Effect on Cost of Living Mr. Wolfe did not think it added much to the cost of coffee and salaries. In both cases we are in effect enacting a law which affects a large number of people, and which is absolutely prohibitive and the practice of money-lending.

Since neither Government nor individuals will lend money free of profit it will be interesting to see how the vital factor will be dealt with in any legislative measure that may be adopted.

There are some of the chief causes of financial embarrassment. There is still another major cause—perhaps the most important—and that is thriftlessness.

To the Editor, "E.A. Standard."
Sir.—The letter of "Significant" to the "East African Standard" is, in my view, not only correct but also in the opinion of a large majority of my countrymen.

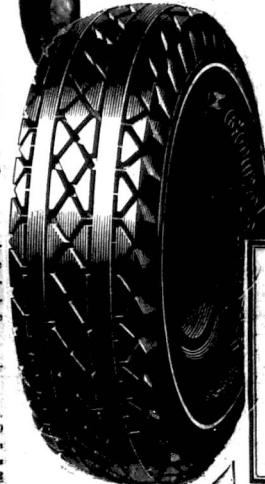

(Continued from page 1.)

Italy's Goals Availed

Paris, later.

The primary aim of the British and French delegations at the Three Power Conference is to discover Italy's precise minimum claims on Ethiopia, Gibraltar, and no real progress can be made and the Negro cannot be expected to state the maximum he is prepared to offer.

The British and French Governments have been trying vainly since May to obtain this information from Addis Ababa, but Rome after much to-and-fro with the Negro who contemplates afternoon meeting, and the conversations will resume to-morrow to state the maximum he is prepared to offer.

The British and French delegations are convinced that Abyssinia is prepared to go to the very limit of satisfaction, and if Italy frankly states her demands they may, to a great extent, be met by the Negro who contemplates guarantees and protection for Italian economic facilities including rights of mining, rail and road construction and agricultural development.

Abyssinia's Offer
(By Telegram.)

Brigly, Aug. 17.

The delegates to the Three Power Conference in Paris did not meet this morning. It is understood the French and British delegations have asked that Italy should specify in more precise form than she has done, the minimum requirements. From the information available, they then understood that Abyssinia is prepared to consider certain concessions which might go some way to meeting the Italian requirements and it is desired to see the part of an adviser. The part of Italy, the gulf between the diplomats, which has to be bridged, can at least be reduced.

In addition to yesterday's talks between Mims, there were frequent contacts between experts of the three delegations and different diplomatic documents concerning the relations of the three countries are being set for a joint examination and report.

The Chief Points

Today's press comment is notable for the emphasis it lays on two points.

One is that the parties concerned in the dispute must all make contribution to a settlement, and that if that is done in the interests of peace and common sense, both sides should be ready to accept a solution giving reasonable satisfaction to both sides without real success from the present conversations.

The second point is that the French and British delegates have together taken a firm stand both on moral and legal grounds and refuse to be swayed by any offer of enforcing unjustified and inequitable concessions. British officials wireless service.

Further Delay
(By Telegram.)

Paris, August 17.

The further meeting of the tripartite conference expected this afternoon was postponed, but the talks may be resumed this afternoon. The reason for the delay is understood to be that Baron Mouselli, whose answer is awaited, is awaiting instructions from Rome.

Proposals to Italy

Paris, later.

Today was a blank day in the Three Power Conference but the British and French delegations have submitted proposals for a settlement of the dispute to Signor Mussolini, whose answer is now awaited.

According to a well informed French source the proposals are that as far as Britain and France are concerned, Abyssinia be left open for Italian economic development.

The "Echo de Paris" says it is increasingly obvious that Britain and Italy are engaged on a trial of strength or rather determination.

The Conference is not meeting further today but Mr. Eden and Mr. Laval had 45 minutes' conversation this afternoon.

Britain Cannot Wait

British quarters frankly state that the British delegation do not intend to wait more than two or three days for Signor Mussolini's answer.

It is understood that Mr. Eden has not agreed to the proposal of financial assistance nor Italian advisers pending the receipt of Signor Mussolini's observations on the matter.

