Fatal Motor Accident in Switzerland

CAR, DRIVEN BY KING, DASHES INTO A TREE

Lakeside Tragedy

KING LEOPOLD ESCAPES WITH ONLY SLIGHT INJURIES

(THOMAS BRETHER'S AGENCY.)

Lucerne, August 29.

The Queen of the Belgians was killed in a motorcar accident near here today.

The King who was driving the car at the time was slightly hurt.

A later message says that King Leopold seemed sadly to lose control of the car for some reason not yet established.

The car swerved towards the lake and struck a tree. The Queen's head struck the tree and she was killed instantly.

The chauffeur who was sitting in the rear of the car was not hurt.

KING'S HEAD CUT

At the time of the accident the Queen was sitting beside the King whose head was cut.

The accident happened on the lakeside road near Kusnacht, nine miles from Lucerne.

After having his wounds bandaged the King was taken to the Villa Haselhorn near Lucerne where Their Majesties were staying. The Queen's body was also conveyed thither.

CAR IN LAKE

After striking the tree the car fell into the shallow water of the lake where it is still lying.

The road is fairly precipitous and within a few minutes help had arrived.

WORLD SHOCKED

(BY WIRELESS.)

Bugby, Aug. 29.

News of the death this morning in a motorcar accident near Lucerne, Switzerland, of Queen Astrid of Belgium has deeply shocked public opinion.

Reports state that the Queen was seated in the rear seat of the car, her husband, King Leopold, occupying the front beside the chauffeur. The car suddenly swerved across the road and struck a tree. The Queen was killed instantly. The King was only slightly hurt. The chauffeur was uninjured.

Expressions of profound sympathy are extended in the Press to the Belgian people, by whom the Queen was deeply loved.

Queen Astrid was born at Stockholm in 1905 and was married in 1926. She became Queen at a tragic moment in Belgium's history, when in February last year King Albert was killed by a fall of rock while climbing near Namur.—British Official Wireless Service.

A Royal Romance

The Queen of the Belgians was formerly Princess Astrid, a niece of the King of Sweden and she married the then Crown Prince Leopold of Belgium in 1926.

King Albert died at the time of the outbreak of the war. The young queen's greatest choice was Queen Victoria of the Netherlands. Her own choice was the late King of the Belgians. She was crowned in 1935 and she died in 1935.

There are three children of the marriage, the Princess Josephine Marie, the Princess Astrid, and the Princess Marie Louise. The Princess Josephine Marie is the eldest. She was born in 1935 and she died in 1935.

The Crown Princess who was all and good and had the reputation of being the best-dressed woman in the Continent.

When the Princess also accompanied her husband on his visit to the Belgian Congo early in 1935 and in November of the same year she went to London to attend the 1935 Coronation of King George VI.

When their coronation the King and Queen have paid one of the most successful visits to England; which attracted a large number of their official capacities, the wedding of Princess Astrid and Crown Prince Leopold of Belgium in Stockholm.

The Queen always evinced a keen personal interest in the welfare of the Belgian people, and quite recently she inaugurated a special fund to provide food and clothing for unemployed men and their families. In this connection a special appeal to the nation was made by the Queen herself, and the fund has been run by a body known as the National Help Committee.

A Simple Life

She lived a simple life and made a point of accepting invitations to banquets at which her presence was desired. She was best particularly busy this year and fulfilled a large number of engagements in connection with the Brussels International Exhibition.

Her sweet disposition and charming informality endeared her to the Belgian people, who loved and respected her all the more because she was a devoted mother to her children, and the King frequently went to Switzerland for winter sports. She was heavily interested in art and literature.

The flag at the Belgian Consulate in Antwerp was flown at half mast when the news of the Queen's death was received yesterday afternoon.

PEER COMMITTED FOR TRIAL

Manslaughter Charge Following Car Crash

TO CLAIM HIS RIGHTS

To be Tried by His Peers in House of Lords

(THOMAS BRETHER'S AGENCY.)

London, August 28.

Lord de Clifford was committed for trial today by the King. Magistrates on a charge of manslaughter following a road accident, and also on two subordinate charges covering road offences.

It is understood that the Director of Public Prosecutions proceeds with the manslaughter charge. Lord de Clifford will be tried by his Peers in the House of Lords.

Lord de Clifford, who was born in 1907 as the 26th holder of the title, the Baron having been created in 1920. He is a well-known racing motorist.

