WAR CLOUDS GATHERING?

MEDITERRANEAN POWERS TAKING PRECAUTIONS

Strengthening Defences of Coasts and Ports

BRITISH FLEET MOVEMENTS

Ships Visiting Canal and Eastern Harbours

The threat of war between Italy and Abyssinia has resulted in all Powers concerned in the Mediterranean taking precautions to protect their interests and to prevent undesirable incidents. Considerable secrecy is being observed but it is known that France is strengthening her naval forces and that Spain is drafting troops to the Balearic Islands.

Although stated to be normal routine, all ships of the British Mediterranean Fleet are taking in provisions and ammunition at Malta, and will later proceed on a cruise in eastern Mediterranean waters. Various parts of the fleet will visit the Suez Canal and other ports in the vicinity.

The Italian authorities have evacuated the Greek inhabitants of one of the Dodecanese islands, in order to convert it into a military hospital. It is also rumoured that American warships are expected to arrive at Gibraltar.

Italian Planes for East Africa

It is understood that the Italian military staff have already ordered the construction of a further squadron of bombing and reconnaissance planes totaling 400 were embarked on Naples to-day for East Africa.

THE SUEZ CANAL Possibility of Closure in Event of War

There was a pronounced increase this week in the number of ships leaving Naples for East Africa. This is believed to be due to the Italian authorities pushing on with preparations as rapidly as possible in view of the possibility that Britain may try to impose the International Convention on the Suez Canal, although it is not thought that Britain will be able to obtain the necessary majority for this.

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The Cabinet's Decision

Yesterday's Cabinet decision will be passed to the French Government without delay, either through the diplomatic channels, or by Sir Samuel Hoare to the British Ambassador personally, in view of these decisions to Italy.

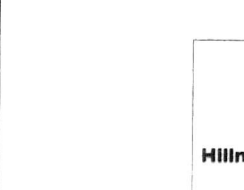
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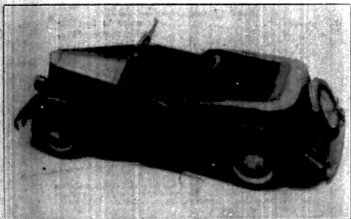

"King of the Damned"

"BRINGING THE TROPICS TO SHEPHERD'S"

BUSH

TOBY THE PYTHON

DOWN in the studio forest things have been stirring with a vengeance at the Gaumont British film factory where Walter Forde is bringing the penal settlement drama "King of the Damned" to the screen.

"We want a tropical forest with a drop of fever-ridden swamp in it," the producers told the "Prop" men and carpenters. "Sore" said these gentry will be the concrete that has made them famous and within a day or two the largest sound stage in the building became a densely vegetated, impenetrable jungle abiding with the cries for help from stranded electricians.

With the aid of 70 tons of timber they built the tropical forest in mid-air and nearby towns of Surrey saved by night to decorate the ups and downs of the jungle contours. Only God can make a tree, but the plaster dogs have not done so badly and their arduous efforts have grown to full strength in a matter of hours and knotted trunks and tangled roots have turned the studio into a wilderness that one kind soul saw fit to pin up a "Way Out" notice in the centre of this metropolitan jungle.

Not content with having made the setting already a nightmare for the activities of sound and cameramen, the "Prop" men bore to hear the remark about a "drop of fever-ridden swamp" and cunningly devised a stretch of oozy, slimy morsel of unknown depth. Dressed with exotic foliage and wending its fever-ridden way through great swamps and sodden banana trees this swamp, in the end meant for many swamps, looked solid to the eye. So solid, in fact, that one "Prop" man deceived by the very efforts of his own crew walked straight across it and was only just rescued when his left foot came up for the third time!

Strong Drama in 136 deg. Centigrade.

What of the unfortunate actors who have been enduring this week in the stagnant depths? The scenario called for grim relentless action through the jungle, staged flogged-to-death convicts engaged in building a rough wooden track through the jungle swamp, the hardest labour to which they are put during their sojourn in the island penal camp. Brutality has equipped supreme this week and the wretched crack of the guards' whips made its mark on the sound track. Conditions became terrific as Walter Forde and his merry men got almost out of control in their desire for realism.