UNSATISFACTORY REPLY BY SIGNOR MUSSOLINI TO PROPOSALS

It is revealed that the cause of the adjournment of the Three Power Conference during the week-end was the unsatisfactory reply by Italy to the proposals by Britain and France that Italy be granted economic rights in Abyssinia conditional upon the maintenance of Abyssinia's political and territorial integrity and the agreement of Abyssinia and the League.

Mr. Anthony Eden, it is stated, sees no chance of avoiding a clash at the League meeting next month, when Italy is expected to withdraw from the League, although M. Laval is searching hard to find a formula to satisfy both Britain and Italy. Messages from Rome state that war, commencing in October, is almost a foregone conclusion.

Britain is strongly opposed to the Italian demand for political suzerainty in Abyssinia. The only possibility for reaching a settlement is for Italy to reduce her claims, but her present attitude gives no ground for such a hope.

Italy Determined on Invasion

It is understood that the Italian Government is determined on invading Abyssinia, backed by an army of occupation. The League meeting in September, the opinion is expressed, will have a better result than the Paris Conference, and may have a much more serious outcome. The first step is that Italy realises that Britain intend on trying to stop war which Italy's resignation from the League must move Italy than a month ago.

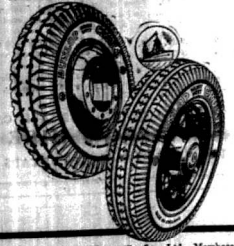

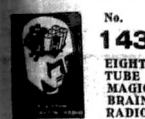

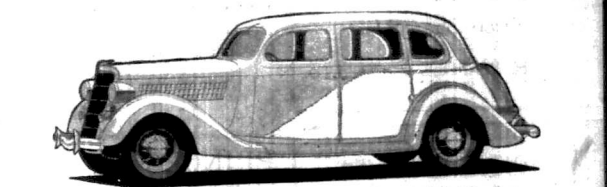

Adequate Medical Facilities on Lupa

STRONG PROTESTS BY DIGGERS AND MINERS

Deputation Waits on Governor

SEQUEL TO CONVICTION OF EUROPEAN IN MANSLAUGHTER CASE

Strong protests against the lack of proper medical facilities in the Lupa Controlled Area were recorded in resolutions adopted recently at a general meeting of the Lupa Gold Diggers and Miners' Association at which the medical case of the recent conviction of a European by the High Court at Chungu on a charge of manslaughter arising out of the death of one of his Native employees.

The view was expressed by the meeting that the inadequacy of the medical services in the Lupa Area had been a contributory cause of the circumstances which led to the European being sentenced to twenty years' imprisonment for willful negligence resulting in the death of the Native. The accused has since appealed.

Following on the meeting a deputation from the Association waited on the Acting Governor, Mr. P. E. Mitchell, who subsequently issued a memorandum setting out the reasons for his decision during the course of the interview. He admitted that deficiencies existed in the medical arrangements on the Lupa. Provision had been made, however, for these deficiencies to be remedied to some extent at least.

Official Memorandum

MEMORANDUM FOR THE ACTING GOVERNOR BY THE SECRETARY FOR HEALTH, 19th August, 1936.

The following resolutions were passed at the general meeting of the Lupa Gold Diggers and Miners' Association, specially convened at Chungu on the 12th inst., and submitted to me by Mr. M. J. H. Crowell, Secretary of the Association, on the 14th inst.

1. That the Association is distressed by the numerous protests to Government concerning the inadequate medical facilities in the Lupa Controlled Area which have so far not been met. It is urged that the Lupa Controlled Area should be provided by Government with adequate medical facilities for the entire area of the Lupa. It is stated that the present medical officer in the area is only qualified to attend to 200 natives and approximately 10,000 Whites. The Lupa Controlled Area contains approximately 2,000 squatters in extent, and this Association is of the opinion that the present medical facilities are hopelessly inadequate.

2. That there are no rest camps for laborer labor, and it is urged that the Government should provide inspection of any such labor camps. It is urged that the Government should provide an estricken at its destination in an organized and supervised manner. To the Editor: "E. A. Standard," Sir.—I cannot allow the letter signed "Glashtuik," which appeared in your issue of the 16th instant to pass without a word of protest. The position was well stated in your issue of the 17th and I did not wish to take up space in your columns by going into details. In his letter, however, "Glashtuik" states that "our majority" are utterly scandalous. This is, of course, sheer nonsense. I have just completed a tour of over twelve hundred square miles in the various improvement districts and I have been greatly surprised at the immense improvement which has taken place in the roads of the Colony. In my opinion the greatest credit is due to the Public Works Department, the District Councils, Road Boards and individual individuals for the work which has been put in on our highways and roads. Far more in fact than pure very favourable to those of the two Whiteheads.

