Washington taking on international monetary crisis

A West German Economic Ministry Official and a Bundesbank director yesterday conferred in Washington with the U.S. Treasury Secretary, Mr. David Kennedy, on bilateral and international monetary problems.

Uncertainty surrounding the French franc was discussed in the talks between the Economic Ministry's Secretary, Herr John Schoellhorn, and the Bundesbank Director, Herr Oskar Emminger, and Mr. Kennedy, diplomatic sources said.

The presence of the two West German officials created interest in the light of privately expressed remarks by U.S. sources that Western financial leaders had decided on a low-key approach towards the political and monetary situation in France.

The sources said formal meetings or conferences would create a psychologically difficult atmosphere, as Western leaders planned to deal with the present monetary uncertainty through unobtrusive means in France.

# New Ulster M.P. calls for strike in England

The newly elected Independent Ulster, Miss Bernadette Devlin, has called on all people working in Britain to strike today. She said that the day that the Northern Ireland Parliament elects a replacement for the Premier, Capt. James Faulkner (48) and Mr. James Chichester-Clark (aged 46) as Mr. Faulkner, a former Commerce Minister, has the backing of the majority of the parliamentary party, which group 36 Members of Parliament and 12 Senators.

Mr. Chichester-Clark, who is generally supported by members loyal to the Ulster Unionist Party of Agriculture until well resigned last week after Capt. Faulkner introduced a project for universal suffrage in Northern Ireland.

Observers considered that, for the time being, Mr. Faulkner was in a more favored position than his rival, but they pointed out that Mr. Chichester-Clark could increase his support by offering the possible results of the election of a hardliner.

If Mr. Chichester-Clark were elected there should be a drop in tension in Ulster, the observers added.

The abolition of a new party chief, who will automatically be Premier, breaks with the process of the designation of new leader by the outgoing head which has been used in Ireland since the civil war.

Mr. Faulkner has also brought out into the open the split in the party which is faced with the demands of the civil rights movement. The movements have achieved their goal by winning universal suffrage and it now remains to be seen if the Unionist Party will be able to hold its own in the coming election.

# ARMED REBELS TAKE OVER U.S. COLLEGE

Armed rebellion by students at a Southern college resulted in the United States yesterday.

About 230 National Guardsmen and police patrolled Tanne College in Denmark, South Carolina, where about 25 Negro students surrendered on Tuesday night after seizing two buildings with guns and other weapons. A similar Black militant action took place in New York City.

Fire colleges in New York City are still disrupted by rebel students, including City College of New York, which has been closed for more than a week.

President Nixon's denunciation of campus lawlessness on Tuesday brought no immediate reaction from students and school administrators. But some observers feared it might inspire new disorders from radical Left-wing campus groups.

Workshops are a necessary adjunct to any organisation which is operating productive processes. Details of job, materials, appliances or non-replicative nature depending on the type of product and are usually subject to controls which consist of yard sticks of measurement.

Hitherto a great deal of attention has been paid to the organisation and control of productive processes but little or no attention has been directed to the services provided by workshops, which consist of breakdowns, repairs, modifications to existing plant and equipment. In some instances, the manufacture of capital items.

This is largely because the work is of a non-replicative or often unskilled nature; it is usually carried out on a day-to-day basis with foreman directing the available manpower as he fits in; in other words, the work is not planned in terms of scheduling and allocation of work together with provision of necessary materials and control of working times for completion of jobs.

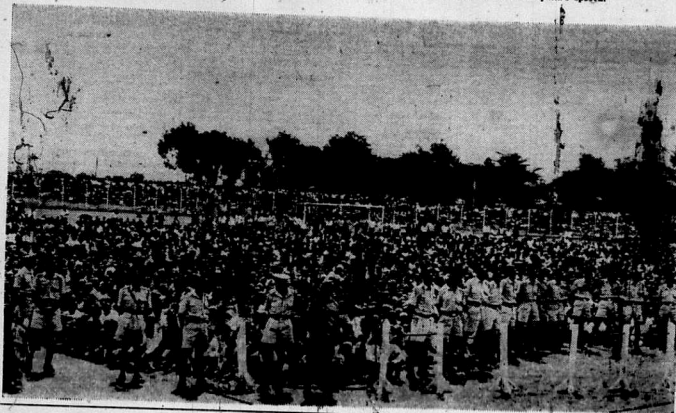

## War declared against thugs

When capital punishment for armed robbery and violent crime was proposed some time ago in Kenya, a long controversy was promoted by people who believe the death sentence is no deterrent.