"We'll have clouds of thick choking vapour rising from the swamp," they said and there it rose in smoky swirls by kind permission of the chief engineer, curling up through the palm trees and embracing the hampous in its steally asphyx.

"And then there's that mescaline tropical sun" they said to themselves and a commanding mighty sun are launce sprung to life, each one requiring 26 horse power of energy to light it down through the trees came on the flood heat of the scorching backs of the labouring convicts and what with the steam and the lights, the sweat and the whip-cracking, things reached fever-peak and the week the jungle temperature has been staggering in the neighbourhood of 135 degrees Centigrade!

Auto-magnesium plays a great part in these scenes and both Constable Vreid and Noah Berry recovered they have been treated malaria in this terrifying jungle! Terry's energy has been expended by the constant work on "the road" and Noah Berry has been swinging dead hammers with the skill of a veteran criminal. He confessed, by the way, that his skill is due to his early training in putting up cross tests in the good old

days of the American road-shows. Pounds of ice cream have been consumed by the production unit and the electricians high up above the jungle working the sun arcs are now eternally grateful to Director Forde who thought that their need was greater than his and sent up gallons of ice to relieve their labours in the studio heat!

Artificial Rain

Then they remembered something about the torrential downpours of the rain forest and the gunnery "convicts" thought their last hour had come when from nowhere a terrific flood of artistically arranged "rain" descended on them in their misery. Hires, gashed through the forest, and the depth of the swamp increased formidably. Two rows of human beings lined up for protection against this new opponent in the art of realism. On one side the production unit were issued with heavy boots, oilskins and sou'wester, whilst on the other side the banana trees the horns of dynamite were arranged all over with olive oil, so that no one could lay them there and prevent them from doing another 20 years hard!

Toby, the Python Takes a Hand

Nothing has been spared in making this studio jungle a worthy opponent of its tropical counterparts. Birds with exquisite plumage have fitted with abandon into the scene, but being independent fowls, they ignored the shouts of "cut!" as the combination of chat and sailed aloft to share a bit of ice cream with the electricians.

Then there was Toby, the temperamental python! Director Forde thought his jungle outfit to have a snake in it somewhere and Toby and his lovely keeper arrived in the studio to add a bit of nature in the raw to the scene. One brave "convict" made his will a piece of palm leaf and stepped forward to play his part in the man vs. python drama. Director Forde thought it would be a good thing if Toby still slithered up from a log and draped himself round the "convict's" legs.

Toby thought otherwise. He crawled on another way and went down to have a look at the swamp, while his keepers sprang for the lives of the convicts as their stars had built their "traps" strong enough to hold them.

Toby's mistress went to fetch him and the quailing ranks of strong men stood aghast as the delectable man picked the 10 feet of python up, unheeded his scaly sides and told him not to play the fool! They were amazed to try, but Toby was interested in other things. He coiled his tail, got into second gear and slid straight for the gaping production unit. He has now moved faster than his own shadow! Many of them had been through it when he had mothers-in-law, but in Toby they had met their match and for some time the only sound in the deserted jungle was that of Toby snuffing the delectable food value of a sick, dropped grease-paint!

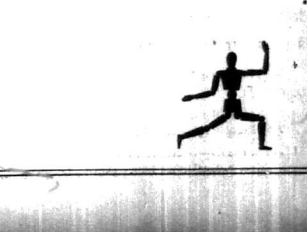

Causes of Incident in Masai Reserve DUE TO A SUDDEN EBULLITION OF HYSTERIA

Young Warriors Taunted OLDER MEN WHO SUGGESTED THAT THEY LACKED VIRILITY AND COURAGE

The Government of Kenya has issued an official statement on the recent trouble in the Masai Reserve when the District Commissioner was threatened by armed Moran and had to order his guards to fire on the mob.

The disturbance is stated to have been due to a sudden ebullition of hysteria amongst certain natives who having passed through a ceremony known as Enanto in the early part of June, were in an excitable condition.

The people concerned in the attack are said to have been taunted by the elders with lack of virility and courage and to have conceived the idea that the road work on which they were engaged was not in consonance with the dignity of warriors.

An Official Statement

Following is the official statement issued by the District Commissioner on June 25. Moran warriors were employed in road work. He had a fight with his wife, his daughter and his two nephews. They came on him with axes and clubs and he was severely injured.