Another point is that "Glashtuik" attributes the whole progress which has been attained in the Colony to the Settler community. 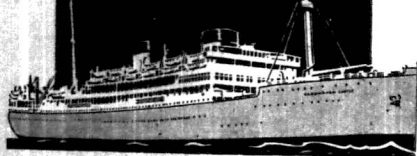

Conciliation Commission Resumes

ITALIAN AIR FORCE STRENGTH INCREASED BY 16,000 MEN

Mr. Anthony Eden has presented to the Foreign Secretary, Sir Samuel Hoare, his detailed report on the Three Power Conference in Paris, and the efforts made by himself and M. Laval to arrive at a peaceful settlement of the Italo-Abyssinian dispute.

A message from Rome states that it is now almost certain that Italy will attend the meeting of the League Council on September 4, but meanwhile the Italian Air Force has been strengthened and now totals over 40,000 men.

The League Council Meeting

EMINENT ZOOLOGIST AT MOMBASA

Preservation of Game in South Africa

Dr. Thomas Harbour, Professor of Zoology and Director of the Museum at Harvard University, speaking through Mombasa last week on his return from South Africa to Europe and America.

He is also a Director of the Greater National Park in South Africa, and has just completed a three-thousand mile motor trip to different parts of the Union in connection with the preservation of game—a subject on which he is an acknowledged authority.

Among his most important appointments in this sphere is that of membership on the League of Nations committee which deals with the preservation of wild life.

Dr. Harbour is a firm believer in the theory that it is more profitable to a country to have properly organised national parks. In which game is protected and which attract large numbers of tourists who bring money into the country than to have the game hunted to little advantage by a handful of settlers while or their sportsmen die out in the long. He also believes that game is no more responsible for the spread of stock diseases than are feral and other means of transmission of disease.

Last year Dr. Harbour spent some time in Nairobi and the surrounding districts.

Reduction of Kenya Forests Opposed

SAFEGUARDING OF EXISTING AREAS URGED

Arbor Society Resolutions

SPECIAL MEETING PROTESTS AGAINST PROPOSED CUT IN DEPARTMENTAL VOTE

Resolutions opposing the reduction of forest area in Kenya and calling for existing forest areas to be declared "demarcated forests" and so further safeguarded, were passed at a special general meeting of the Kenya Arbor Society held at Nakuru recently, when Commander F. J. Condy presided.

Figures of the expenditure and revenue of the Forest Department for the past ten years were quoted by Major Ward. They showed that the average annual cost to the Colony of maintenance and afforestation worked out at £48.

In view of the importance of forest protection and extension the Society adopted a resolution protesting against any reduction in the amount of the Forest vote. It was felt it would be a great mistake to stint the Forest Department as the forest area so dangerously small.

"Demarcated Forest"

The first subject for discussion was erosion of land from forest reserves, and in the same district, to be handed over to the Forest Department in exchange for the same.

Further it requests Government—(a) To require all existing prohibited forest areas to be demarcated forests as provided for in sect. 612 of the Forest Ordinance; (b) to consider nominations from the Kenya Arbor Society for all areas under the Forest Ordinance so that the procedure applicable for the afforestation of a demarcated forest (sect. 611) shall be also applicable to any possible suggested extension of gazetted forests.

After a short discussion the resolution was put to the vote. Sections 1 and 2 were passed unanimously; section 2 with two dissentients.

The following resolution, which had been passed by the Nairobi Arbor Society, was then read:—
"That all unoccupied land adjacent to a forest reserve be placed under the control of the Forest Department until such time as it is required for some other purpose."

Major Ward pointed out that approximately one third of the total forest area which had been reserved during the last four or five years had originated outside the forest reserves, and from inquiries he had made, it was clear that a great many of them originated on unoccupied land, and it was essential that a scheme should be evolved to deal with this source.
Mr. Lodge cited the case of the Masai Cattle Reserve on Kinangop as an example of the evils of unoccupied cover land which was unless somebody con-

sidered forest officers should have authority to police such land.
The Waterwright said that if the Forest Department could not protect the forest and Mr. Hamard considered that the Forest Department could enforce the law by referring to the Police.
The Chairman said that a very important question had been raised and that he would like to know whether the new Scepter Drill-stance would help to solve it. He suggested referring the matter to the Forest Department. This was agreed to.