The charge against him was one of manslaughter arising out of the death of Douglas George Hopkin, who was killed on the morning of August 28, at 3 a.m. on August 15, in a collision in which Lord de Clifford's car and his own were involved.

When the accident happened at 11.30 a.m. on August 28, Miss Halliwell, aged 20, Miss Halliwell Greville, aged 19, was returning from a dance at Ashurst, Surrey, and her sister, Miss Sheila Hopkins, and a friend, Miss Rosemary Bay, were in the car.

Flash of Lights

At the inquest held at Kingston on August 19, Miss Sheila Hopkins said "My brother was driving about a yard from the kerb on the correct side when, very suddenly there was a flash of lights and almost simultaneously a crash. His was certain her brother did not lose control of the car."

Miss Rosemary Hopkins said: "I was sitting in the front seat and seemed to come suddenly from nowhere. I was amazed. I could not think why there should have been an accident because I knew we had been on the right side of the road."

A police constable who went to the scene at the accident and that Lord de Clifford said to him: "I was doing about 40 m.p.h. when I was coming towards the kerb. I saw a car which was being driven at the moment of the crash and I thought it was out of control. I went over to my left side to avoid it, and then I went to my right side but we collided."

The constable added that he saw Mr. Hopkins's car as he was going into his police box, and he thought it was only between 40 and 50 miles an hour. It was steady and under perfect control.

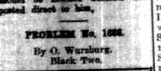

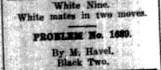

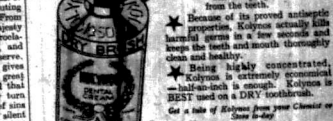

Fiftieth Anniversary Celebrated

History of Services to African Ports

FROM SAILING SHIPS TO MAGNIFICENT LINERS

The fiftieth anniversary of the formation of the Woermann Line, and the forty-fifth anniversary of the German East Africa Line will be celebrated in Hamburg tomorrow, August 31.

A survey of the history of the Woermann Line and the German East Africa Line leads inevitably to the personality of Adolph Woermann as a starting point. He created the German shipping business in Africa, and to his and his co-workers, his brother Eduard Woermann, his brother-in-law Edward Böhlen and subsequently to the spin-off of the latter, Arnold Amstutz, this service owes its spectacular rise to the high level of 1914. Adolph Woermann founded the Woermann Line in 1880 and it was he who in 1890 called into existence the German East Africa Line as well.

The Woermann Line emerged from the Shipping Department of the merchant firm C. Woermann, founded in 1857. During the first 10 years of its existence as an independent firm, the line was called "Afrikanische Dampfschiff-Arsenalschiffahrts-Gesellschaft, Woermann-Linie (African Steamship Company, Woermann Line). It carried activities with five steamers of altogether 7,000 gross register tons, which by 1891 had increased to 15,000 gross register tons, and by 1914, inclusive of new ships on order, to 200,000 gross register tons, approximately 183,000 register tons.

The West Coast

At the beginning the Woermann Line confined its service to the West Coast of Africa. In 1891 it called at German South West for the first time and started a regular

monthly service to that territory in 1899. In 1900 the line concluded with the German Government a similar contract for the operation of government cargo and passenger, as well as for the operation of the entire loading and shipping business of Windhoek and the main houses of a regular connection between German South West and Cape Town.

In 1904 the great rebellion of the Herero and Hottentots broke out. For years, the line carried out single-handed the entire transport of the Schutztruppe (Colonial Force).

To East Africa

Close upon the heels of the rebellion followed the foundation of the Hamburg-Bremer Africa Line in 1907/1908. 1904-service was established, comprising the Woermann Line, the German East Africa Line, the Hamburg-Amerika Line, and the North German Lloyd. This all the German shipping companies, interested in the traffic to Africa, became united in close cooperation.

First Round Africa Trips

At first the steamer of the line only went as far as Lourenco Marques in Mozambique, the service there called at Durban and started in 1904 to visit regularly the Cape ports as well. During the first ten years of the line's existence, the

ship only followed the Eastern route, via the Suez Canal, as far as Cape Town. In 1909 the first round Africa voyage was inaugurated. Alternately the ships went round Africa in a western and eastern direction. In the course of time the service underwent several changes. It became more extensive and cargo boats were added to the fleet. Moreover, the line inaugurated an East African coastal service and as early as 1902 established, in conjunction with the Bombay Line and the German East Africa Line, a service between India and East and South Africa.