If a woman can justifiably shoot at intruders armed with pangas, the same liberty could not be accorded a grown man facing a youth with a stick. The police, or law officers, would do a public service if they could issue some guidance as to the degree of violence "legally permitted" in overcoming assailants.

## Who takes over east of Suez?

Tensions between Iran and Iraq are coming to the surface again as Britain moves a step further to withdraw her withdrawal east of Suez. In addition, Pakistan is vowing to what extent India will take over the power vacuum in the Indian Ocean. NAMAIM Ahmed analyses the implications of the withdrawal of British troops from the Persian Gulf.

With the return of 600 men of the 1st Light Infantry Battalion from Kuala Lumpur, the withdrawal from east of Suez has begun in real earnest. Australian and New Zealand troops will replace the British forces leaving Malaysia. What will follow Britain's exit from the Persian Gulf and the Indian Ocean is not clear.

Mounting tensions between Iran and Iraq over navigation rights in the Shatt-al-Arab pinpoints the real disputes among the Gulf States which remain unaffected by the British decision to quit the region.

The only thing clear at present is that, despite their bitter disagreements over Shatt-al-Arab and other questions, both Iran and Iraq are keen to see Britain leave the Persian Gulf.

The Baathist regime of Gen. Baath has been running a propaganda campaign during the past few months. Mr. Edward Heath's recent Middle East tour appears to have been a British military presence in the Gulf in spite of the fact that the British have evacuated all British troops from the region.

The Shah of Iran has now said that "nobody wants the British troops back in the Persian Gulf" and that the Conservative Party's policy speaks of unmitigated gung-hoism.

Reminding Mr. Heath and his supporters that British troops will be no more welcome in the Gulf than they are in Anguilla, the Shah proposed that local powers should fill any vacuum created by the British withdrawal from the Gulf.

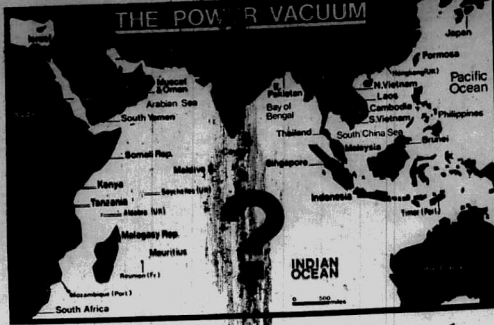

## The new Missionsaries PROJECTS SHOW WAY TO SUCCEED

Most people even today, and "missionary" connotes a picture of an underdeveloped fanatic who leaves the continent of Europe to struggle through the African bush with a rifle, a Bible and a few tin cans.

In modern Africa the word "missionary" is likely to mean a well-educated and dressed in a suit and shoes, working during a tropical rain season, and a well-developed sense of the value of the work. And he is likely to speak of his work as a "development project".

The mission of the modern missionary is to bring the gospel of the world's religions to the people of the world, and to help them to meet their physical and spiritual needs, as well as to help them to improve their living standards.

He is also the mastermind behind the building of a water storage tank, a sewerage tank and various other innovations that help to make life in the hot, dry Gull Area just a little more bearable.

The mission nurse, whose main task is to treat the malaria, trachoma, chest infections and minor ailments of her Turkana patients, is Mrs. Len Pick, a Canadian from Victoria, British Columbia. She has been there for a year.

"They have to contend with the heat and the dust storms which blow up without warning as well as the dangers of snakes and scorpions which frequently find their way into the missionaries' homes."

The orphanage is housed in temporary structures but there are plans to rebuild in stone. In charge of the orphanage is Mr. James Kibisa, who is assisted by Mrs. Len Pick.

He is also the assistant at the famine relief camp where there are about 600 people living. But not all of them are in need of day-to-day care.

The camp manager, Mr. Jesus Mwikia, explained that the number of people was dwindling as more and more men took up fishing.

They start with home-made fish hooks and with their catches can buy nets. Then if they effort with the nets are successful they are allowed to pay their membership fees to the co-operative.