Protecting Water Supplies
Referring to the protection of water supplies Mr. Lodge suggested a resolution on the following lines:
"Request Government to take measures that no landowner shall clear or allow to be cleared, or which would affect the water supply of springs or streams, without the written permission of the District Council or district committee in which the land is situated, provided that the prohibition of clearing forest shall not prevent the work of the forest on any agricultural system approved by the Government."

It might be stated that this was in interference with the will of the individual, but the necessity had been found to increase in many European countries the work of the forest service. France after 200 years of forestry experience had found it necessary in many of her forests to restrict the private individual from destroying forests which were needed for protection of water supplies. Similar laws regulated the cutting of forest in other European countries. It had been found necessary in many of the forests of Kenya to restrict in reforestation operations areas in order to make streams which had become seasonal ones perennial.

It should not be the business of other countries and take the matter in hand now. In India the clearance of forest and hank was controlled by section 45 of the Indian Forest Act which gave the Government power to prohibit denudation where this would be prejudicial to the flow of streams and springs or liable to cause floods or erosion. Who should the private owner of Kenya be allowed to allow the land and forest department to do such things as would be detrimental both to the streams and to the forests? For streams would cease and valuable topsoil would be carried away.

Legislation Necessary
Mr. E. H. Wright said that Mr. Lodge had advanced such a good argument in favour of the resolution that everyone would agree with it in principle. He would, however, like to see the details carefully worked out and provision made for the various penalties in cases of undue hardship.
Major Ward said that this appeared to be a growing feeling that legislation was necessary. A good many people who reside in and outside the Society had of their own accord and quite independently given their views, which were that denudation of the banks of streams should be prohibited by law.
Mr. Wells suggested that the question should be referred back to the Council who would formulate proposals to lay before a special meeting of the Government so that the attention of Government should be drawn to the problem and the suggestions brought forward by Mr. Wells be adopted.
Major Ward referred to the re-

port of the Select Committee on Economy, proposing reductions of £4,128 in the Forest Departmental vote. He professed himself of the expenditure and revenue of the Department for the last ten years (1925-1935). These showed that the Forest Department had cost the Colony £681 during this period. In other words, the average annual cost of maintenance and afforestation worked out at £68.17.

Revenue Improvement
In 1927 the percentage of revenue to expenditures was 129.25 per cent. It had then dropped steadily till 1933 when it had fallen to 92.05 per cent. In 1934 it had risen again to 92.48 per cent and there was every probability of the improvement continuing.
It was recalled, he contended, to compare Kenya with other territories. Tanganyika had a smaller forest area and had a more humid climate, forest protection was a much simpler and cheaper matter than in this Colony.
Mr. Lodge said that it was a great mistake to stilt the Forest Department seeing that the forest area of the Colony was being spent on £15,000,000 was being spent on the Forest Service. In Mauritius recently had had to borrow £100,000 to repair the damage caused by forest destruction in Malawi when he first joined the Forest Service. The forest area was 9 lakhs and the expenditure was the same. After 20 years of forest management the revenue had increased to 42 lakhs and the expenditure was 20 lakhs. By reasonable spending and proper management the forests of Kenya could also contribute substantially to the revenue of the Colony. It would be false economy to cut the forest area and to curtail the planting programme.
The Chairman said that the Arbor Society existed to protect the forests and the Society was bound to resist the suggested economies.
The following resolution, proposed by Mr. Lodge, was passed unanimously—"In view of the importance of forest protection and extension this Society protests against any reduction in the amount of the Forest vote."

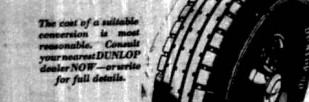

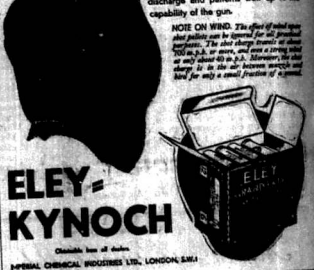