River Traffic

The progress in the development of Africa caused the Woermann Line and the German East Africa Line to direct their attention also to river navigation. Shortly before the outbreak of the War the German East Africa Line commenced to participate in the traffic on the Zambezi.

In 1918 the Woermann Line took part in the foundation of the Kaiserliche Shipping Company whose headquarters are on the Congo and which handles the German East Africa Line in addition to the Niger-Benue Navigation Company, which was founded in 1914, in order to take up transport on these rivers. The outbreak of the World War prevented this Company from starting operations.

In connection with the Elder Dempster Company, the Woermann Line established in 1910 a bi-monthly service from London to South Africa. One German and one English steamer being alternately dispatched.

The Woermann Line maintained in co-operation with the Hamburg-Amerika Line and the Hamburg-Bremer Africa Line in 1914 had 18 monthly services, starting from Hamburg. The German East Africa Line dispatched seven steamers per month. Accordingly, the German steamer "Ad Hamburg" for German East Africa Line had 18 monthly services, starting from Hamburg. Post War Activities

Immediately on the conclusion of the War, the work for the resumption of navigation was taken in hand. In 1921 the line was able to resume the service to Africa with steamers of their own. There are again to-day six services per month from Hamburg.

In 1910 they concluded a working agreement and banded their interests more closely. In 1922 the re-organization effected in 1904, was again carried out. 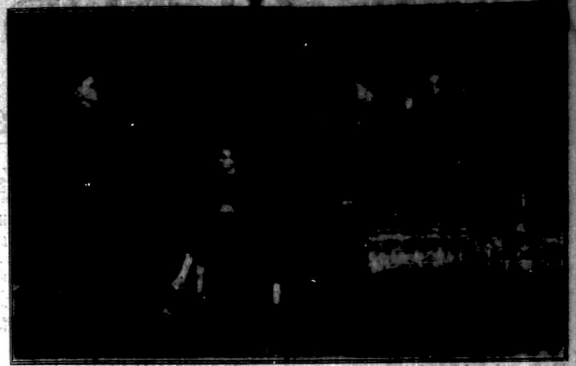

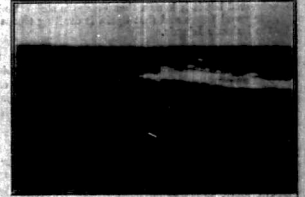

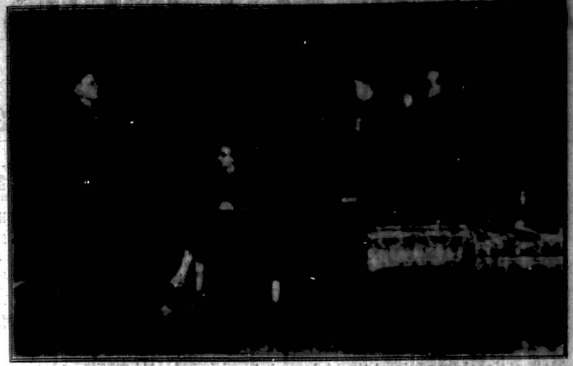

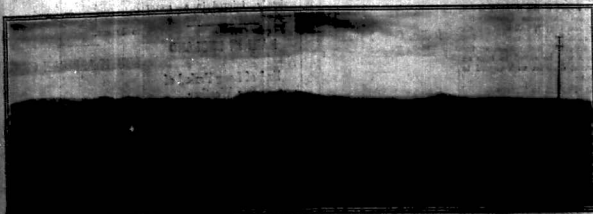

Wanted to be a Soldier
Unlike his father and brothers, Prince Henry never felt "the call of the sea." As a child in the nursery his favourite game was "playing at soldiers"; and a soldier he would be. So, when his school-days ended, he blossomed into a cadet of the King's Rifle Corps, and found himself in his true element.

He loved the life and has enjoyed every day of it. He refused—as he still refuses—to be treated in any way differently from his brother-officers, and has carried out guard duties, inspections and all the other tasks of a regimental officer. 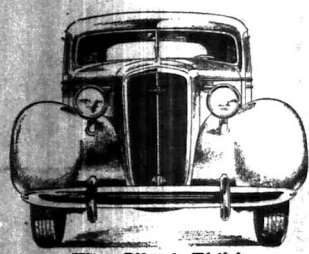

Kenya Residents to Pay Two Poll Taxes

IF THEY DO ANY BUSINESS IN TANGANYIKA

A Serious Position

CONTINGENCY WHICH WAS NOT ENVISAGED WHEN ORDINANCES WERE PASSED

Kenya residents who visit Tanganyika on business are liable to be called on by the Tanganyika Revenue Department to pay poll tax in respect of the period of their stay in the territory, or of the amount of income earned there during that time.