Although situated in the heart of the desert the co-operative members are finding markets for their fish, each is earning an average of 125/- a month. The bulk of their catch is dried and sold to dealers from Nanyuki. But they have also broken into the export market and send about 25 tons of dried fish to the Congo.

Their fresh fish — tilapia and Nile perch — are sold to a big market from Nairobi which has established a freezing plant at the society's fish factory.

Another of the country's successes is to be found in the Kalakoi area of Masailand. Again the project is the Inyaa Training Centre — was born out of the famine relief camp of the drought years.

The training there is directed to teaching the Masai the techniques of individual ranching as opposed to their traditional practice of nomadic grazing. And the centre is paying dividends. The Masai are taught the benefits of this type of farming and more and more are attending the courses run at the centre.

The centre is run in conjunction with a 2,000-acre model ranch stocked with Mr. Alan Moonbey and 150 Merino sheep.

The agricultural training officer, Mr. Christopher Jones, explained

that the ranch was to show the people of the area what could be achieved by a typical Masai family group. The merinos — unusual for their part of Kenya — were a relatively new venture and Mr. Jones said he could see no reason why the Masai should not run flocks of merinos for wool.

The training centre's principal, Mr. Ernest Mpayyei, has been seconded to Inyaa, which is an Anglican mission venture, by the Government. Also seconded there is the veterinary assistant, Mr. Daniel Mburu.

About 30 farmers at a time attend the two-week courses run at the centre on general animal husbandry. In addition there is a full primary school and an adult literacy course.

A small tanning industry has been started at the quality of the tanned hides produced by the men who have been trained there were described recently as the best of any rural tanning industry in the country. Men and women take over the tanned hides and are making money from the handbags, briefcases and wallets they produce.

Mr. Mpayyei speaks proudly of his adult literacy course and of its prize pupil. He was so successful that he is now in Form II at a Molo secondary school.

The centre is also encouraging the Masai to take up crop farming and a shamba has been established to show what can be done in growing vegetables and maize.

Encouragement is also being given at the Mucui wa Urata training centre near the Mwea Tabere rice scheme, to the people to include more nutritional food in their diet.

Responsible for this educational programme is Mrs. Marilyn Spencer, wife of a University College lecturer.

Mrs. Spencer is holding classes in surrounding villages, and is giving instruction on what foods the people should consume. At the moment 218 women are attending her classes.

"I am trying to encourage them to eat more eggs and drink more milk," she said.

And complementary to her efforts is the poultry course which is held at the centre. The students, mostly young women, attend the centre for three months and are taught the basic principles of good poultry-keeping and how to make money out of it.

In charge of instruction is Sammy Kagithi, who is assisted by an American Harvard University student, Mr. Alan Moonbey, who was sent to Kenya under the Volunteer Teachers for Africa scheme nine months ago.

have been trained in their own homes. They have their own chickens and are raising a flock of all types of chickens. Mucui wa Urata is a learning centre for the village, situated in a few miles from the centre.

She has received encouragement from her father and now her family is taking care of 47 Leghorn chickens while she has returned to the centre to take a course in dress-making.

A sad failure was the girl who successfully completed the course and began making money from her eggs. But her father was less considerate and kept taking money to himself rather than channel any back into the business. Consequently the girl ran away from home. She has not been traced.

Mucui wa Urata is the N.C.C.K.'s shining example of a village polytechnic and more than 300 people are receiving instruction.

Construction I and carpentry courses are run for school leavers who have been unable to get a job. Four students, who have finished C.P.E. took such courses, which last for two years, and have now set themselves up in the construction business.

The carpentry instructor, Mr. Brian Galvin, regards them affectionately as his prize pupils. They are four, all teenagers, are now engaged in building classrooms and dormitories for a nearby Harambee girls' secondary school. They are also negotiating for further contracts with local rice farmers who want bigger and better houses.

The group has employed a number of labourers and is making money.

Revolving work is being done at Mchanga Tulla by the Methodist Church, where 900 people, 700 of whom are being fed. Most of the children suffer from malnutrition and most are victims of malaria. Many have lost their parents. Others have been sent there while their fathers and mothers tend what little herds they managed to save during the trouble.

The aim is to "rehabilitate the people and agreement has been reached with the Government that new blocks of land should be opened up. Plots will be allocated to families who have lost everything if the emergency. They will be taught cultivation and already some people have embarked on maize growing, after tuition by the local missionaries. In addition the Government will try to create a ranching scheme which will cover 800,000 acres in the Kisumu area.