Two Indian road formen who were at the work on the road at the time of the attack were too far to get into much of the trouble. Aziz Ali, one of them, was a shopkeeper in the kitchen quarters of a shop kept by a Kikuyu at Nakuru. Here he was found by a party of four Morans who dragged him out and attacked him. He retreated very fast and hid in a bush.

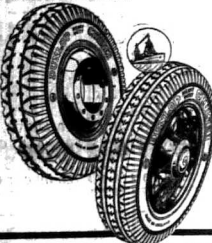

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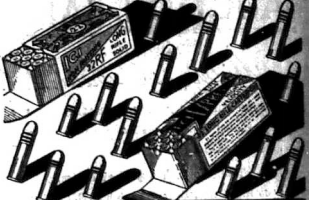

The Government is preparing a detailed statement of Italy's case against Abyssinia to present to the League Council at the meeting on September 4, in which it is understood Italy will argue that Abyssinia should be excluded from the League.

Official quarters are resuming the reason for calling an extraordinary meeting of the Cabinet at Bolzano. It is stated that only administrative questions will be discussed and that Abyssinia and other questions of national importance will not be introduced.

The Duke of Bergamo, the first Prince of the Italian Royal House to volunteer for service abroad, has been appointed to the military staff in the East African colonies.

Question of Finance

London, August 27. The meeting of the Italian Cabinet in the zone in which the Army manoeuvres are now proceeding in North Italy has been fixed to start at Bolzano at 4 p.m. on September 1.

The object of the meeting is not explained in Rome beyond the suggestion that it will deal purely with administrative matters, but it is reported in Paris that the Cabinet will be asked to take an

important decision with regard to finance.

Protest to Greece

It is known in Athens that the Emperor of Ethiopia has protested against the passage of Italian bombers over Greece.

Greece has replied that it is not entitled to refuse as Italy is not at war.

Buy Ministers

By Wireless. August 27. The discussion of the various aspects of the Italo-Abyssinian dispute, particularly in relation to League procedure, will be continued between Britain and France during the next few days. The Foreign Secretary, Sir Bernard Lee, who returns to London to-day, will be in constant consultation with his experts and with those of his Cabinet colleagues who are still in London.

The League of Nations Council meets to discuss the dispute on September 4, and in the interval retaining the attention of the Minister for League Affairs, Mr. Anthony Eden, who will lead the British delegation to the Geneva meeting, will be devoted to preparations for the meeting, at which it is understood the Italian delegation will attempt to make a full statement of Italy's case.—British Official Wireless Service.

HOOD, W. S. Gillett, Artemus Ward, Andrew Halliday, and four members of the Brough family, first met at the White Hart Tavern in Catherine-street, Drury-lane. For twenty-five years or so they found a home in no fewer than eight taverns, and then, in 1861, premises were taken in Lancaster House, in the Savoy, recently the headquarters of the B.E.C., and it was from these, forty-five years ago, they migrated to Adolphusterrace.

In the old tavern days the members consisted of a joint, with a pie of some sort, the price being one-and-six, and the table was always set out with beer and pipes. It was in commemoration of those early times that Egerton, on the occasion of his ninetieth birthday dinner at the club, gave every member and every guest one of those long clay pipes, called Churchwardens, that used to be smoked on the original "Saturday Night" from which the club grew. These Saturday Nights, which are still held from October to May in each year, became very famous, being presided over by a succession of celebrities in literature and the arts.

A Great Tradition

Notwithstanding the long clay pipes and the beer of the old days the club soon acquired a great tradition, and it was often said that it was as difficult to get into it as into the Alhambra.

The first time it came prominently before the public was in the year 1860, when it arranged to benefit the Liverpool Theatre for the families of two literary gentlemen who died in distress, Queen Victoria, Prince Albert, and several members of the Royal Family attended the performance, and one of the principal actors was Lionel Lincoln.

This performance was so successful that on the occasion of the Queen's Jubilee the Club was chosen to Manchester and Liverpool, and played for the benefit of the distressed workers. About this period, too, they gave a great performance, again attended by Queen Victoria and members of the Royal Family, of Sheridan's "School for Scandal."

When King Edward as Prince of Wales was Chairman of the Committee in 1893, he founded a Club Scholarship at the Royal College of Music, and for the necessary "law and romance" the club gave a gorgeous fancy-dress ball at the Albert Hall at which the Prince and Princess of Wales were both present. Many special events were given for the occasion, for in addition to the "Bavages" there were present some four thousand visitors.