No such demand is made by the Kenya revenue authorities on Tanganyika residents who come to the Colony on business.

Working Agreement Broken

Attention has been drawn to this anomaly by the case of a Nairobi business man who received a total of demand from the Tanganyika authorities for payment of poll tax following two business trips to Dar es Salaam. On the first trip he remained 13 days in Dar es Salaam, and on the second 10 days. The poll tax was called upon to pay poll tax, it is understood, on the basis of his residence in the territory, that is, he was taxed on 18/30ths of his income.

In addition, he had to pay the Kenya poll tax on the same income. This tax is levied on Kenya residents in respect of 18/30ths of his income, and the Kenya tax is deducted from the Kenya tax. The amount of tax he was required to pay in Kenya is, it is learned, the Tanganyika Poll Tax Ordinance entitles the Tanganyika tax authorities to act as they have done.

Postal Questions?

The postal questions of such nature are so serious that it is expected that questions on the subject will be asked in the Kenya Legislative Council during the next session. It is a Kenya resident who has written to the Government, and who has written after certain permissible deductions had been made—on the basis of the case if all this income was derived in Kenya.

Similarly, a Kenya resident who has a mine in Tanganyika bringing in £12,000 a year would have to pay tax £200 in Kenya, and the Tanganyika tax on £12,000—probably another £200—on the basis of the case if all this income was derived in Kenya.

"Entry New"

On enquiry at the local Revenue Office the "East African Standard" has learned that the action of the Tanganyika authorities was something entirely new, although it had always been understood that if a Kenya taxpayer had paid his current poll tax in Kenya, he was not liable to be called upon to pay the same income if he took up business in Tanganyika during the year for which he had already paid.

For some time past a working arrangement on these lines has been in operation between the Kenya and Tanganyika authorities, but the question of temporary visitors has never been touched upon before. When business visitors in Kenya make temporary stays in Tanganyika the local authorities do not require them to pay poll tax in respect of months spent in the Colony.

NEW AEROPLANES One Expected in Nairobi To-day

Mr. George Howson, the well known Nairobi Municipal Commissioner and building contractor, is expected to return to Nairobi to-day from an extended holiday visit to Britain. While in England he purchased a new B.A. Eagle low-wing monoplane, which arrived at Mombasa by sea at the beginning of the week and which has been erected at the house of Mr. A. Watkins, Messrs. Wilson Airways chief engineer. This is the first of its kind to be owned in East Africa. It has a Gipsy Major engine and is fitted with a retractable undercarriage. In May last a similar machine exhibited a new record for the flight across the South Atlantic by a light aeroplane. It crossed the South Atlantic from a stop from Bechara to Natal, Brazil, covering 2,000 miles in 16 hours 40 minutes.

In June another B.A. Eagle won the Society of British Aircraft Constructors' Challenge Trophy at Bristol at an average speed of 134 miles per hour for a triangular course of 130 miles. On July 27 the smaller B.A. Eagle was placed first in the London-Norwich air race, covering 270 miles at an average speed of 141 miles per hour.

It is understood that Mr. Philip Whitman, who took up residence in Nairobi last year after giving up his home in the Philippines Islands, has bought a new Lockheed Vapour airplane which will fly to Nairobi from Mombasa (Philippine Islands) and Guro. The Lockheed Vapour is a very light American machine.

DEVALUATION v DEVALUATION

To the Editor: "E. A. Standard," Sir—The Colony will doubtless be much encouraged by Captain Schwartz's letter defining his attitude in our present political task which concerns (1) forcing our so-called politicians to recognize that we have been for years involved in a terrible economic and social crisis which has been recently commensally aggravated by the further collapse of the coffee and maize markets and (2) of compelling a competent and efficient bureaucracy to face the fact that the Colony is determined not to allow further disintegration of its social structure.

There is a general recognition of Captain Schwartz's special difficulties arising from the composition of the Executive and there has been a feeling that these difficulties were indicating a spirit of evasion of issues and reliance upon "Wait and See". The continuous effort to define lines of political action will be generally applauded and will go far to ensure that clarification of the real issue and mashing of the will to win which is so essential. If we are to save that already large and growing proportion of our community who are so deeply with momentous ruin.