The general secretary of the council, the Rev. John Kamau, explained that the council's intention was to get the people to be less dependent on the nomadic life and encourage them to become cultivators.

"Now, since the drought, the 400,000 people from the British Council of Churches has been used up, but the first phase of the N.C.C.K.'s project, covering the past five years, has been completed successfully.

Now the member churches have entered phase two, covering the next three years. Money is still needed but Mr. Kamau said that enough has been given from other countries to cover the expenditure for 1969. He is hopeful that more will be forthcoming to finance the remaining two years.

During this second phase Mr. Kamau said the council wants to spread its influence a little further and there are plans to launch a local fund-raising campaign which will help in a rural development and training programme.

"We also want to try to give aid to the suffering people of places like Biafra and Vietnam. However we have realised it should be used as a springboard to raise help to help ourselves and to help others away from our borders."

At the River Jubilee meeting that week the delegates from the member churches will look back over the past five years. They will perhaps talk of what more they could have done, but they can consider with pride the gains and achievements that have been made.

They start with home-made fish hooks and with their catches can buy nets. Then if they effort with the nets are successful they are allowed to pay their membership fees to the co-operative.

Although situated in the heart of the desert the co-operative members are finding markets for their fish, each is earning an average of 125/- a month. The bulk of their catch is dried and sold to dealers from Nanyuki. But they have also broken into the export market and send about 25 tons of dried fish to the Congo.

Their fresh fish — tilapia and Nile perch — are sold to a big market from Nairobi which has established a freezing plant at the society's fish factory.

Another of the country's successes is to be found in the Kalakoi area of Masailand. Again the project is the Inyaa Training Centre — was born out of the famine relief camp of the drought years.

The training there is directed to teaching the Masai the techniques of individual ranching as opposed to their traditional practice of nomadic grazing. And the centre is paying dividends. The Masai are taught the benefits of this type of farming and more and more are attending the courses run at the centre.

The centre is run in conjunction with a 2,000-acre model ranch stocked with Mr. Alan Moonbey and 150 Merino sheep.

The agricultural training officer, Mr. Christopher Jones, explained

that the ranch was to show the people of the area what could be achieved by a typical Masai family group. The merinos — unusual for their part of Kenya — were a relatively new venture and Mr. Jones said he could see no reason why the Masai should not run flocks of merinos for wool.

The training centre's principal, Mr. Ernest Mpayyei, has been seconded to Inyaa, which is an Anglican mission venture, by the Government. Also seconded there is the veterinary assistant, Mr. Daniel Mburu.

About 30 farmers at a time attend the two-week courses run at the centre on general animal husbandry. In addition there is a full primary school and an adult literacy course.

A small tanning industry has been started at the quality of the tanned hides produced by the men who have been trained there were described recently as the best of any rural tanning industry in the country. Men and women take over the tanned hides and are making money from the handbags, briefcases and wallets they produce.

Mr. Mpayyei speaks proudly of his adult literacy course and of its prize pupil. He was so successful that he is now in Form II at a Molo secondary school.

The centre is also encouraging the Masai to take up crop farming and a shamba has been established to show what can be done in growing vegetables and maize.

Encouragement is also being given at the Mucui wa Urata training centre near the Mwea Tabere rice scheme, to the people to include more nutritional food in their diet.

Responsible for this educational programme is Mrs. Marilyn Spencer, wife of a University College lecturer.

Mrs. Spencer is holding classes in surrounding villages, and is giving instruction on what foods the people should consume. At the moment 218 women are attending her classes.

"I am trying to encourage them to eat more eggs and drink more milk," she said.

And complementary to her efforts is the poultry course which is held at the centre. The students, mostly young women, attend the centre for three months and are taught the basic principles of good poultry-keeping and how to make money out of it.

In charge of instruction is Sammy Kagithi, who is assisted by an American Harvard University student, Mr. Alan Moonbey, who was sent to Kenya under the Volunteer Teachers for Africa scheme nine months ago.

# East African music breakthrough likely

The news that the next release by the Beatles will be a number composed by East African musicians and incorporating traditional rhythms and musical ideas, if it turns out to be true, will represent the breakthrough into international pop to which local music has come so near many times in the past.