How the name of the club came to be adopted is something of a mystery, which has never been solved and never will be, and is the

NEW AIR CONNECTIONS

Extension of Service to Mombasa

Air connection in East Africa seems to be progressing apace. An hour ago it was the regular weekly service operated by White Star Airways between Nairobi and Mombasa, which was extended by Kenyan Airways to serve the main districts there, and in order to provide better connections between those districts and the other railway areas in Kenya, the service will also call at Kisumu en route.

The Northland service will leave Mombasa on Sundays at 10:30 a.m., arriving at Kisumu at 1:10 p.m. and at Nairobi at 5:00 p.m.

The new service is likely to be of great use to the mining communities, both in Mombasa and Mwanza. The Company will shortly be publishing a new timetable, giving full details of fares, etc.

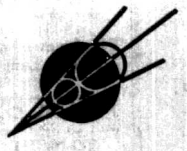

Tanganyika Needs Many More Trees

DANGEROUSLY SMALL AMOUNT OF FORESTS

Afforestation Policy

RESUSCITATION OF MUVU PLANTING MEETS WITH SUCCESS

Tanganyika Territory possesses just over one per cent of forest which the Conservator of Forests regards as a dangerously small amount.

In the course of his annual report for last year the Conservator says the obvious policy is rigorous conservation coupled with an energetic and well-planned programme of artificial afforestation.

A feature of silvicultural work has been the resuscitation of mvu planting which is meeting with encouraging success.

Government has devoted much attention to the development of the gum arabic industry and research work is being conducted with a view to producing a higher quality gum.

Better Gum Arabic

"Though of recent years gum mining activity has made great progress and is considered a very promising industry, it is to be regretted that the property of the Territory must always be mainly dependent upon agriculture."

Mr. D. K. S. Grant, Conservator of Forests, in his annual report for 1928 of the Tanganyika Forest Department, says that the "mvu" and "pastoral" is water."

He goes on to explain: "The conservator will endeavour to supply material largely dependent upon the forest."

This is a dangerous policy, as a dangerously small amount of forest covers the Territory, and the distribution of these inadequate forests is irregular and uneven."

The "obvious forest policy" is, therefore, rigorous conservation and development of small areas of natural forest coupled with an energetic, far-reaching and technically well-planned programme of artificial afforestation, in which it is intended that the National Planting Corps should be the writer's conviction that only by the adoption of a policy of this kind can a prosperous future be secured for the Territory.

But forest staff and the means at their disposal, including the very meagre appropriation of funds for forestry works, are all quite inadequate to implement the policy indicated. It has not even been possible to maintain continually the minimum staff necessary possible in pre-depression years.

Decreased Expenditure

"Though revenue has not diminished in the last three years the expenditure of the department has experienced its downward trend. It is fortunate that there are certain important forestry operations, the accomplishment of which depends more upon liberal funds than staff upon liberal funds."

In particular does this statement apply to survey and mapping work. Much progress has been made in this direction with comparatively insignificant expenditure.

The Timber Trade

"The forecast in the last report of a recovery in the timber trade has to a certain extent been justified, though the effect of the shortage of the export value of forest products, which has dropped since the end of 1927, is still a factor of concern."

But whereas it is only by country afforestation that the timber trade can be maintained on a permanent basis, it is to be regretted that the Government has not yet been able to secure complete operation of areas.

UNDER SEA TO THE \$1,000 NOTES IN A DRAIN

Sir H. Wilkins' Submarine Exploration Plan

TO START IN 1927

Sir Herbert Wilkins, the Polar explorer, has announced that he will begin preparations next March for his second under-sea expedition to the North Pole. He says a Roster message from New York says:

"He hopes to start in the spring of 1927."

The explorer, who attempted under-sea exploration of the North Pole several years ago in the submarine Nautilus, revealed that he had asked for bids from four builders for a new submarine. He will be 100 feet long and about 20 feet in diameter.

"It will cost more than £20,000 and the equipment may cost another £20,000," he said, adding, "although I still have a lot of equipment for the Nautilus, I believe the vessel will be ready for operations in a few months."

