THE 1957 Coronation Safari is over, with A. Hofmann and A. Burton, the outright winner by a points margin of 240 over the next in general classification.

Tanga speed trap led to controversy DEPUTATION TO STEWARDS

WHILE last year's Coronation Safari was notable for the number of protests by drivers, this year there was only one major dispute between them and the organisers.

This was the Tanga speed trap controversy, which came to a head when the drivers reached Nairobi at the end of the first half of the course.

Obeying the rules of the road is stressed at the briefing by the Clerk of the Course, Mr. C. E. Fichtl, and he emphasised that drivers must not exceed the speed limit in built-up areas. As the organisers received a report from the Tanga police alleging that a car exceeded the speed limit at the Tanga area.

"They sent a letter to the stewards and the Clerk of the Course, but they decided to award the penalty marks for making the speed limit, which is in excess of the speed limit."

Letters to drivers
Surprisingly, the car with the most penalty marks in this section was an Austin A15, with 25. But it had not been travelling at 25 m.p.h. — it had been clocked twice.

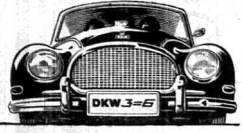