But it will not represent a lucky break for a new group who happen to hit upon a sound that catches on. The Equator Sound Band, whose music is almost certain to be that chosen by the Beatles, has more than eight years of experimentation and experience behind it, and is an almost routine succession of records which have had great success locally.

Mr. Charles Worrod, who started Equator Sound eight years ago, was quick to emphasize that he is treating the news as a rumour at the moment, but is convinced that it is only a matter of time if any case before the East African sound gets the recognition it deserves.

Equator Sound is one of three record companies in Nairobi (it will be reviewing the work of the others during the following weeks), but it is undoubtedly the most important, especially as far as East African music is concerned.

The band releases about four records a month, and they nearly all prove popular on the local mar-

ket. But the competition from other forms of pop music, particularly Congolese, is fierce.

Although the outside influences are obvious, and not the least of them is Congolese itself, the Equator Sound Band—artists on sticks—ing to the East African sound which they consider has evolved to such an extent as to be a completely distinct style.

"Congolese music is more repetitive," said Mr. Worrod, "and although this helps a lot on the dance floor, it's a bad for the form in the long run".

Congolese music has some fine technical exponents but, like East African music, it has borrowed freely, particularly from Latin America and, more recently, from Spain.

It would have been easy for East African musicians to have been over-influenced by exotic forms, particularly rock, but they have stuck to their guns, and their style based on traditional sources has survived intact, but improving technically all the time.

The seven musicians in the Equator Sound Band are: Nashil Pichen (vocalist, composer and band manager, from Western Uganda), Peter Tsotli (vocalist, bass player and composer, a Zulu literary from Zambia), David Kabala (rhythm guitarist and composer, from Tanzania), Gabriel Omolo (bass and lead guitarist and composer, a Luo), Mike Babu (drums, Kikuyu) and Mzee Lucas, who is at least 21 years old (tumba and bongos, a Kamba).

It is the most remarkable example of how serious the theme-

appears that three distinct forms are now dominating music by the east. They are Sukuti, which has a sort of march time, Shilo, which resembles a polka, and Kenya Twist.

"Many visitors to Africa are disappointed to find that our rhythms so closely resemble those with which they are familiar in Britain and America. What they do not realize is that they are also very close to, and in fact derived from, traditional African rhythms," said Mr. Worrod.

The most recent big hit by the band is *Pole Muta*, recorded four months ago and in the Sukuti style.

All the music recorded by the Equator Sound Band, in addition to its distinct styles and rhythms, has a message. For instance, other records which have had success recently include *Mzee Karesma*, which exhortates the advice given by President Kenyatta, and *Mekheva wa Elinu*, which describes how a girl who has had a good education turns the poor people when she returns to her village.

Even more improbable titles are *Judy Sikuma No. 2*, by Peter Tsotli (so called because it was a follow-up to *Pole Muta* which became known as *Judy Sikuma*), and *Forest of Death*.

*Forest of Death* tells of a hunter enters a forest in Tanzania, gets lost and eventually lies down to die before he is rescued. It is composed by Benson Simbeye. It is the first record, Mr. Worrod tells me, to be recorded in East Africa which includes animal noises such as elephant, rain-bird and lion, and can be described as semibrithal.

It is the most remarkable example of how serious the theme-

in East African pop music can be contained in a record entitled *Arguing Kenya Hero*. It tells how Kenya leaders, such as President Kenyatta, Mr. Mboya and the late Minister for Foreign Affairs, Mr. Arguing-Kodhak, ending with the happy description of how he would be meeting his old friends in Heaven.

This record, I am told, proved popular with all Mr. Arguing-Kodhak's friends, including members of the Government.

In addition to the Equator Sound Band, Mr. Worrod also occasionally releases numbers by outside groups when they have a piece which he thinks might become popular. But this rarely occurs, and when it does, Mr. Worrod usually makes a loss.

He has auditions every Saturday morning and although as many as 35 hopeful groups from all over East Africa turn up, only about 5 per cent get a recording.

"So many of their offerings are either bad technically or more often are simply re-hashes of songs which have already become popular," explained Mr. Worrod. His advice to up-and-coming musicians was to try and obtain advice from those more experienced, either from the radio or at concerts, the techniques they use.

