

# Nurse 'to keep after hearing threats'

 Nurse Mary Njeri Muniyuri, a convicted perjurer, told the High Court in Nairobi yesterday that she failed to tell the police of threats on Mr. Tom Mboya's life because she was "not feeling well" at the time.

She told Mr. Justice Simpson she had been told by Nabushon Isaac Njenga Njoroge, charged with the Minister's murder, that he would shoot Mr. Mboya three times. Then, she said, she had gone home "to sleep". About an hour later Mr. Mboya was assassinated in Government Road, Nairobi.

Nurse Njeri, unmarried mother of seven, who agreed she had taken "once on oath" in court case, sought fresh evidence on the alleged conversation she held with Njenga just before Mr. Mboya was murdered.

Replying to the Deputy Public Prosecutor, Mr. John Hobbs, leading for the Republic, she said that during the strict conversation Njenga had been carrying a black briefcase in which he claimed to have a pistol.

## STATEMENT ALLOWED

There were heated exchanges between Nurse Njeri and Njenga's defence advocate, Mr. Samuel Waruhlu, on why she had brought this evidence at this stage and why she had not told the police. Her explanation for not giving evidence previously about the briefcase was that she had been "shocked" and she said she had not told police about the threats to Mr. Mboya because she wanted to go straight home.

She said that once before, about a year ago, she had heard threats from Njenga on Mr. Mboya's life, and she had told the Minister's wife, Mrs. Pamela Mboya.

The closing stages of the prosecution evidence came near yesterday when Mr. Justice Simpson ruled that a long written statement made to the police by Njenga was admissible in evidence. Mr. Waruhlu had submitted that it had been obtained by an inducement offered by the Assistant Commissioner of Police, Mr. John Bell.

The statement was read to a hushed court by Supt. Ignatius Iriga Nderi.

The court adjourned soon before noon. It will resume on Monday, when the last prosecution witness, who is expected to return from a visit to Britain, will be available. Mr. Hobbs said it was "in the interests of justice" that this witness, who did not give evidence at the preliminary inquiry, should appear at what he saw as the murder scene just before Mboya was shot.

# New evidence on black briefcase

The statement alleged to have been made by Njeri was admitted in evidence when Mr. Justice Simpson rejected an objection that Mr. Waruhlu had made because it had been obtained by inducement.

Mr. Waruhlu said that the Assistant Commissioner of Police, Mr. John Bell, had offered Njenga a bribe of being released on bond if Njenga had made a statement which Mr. Hobbs strongly refused.

In his ruling, delivered at the start of yesterday's proceedings, Mr. Justice Simpson dealt with the facts surrounding the statement, and with submissions made by the prosecution and defence. He upheld a prosecution submission that the statement was self-serving in relation to Njenga's account of what he had done on July 3 and he said he had eliminated himself on events of an unbroken firm.

"I am satisfied the statement was voluntary," Mr. Nderi read the full statement to the court. After that he told the court that he was a Kikuyu and that the Kikuyu witness had made a statement which he had signed. The statement had been in Kikuyu and later translated into English which (Nderi) said that the charge against Njenga was that on July 3, he had shot Mboya, and that Njenga had said "I have to say anything but I did it. It would be written down and might be used in evidence."

Njenga had said: "I Njenga, have understood this charge. I do not know anything about the killing of Mboya. I know it and I do not know if it was the only one used in the killing."

"On Sunday, July 6, the pistol that was found with me was brought to me by — (here names were mentioned) — and this is in accordance with the statement made by the witness named — (here names were mentioned) — which I want to say in connection with this case."

# Two-thirds of leaders will miss O.A.U. summit

Only a third of Africa's Heads of State or Government will be attending the O.A.U. Summit conference opening in Addis Ababa today, according to latest calculations.

Only 14 leaders out of 41 will be turning up for the meeting that will be confronted with the controversial and thorny problem of what to do with the Liberation Committee, O.A.U.'s main instrument for its struggle against colonial powers.

The attendance at the Summit will be much smaller than at last year's in Algiers.

President Ahijido of Cameroon, President Nyerere of Tanzania, President Zoubeir of Dahomey, President Bokassa of the Central African Republic, and the Zambian Vice-President, Mr. Simon Kapwepwe, arrived yesterday.

Emperor Haile Selassie of Ethiopia welcomed each arrival personally.

In Khartoum, the Sudanese leader, Major-General Al Nimiry, left for Addis Ababa and in Nouakchott, Mauritania, it was announced that President Daddah also was leaving for the Ethiopian capital before visiting Addis Ababa.

As the Heads of State began to arrive, O.A.U. Foreign Ministers, due to end their nine-day meeting last night, were finishing their work with the Liberation Committee dilemma.

The head of the Nigerian Federal Military Government, Major-General Gowon, is due in Addis today on his way to attend the Summit.

He is flying in a chartered airliner with Ministers and officials. Gen. Gowon is due to lunch with President Nyerere and is expected to have private discussions with him before the two Heads of State leave for Addis Ababa later in the day. It will be Gen. Gowon's first visit to Uganda.

# ISRAELI SMASH GUERILLA BASE

Israeli jets struck at a Lebanese village yesterday, after commandos had flown in by helicopter and blown up several houses alleged to be a guerrilla base.

The commandos launched their first ground attack on Lebanon since the helicopter-borne reprisal raid on the suspected guerrilla base.

An Israeli military announcement said the commandos demolished 12 houses and killed at least 10 guerrillas. It also said that 100 Israeli soldiers were wounded in the attack.