If you were faced as a lawyer enjoys a little "logic chopping" supposedly at my expense, and quite rightly questions whether "the proposals can be properly called alternative" in the sense of being mutually exclusive. If he will reveal carefully my article he will realize that I only used the term "alternative" to indicate the fundamental thesis between the 'Devaluation' and the 'Deflation' evils. The Devaluation creed believes that social equilibrium existed by the rising value of the money unit can only be effectively remedied or relieved by correction of the money unit—in other words that the ill which follows falling price-level can only be cured by restoring the price-level. The Deflation creed on the other hand holds that the social equilibrium cannot be restored by a falling price-level is due to monetary action or inaction and is a made-made effort, whereas the Devaluation school assumes that a falling price-level is an act of God. Devaluation is a combined holding to the storm without alteration in contractual relations; so that when the storm passes the relations between different sections of the community remain in statu quo ante.

Deflation on the other hand is a deliberate attempt to fit the storm; so that when the storm passes another contractual readjustment has to be made to fit a rising price-level. These are

very 'alternative' lines of thought. It does not mean that in practice a country which relies upon the devaluation creed may not be compelled to apply some of the deflationary programme. In fact all countries which have adopted the devaluation remedy have also been compelled to apply some of the deflationary programme in proportion to the extent to which their internal disequilibrium was induced by external obligations. IT DOES HOWEVER MEAN THAT A COUNTRY WHICH EXCLUDES THE DEFLATIONARY PROGRAMME IS COMPELLED TO GO THE WHOLE HOG IN DEFLATION.

Captain Schwartz frankly implies in the Deflation creed and relies upon readjustment of contracts, though it is difficult to see how any compressive remedy is achieved as proposed by consent. Having said this, I should like to express my appreciation for the deflationary efforts which have been made by practically all the countries of the world for the last fifteen years and see them all eventually to a choice between inflation, war, or reversal of policy. I definitely rely upon devaluation as the deflationary remedy, and adjustment and I am convinced that if the East African shilling sees a steady rise of 25 per cent. amount till an adequate level in steady price-level there would be no need to make reductions in civil service salaries or to reduce further the scope of Government activities. than France is in fact committing all the deflationary critics which Captain Schwartz says are impossible. The internal and external commitments including even the fact of being legislatively bound regardless of all contrasts; civil service salaries and even pensions are being cut, etc. etc. But the French are a logical people.

If an accident that Captain Schwartz, who is no more logical having rejected what long deflation is impracticable will be compelled to accept devaluation as the sole method of relief for the deflationary crisis. This, however, is a time process. The essential fact of his letter is that he agrees that our drastic and immediate steps must be taken to prevent our going to the destruction that any and every action necessary to achieve this is a step which should perform before we normal the whole responsibility will rest upon the Colonial Office which transmits this report to the local agents, who apparently from recent statements in high places are not in the preparation of the programme.

KENYA GOLD PRODUCTION FIGURES

To the Editor: "E. A. Standard," Sir—in our issue of the 20th inst. a letter appeared under the title "The Gold Industry" giving figures of the Kenya monthly gold output for the last 12 months. It would seem that your correspondent's message there is a somewhat doubtful if the figures published each month of the gold returns cover the total gold output produced monthly in Kenya from all sources. I am tempted to also quote a letter from you state that "All gold producers are compelled to make an accurate monthly return to the Mines Department, but not to the Government or other quarters as a monthly compulsory, for one's own benefit, is published in the monthly gold return other than

the producer's name, as even included under the official heading of "Miscellaneous Production". On looking at the Mining Law, find no reference as to it being compulsory, or otherwise, that the producer's name should be coupled with his gold returns in the monthly figures of gold output for each month. The producer's gold returns are published from information in the country. It is not necessary that the returned of all gold was apparent amongst the total monthly gold returns of all the gold mining fields, even to a detailed point of the country. Such is the case with Southern Rhodesia—where the producer's name is also stated, tonnage crushed, number of stamps, or other crushing machinery employed etc. with number of ounces and value of gold recovered either from plate amalgamation, or cyanide treatment of sands, and slimes.

necessary labour, arrange for their contracts and see that natives whose demands exceed were dealt with and returned where they came from.

Supervision Necessary

There were some 800 boys on the labour force and if their work was to be carried out without waste of time and money there was a definite need for the supervision of native labour.

The railway and big industrial concerns in the Colony employed European managers and to do away with a similar post for Municipal labour would be a retrograde step.

Individual employers had to deal with labour disputes and though the master might be considered when next a very necessary office was a distinctly present it was with a very necessary office.