Only the more popular East African pieces, such as *Pole Muta* get a hearing in nightclubs, and this has led Mr. Worrod on the search for his next great goal—a night club of his own where the

Equator Sound Band can play their own material and that of others, as well as also record. Mr. Worrod would also like to see African cover of the nightclubs.

Although the plan has had Government support, the big problem at the moment is finding premises. At the moment, Mr. Worrod is very interested in the future of East African music.

Another sign of the breakthrough which Mr. Worrod believes East African music is finding premises, are the back-to-back, but sincere, compliments he has had.

For instance, that East African musical ideas are being taken over into Congolese music. Another sign came from France and Germany, where publishing companies wanted to sign agreements with him.

But he is clear of these, as they would sit down the company if success came his way. At the moment, Equator Sound does its own publishing.

With the success of *Madaka* and *Rulele*, *Hip-Hop* has already become a craze in the East African sound scene.

"Our African musical ideas are about as much similar to Western music as we shall break through. Mr. Worrod's parting words were: 'If he thought it would be hard, the

# NOW IT IS FURNITURE YOU THROW AWAY

The face of furniture is about to undergo a revolution. Within the next two or three years, the industry which will, as a general rule, furnish our homes in the style and manner of another age, will at last follow science, architecture and technology into the wireworld world of tomorrow.

This, at least, is the theory, and it is being backed by fast-acting designers and interior decorators who believe that the furniture in which home fashion is getting its last beginning to emerge.

We are, they say, at last letting go of our centuries-old obsession with the essential permanence and solidity of furniture, and starting to come to terms with the idea of highly portable, flexible items which will not only save space but which will have to be used as fully as possible.

Furniture of the 'seventies will be fold-up, deflate, stack, knock-down and have a dozen different uses. Instead of rooms there will be 'areas' which are used alternately for eating, sleeping, relaxing and leisure activities.

No longer are such techniques merely subjects for discussion among progressive designers. They exist. Experimental homes have been built to house the furniture of the future.

They have been lived in — and life in a 'multi-purpose environmental area' is reckoned to be very pleasant — once you get used to it.

First steps to transfer drawing-board dreams to the hard world of professional interior decoration came at last year's Milan Furniture Show when the program designers like Salvadori, Archimede and Bernard Corvin went wild with transparent plastic, glass-like and performed foam-rubber.

Design pundits believe that commercial interests will take the development as a broad hint that spectacular changes are on the way and — more important — that the

young British designer, Peter Murdoch, designed a chair which comes on a roll-up sheet of cardboard. You cut it out and assemble it at home. The price will eventually be about 20s. and it should last from three to six months depending on the amount of wear. It then says Mr. Murdoch, you will have got tired of it anyway.

The current trend for simplicity could well end in homes being virtually no furniture at all, a few multi-purpose pieces. All our needs would be catered for by a few non-necessary pieces.

# Getting the best out of those 'unusable' recipes

Melt the butter in a pan and poach the meat gently, ham side down. When golden, turn over and do the other side. When both sides are cooked add lemon juice and brandy. Set aflame and let the brandy burn off. Put the veal on a hot plate, add the wine to the pan and reduce the sauce over high heat.

When thickened, pour over veal and serve garnished with sprigs of (baked) tomatoes.

Strawberries and pineapple with Kirsh: 1 pint strawberries, 1 pint pineapple, 1 pint Kirsh

Remove fruit from pineapple can and drain. Mix strawberries and pineapple into pineapple halves. Combine sugar and water, bring to boil and simmer for five minutes. Chill about an hour before serving. 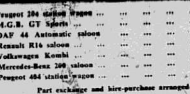

## NEW FROM THE PROVINCES

### 'The education very seriously' call

The Special Community Development Officer for Eastern and Southern Provinces, Mr. A. K. Thyaka, has called for the most essential programmes which were being given priority by the Government and which should be taken very seriously by the people. Mr. Thyaka was opening a one-day adult literacy teachers' seminar at Meru Farmers Training Centre. Later he closed a one-month primary teachers' course organised by the Community Development Department in conjunction with the council of Mulbarakani Community Development Training Centre. Speaking at the seminar, he told the teachers that they had very important role to play in building a literate nation which was the target aimed at by the adult literacy programme. He said most people were not receptive to new ideas if they were illiterate, and were, as a result, hindering development and social progress. It was the teachers' responsibility to ensure that adults received the right care and attention to encourage them to continue with their studies. Mr. Thyaka suggested that in order to step up enrolment and regular attendance, adult education centres should form committees which could formalise the best methods of running their centres. He pointed out that even after all possible efforts had been made by the Government and the Government, the success of most centres depended on how to run and manage their centres effectively by the United Nations representative in East Africa, Mr. G. M. Gardner. At the closing ceremony the P.C.D.D. presented the 64 participants with their certificates. He told the teachers that their importance could not be overemphasised, and that they were playing a big role in the lives of the children they taught were placing a big responsibility on them.