Mr. Wilkins, during the winter of 1926-7, made a trip to the North Pole in the ship "Thetis" and returned with 100 lbs. of walrus ivory.

Sir Herbert said experiments were being made to determine whether hydraulic propulsion could be adapted to the new submarine. He said that the vessel would be of no use for anything but a scientific expedition, and that it would not be used for anything but a scientific expedition.

RESOLUTION BY THE NAIROBI TRADERS' ASSOCIATION

Strong exception was taken at the first annual general meeting of the Nairobi Traders' Association on Tuesday afternoon to the sale by the Nairobi Municipal Council of fat made from condemned carcasses in the by-products plant of the municipal abattoir.

It was alleged by several speakers that the fat was made from carcasses of cattle which had been condemned because they were suffering from tuberculosis, measles, dropsy or other diseases, and it was disputed that the fact that the fat was first sterilized before being sold rendered it fit for human consumption.

Unfit for Human Consumption?

In the course of discussion it appeared that the Nairobi Traders' Association were taking the matter up with the Medical Officer of Health, and that, following on representations by the butchers, the Municipal Council had referred any final decision in connection with its advertisement concerning the sale of fat derived from condemned animals to the Secretary.

It was felt that it was altogether undesirable that fat from condemned carcasses should be sold for human consumption, and that the Municipal Council should complete with the butchers, who were called upon to pay licence fees for the privilege of carrying on their trade.

Mr. D. Newmark contended that sterilization rendered the fat fit for human consumption. "If the public know that it is fat from condemned animals, they would not buy it even if it was sterilized," he said.

Enlarged Scope

With a view to extending the activities of the Association, enlarging its membership and increasing its revenue, the meeting confirmed a recommendation from a general meeting held in April last that the Association be altered to the "East African Traders' Association" and that the name be combined with the words "Incorporating Nairobi Traders' Association".

It is also hoped that the inclusion of gaited traders in the Association will strengthen any representations that it may make to the Government and to the Municipal Council in respect of the interests, which it was argued, were being sacrificed to the merely local matters which affected Nairobi traders and the interests of other Kenya traders in the other East African territories.

While not opposed to extending its membership to the Association, the Nairobi Traders' Association considered that the inclusion of gaited traders in the Association would be a step in the wrong direction.

Because of the paucity of the attendance at some of the monthly meetings in the past few months, it was decided to hold a special meeting that the ordinary monthly meeting of the Association was approved. It was hoped that this would be a bigger gathering than the chairman pointed out that a special general meeting could be held if a quorum of the members of exceptional urgency be a proposal that the meeting be held on a date to be decided.

Comparative Figures

Kampala, August 25. The Uganda Department of Agriculture, dated August 15 states that the number of bales hauled from Uganda ports and stations during the period January 1 to August 25, 1955, amounted to 221,778 and cotton tax collected to the end of July totalled £100,677.

The planting figures for the Eastern Province show that 232,394 acres have been sown up to the end of July this year compared with 214,368 for the same period of 1954. In Uganda the average is estimated at 202,233, which compares with 227,000 to the end of July 1954, and 255,437 for the whole of 1954.

The Northern Province is estimated to have 94,038 acres planted to the end of July this year which compares with 100,197 for the same period last year and 126,454 for the whole season.

Heavy Seed Demands The Summary states: "Demand for seed has been heavier than usual and the average prepared for planting has been greater than normal."

The abnormally dry conditions prevailing throughout the month, combined with the late harvest of the 1954 crop in the Eastern Province have led to a policy in planting and considerable sowing will be undertaken in the Northern Province.

Field plantings are however well established and have withstood the dry conditions very satisfactorily. The approximate total acreage planted to the end of July amounted to 622,023 acres in 1954.

Again, the winning of the second test match at Lord's could be said to be the turning point in the fortunes of the tour. The five victories over England doubtless "make" wherever the South African played afterwards.

"Mick" Peake, an old Epsom man, has signed a two-year contract with the New South Wales team. He is the first man associated with the school to take up professional cricket, having at 40 he is 29 and left Epsom four years ago.

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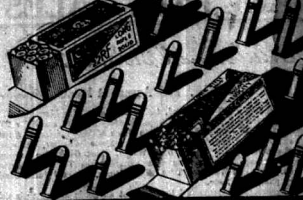
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
