There was an urgent need to accelerate the land adjudication programme, an Assistant Minister for Lands and Settlement, Mr. Gachago, said yesterday.

So far only 3,000,000 acres had been registered and there were still some 27,000,000 to do. Demand for adjudication were coming in continuously from all parts of Kenya.

Mr. Gachago told officials that it was hoped that a recent increase in the staff would help them, but the ministry expected them to step up their output.

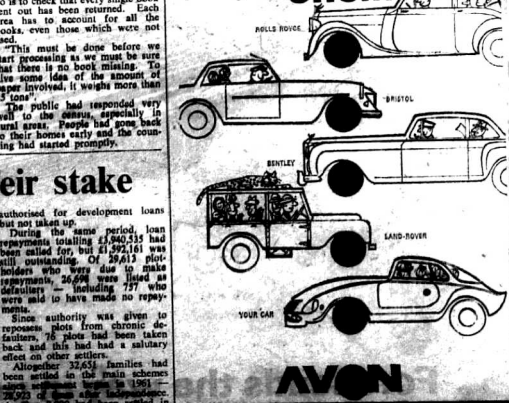

The bomb attacks on Catholic homes, if one wanted for argument's sake to single out particular cases, the rioting and looting in Londonderry and the suspicious about the attitude of the Northern Ireland police, made it almost inescapable that Mr. Lynch should speak.

Support from all sections, young and old, students, professional people, workers and farmers, has poured in since Mr. Lynch broadcast.

It is the measure of the deep-felt sympathy for the provisions which the Catholic minority have endured in Northern Ireland for so long.

The partition of Ireland is considered an anomaly, both politically and geographically. The creation of that view is that if Ireland were not partitioned a nation which discriminated against the Catholic majority would never be in existence and that the present bloodshed would never have happened.

The partition of Ireland became a fact of life in the first instance by the Treaty of 1921, but this Treaty in all its implications was to produce a bloody civil war in Ireland.

Nonetheless, the majority of Irish people, either pro- or anti-Treaty, felt that partition as such was totally unjust.

On this historical basis Republic of Ireland affairs, in their widest sense, have been hung up on partition. The most extreme expression of that commitment - against, may it be said, the Government of the day - was the activities of the IRA movement, which engaged in raids on the R.U.C. barracks in Northern Ireland.

The statement by Mr. Lynch, if taken against this historical background, is inevitably acceptable to the people of Ireland. It has met with almost fanatical enthusiasm.

The more extreme elements in Ireland may feel that it was time the matter of partition squarely into the international political arena again.

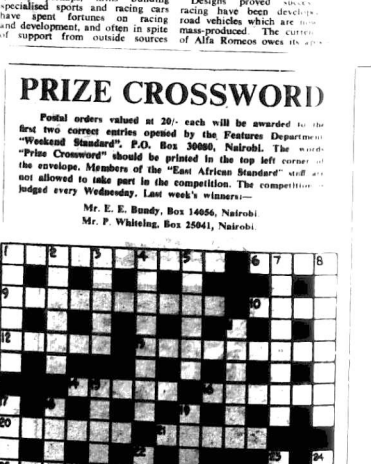

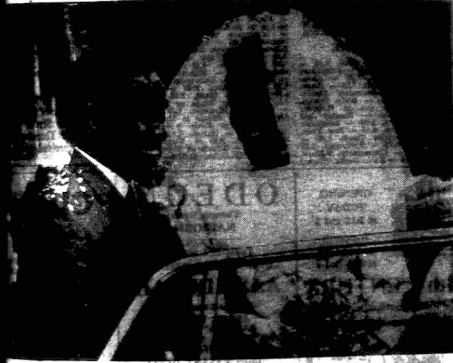

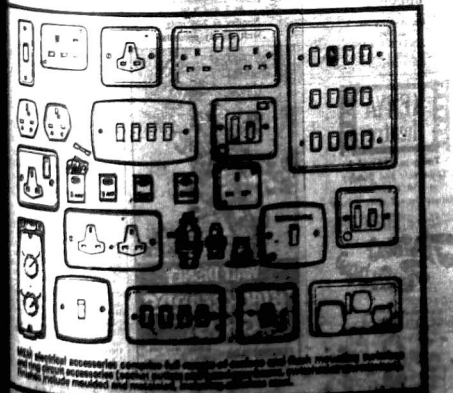

Booming Rumania looks to African countries

Today is Rumania's National Day marking the 25th anniversary of the country's liberation. Rumanians maintain an embassy in Dar es Salaam and an economic representative in Nairobi.

The Eastern European country of Rumania, which has made outstanding progress in the field of foreign trade, is interested in establishing with many countries, especially in Africa and Latin America, a friendly relationship with other countries has been increased.

Rumanian foreign trade companies participated in a great number of international exhibitions — 62 in 1968 as against 53 in 1967 — and international fairs was developed. In 1968 Rumania was visited by 1,430,000 tourists as against 1,200,000 in 1967.

A great number of commercial, technical and scientific agreements and protocols were entered into with other countries, leading to constant and increasing active participation in international economic relations.

In 1968 Rumania's foreign trade turnover amounted to some 18,000 million lei, or 25 per cent above 1967. The value of exports rose 3.5 per cent higher than in 1967 and about 40 per cent above 1967. Today Rumania has trade relations with 100 countries in all continents. Her foreign partners numbered 100, and she has concluded trade agreements valid for from three to five years.

Within this framework, Rumania attaches special importance to the extension of economic co-operation with all countries as shown by her constant promotion of trade with such countries. The volume of exchange in the current year being four times that of 1950.

Last year, 1968, 100 countries accounted for more than half of Rumania's foreign trade. In absolute volume, the most important partner in the U.S.A. which ranked first in Rumania's foreign trade, was the U.S.S.R.

Rumania's foreign trade in 1968 was approximately 55 per cent higher than in 1967. This increase in the production of certain items and in the construction of important economic projects, most