A deficit of £96,165 which was anticipated in 1968 by the Municipal Council of Kisumu was reduced to only £28,945, the chairman of the Financial Council, Clum. O. O. Ollia, disclosed when he addressed a council meeting in the town hall on May 7.

Coun. Ollia said the reduced deficit was achieved when £22,221 was transferred from the renewal fund, and by drastically curtailing the 1968 estimates. Apologising for the delay in presenting the 1968 estimates, Coun. Ollia said estimates for 1969 were being approved by the Council. He disclosed that the 1969 estimates provided for a deficit of £25,200. He justified that there was very little development expenditure in the General Fund estimates, and that provision had been made in general for an anticipated deficit of £25,200.

Speaking on the development programmes facing the council, he said the greatest health menace facing it at the moment was caused by the prevalence of malaria and loss of grass on Biag land.

## WARNING SHIPPERS ON 'SIX' AT BAR TO KILINDINI BRITAIN

The former vice-president of the European Community, Mr. Robert Marjolin, said in the "European Council" that the chances of European political unity were remote. Mr. Marjolin was giving a Brussels conference, and the topic was "Britain and the European Community". He said: "If Britain does not become a member of the European Club, the prospects for a movement towards the political unity of Europe, of whatever kind, are practically nil." He said: "If Britain becomes a member, there is no certainty that progress will be made in this direction, but at least there will be the possibility of Mr. Marjolin and other free movement of capital if Britain enters the Community. # Malawi denies backing Rhodesia resolution

A row blew up in Lusaka on Thursday night over a resolution on Rhodesia of the seven-nation meeting of African Commonwealth parliamentarians with Malawi denying they had voted for it. The leader of the Malawi delegation, the Natural Resources Minister, Mr. R. B. Chidzira, said Malawi and Botswana had not voted for it. Mr. Chidzira's delegate, Mr. M. A. Matsano, countered that "Botswana has at no time supported the 'peace option' in Rhodesia". The Zambian Education Minister, Mr. Wesley Nyirenda, who chaired the meeting, said the meeting unanimously deplored Rhodesia's unilateral declaration of independence and felt it was up to Britain to bring down the Government of Mr. Ian Smith. The resolution had not said how this was to be achieved, he added. Mr. Chidzira said he wanted to give the lie to any impression that Malawi advanced the use of force against Rhodesia. Like other African governments, Malawi was opposed to the use of force, he said.

# 'Pacifist' bishop barred from entering Rhodesia

The Anglican Assistant Bishop of Matabeleland, the Rt. Rev. Robert Mize, has been barred from entering Rhodesia by the Bishop of Matabeleland, the Rt. Rev. Kenneth Skelton, said the Assistant Bishop had been told in March that he would be allowed to enter Rhodesia. He said Bishop Mize then asked a permit under the Immigration Act, but was told a day or so ago that the Government would not change its decision. The diocese of Matabeleland is a large area in the north-western part of the whole of Botswana. Although Bishop Mize is based in the Botswana capital of Gaborone, he is Assistant Bishop to the whole of Rhodesia. Bishop Skelton said the ban on Bishop Mize would make administration of the diocese difficult. "He cannot come and join in our Synods and our top-level discussions on bringing to the attention of the administration of a very fine and devoted pastor," Bishop Skelton said and added: "The Government's decision was hard to understand as Bishop Mize was in fact a pacifist" and was, in fact, a pacifist. A Rhodesian Government spokesman declined comment on the ban. Bishop Mize was Bishop of the South-West African Territory of Damaraland for eight years until the South African Government prevented him of his residence permit a year ago. He was born in America. Commenting on the ban in Gaborone yesterday, Bishop Mize said: "I am very disappointed with the Rhodesian authorities' attitude. I have plenty of work to do, but I can't fulfil all my duties because of the ban."
