is a potential market at our doors, and it can be given to us at competitive prices, provided only that a shorter route of first class road were provided."

Pit Prop. Possibilities

With regard to the possibilities of the pitprop industry, it was stated that there were at least 15,000 acres of wet ground available on the Plateau at present and that at Piccadilly Circus, over the new road, pitprop of 10 ft. could be delivered at a price of 1/10 per pole.

Mr. Kirkham and Mr. Nestor also argued in favour of the road, on behalf of the Kipkaret farmers. Mr. Nestor maintained that the nearest European settlement in the district was the Eldoret district, which possessed a healthy climate, and where he hoped that people might be induced to take up small holdings from which they could travel to the mining district in an hour's run.

Captain Mundell, Chairman of the Eldoret Municipal Board, stated that the question of this proposed new road had been very fully considered by the Board for many months past, and they had come to a unanimous decision that it was definitely required for the benefit of the community.

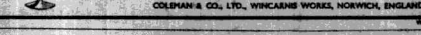