Israeli military reports from Galilee said the troops seized weapons and explosive stores in Haila, an area known as a "suburban supermarket" of the commandos said.

The Israelis called on villagers to assemble in one place, but the guerrillas attempted to escape. One guerrilla came out sheltering behind a young Arab woman, but an Israeli soldier took aim and shot him dead.

A other guerrilla came out of a room holding two children in his arms. As the Israeli had their second guerrilla shot.

The newspaper said this was the first time that such heavy troop concentrations had been seen along the border and believed it probable that Israel was planning to occupy a section of Lebanon territory.

A total of 21 Israelis died in the border and territory. Along the ceasefire line and terrorist attacks inside occupied territories, Israeli military correspondents reported in Tel Aviv.

# Britain denies plan to protect Libya's king

A British Foreign Office spokesman denied a Cairo newspaper report alleging that Britain had a secret plan to protect King Idris of Libya from being overthrown by a national revolution.

Answering questions at a daily Press conference, he also denied a Moroccan newspaper report claiming that there was a secret protocol on the Queen's Anglo-Libyan friendship treaty signed in 1957.

He added "As you know, the treaty does not give the British Government the right to interfere in Libyan internal affairs and of course we have had no intention of doing so."

The newspaper report, by Egypt's leading newspaper, Mr. Mohammed Haykal, said the British plan, drawn up five years ago and largely aimed at intervention in United States support to put down an military threat to the King.

The new British Government, which was recognised on Thursday by the Soviet Union, has lifted the ban on the use of the word "coup" in its newspaper *Al-Ahram*.

# RHODESIA HIT BY REDUCED IMPORTS

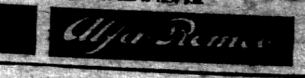

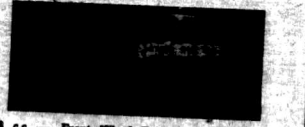

**BANK INTERVENES TO BACK STERLING**

The Bank of England reportedly intervened to maintain the quotation of Sterling at 2,382 1/2 francs per pound after a slight weakening on the London and Frankfurt markets.

Monetary experts in London said the weakening of Sterling was due to the French Government announcement of the drop in money wages and the trade union's refusal to accept the Government's wage policies.

The Frankfurt Sterling dropped to 2,382 1/2 DM per pound and 2,381 1/2 DM per franc (rates the previous day: 2,382-2,383 1/2 francs per dollar).

The dollar rate on the Frankfurt market rose slightly from 3,978 DM per 100 francs against 3,978 DM per 100 francs against 71.79 DM the day before.

In London, Sterling was being quoted at 124 1/2 pence, barely seven points above its lowest level since devaluation.

France's overall reserves rose by another 21,000,000 dollars, which ended last Thursday's streak of France announced.

The bank's weekly report showed a 274,000,000 franc increase in gold and currency reserves, an increase of 157,000,000 dollars, giving a net capital of 117,000,000 francs.

This was the third consecutive weekly increase in French reserves since the devaluation of the franc on August 8.

The Finance Minister, Mr. Michel Delebarre, said the increase in reserves was necessary, with \$22,000,000 of capital into France, to total \$329,000,000 by Wednesday, with \$22,000,000 on that day alone.

He also revealed that France's reserves had been down to \$1,363,000,000 one week before devaluation compared with \$6,227,000,000 at the end of April 1968, just before the May 13 student-workers' revolt.

**Firm drops dam project after guerilla threat**

A Swedish company facing threats from African guerillas over its share in the construction of a \$112,000,000 dam in Mozambique, has announced its withdrawal from the project.

The Swedish Electrical concern Asa was originally a member of an international consortium including French, South African and German firms, to which the Portuguese Government awarded the contract to build a dam and hydro-electric project at Cahora-Ozma.

The company, which has been given the largest of Swedish design contracts and press attacks, disclosed it had not received its tender, believed to be worth more than \$15,000,000 when the consortium's original bid expired on July 31.

Its managing director, Mr. Carl Nilsson, confirmed on Swedish radio that Asa would not be taking part in the scheme.

Barley M. Lourenco, Mozambique representative of the Portuguese liberation movement, said the company's withdrawal was a blow to the project, but that his workers would be glad to take over the project.

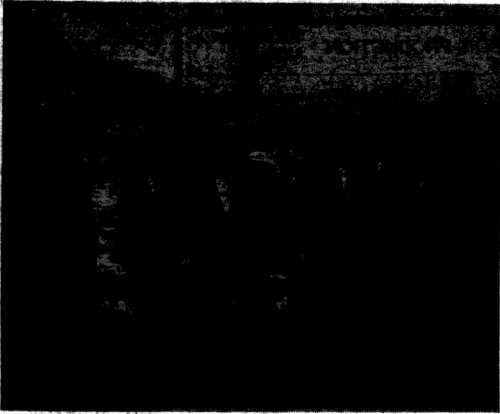

# Ecuadorian plane flies to Cuba after student hijacking

An Ecuadorian Air Force plane hijacked by a group of students carrying sub-machine guns, has landed in Cuba after refueling stops at Panama and Kingston, Jamaica.

Source at the airport said 12 hijackers were aboard the plane, plus a copilot and five crew members. There were also 16 passengers. There were also 16 passengers and five crew on board.

One source said a student among the hijackers had described their flight takeover as "Operation Ho Chi Minh." The plane was one of two seized over Ecuadorian territory at the weekend.

The pilots were forced to fly to the Colombian port of Tumaco. There the crew and passengers of one plane were transferred to the other and the body of a copilot was thrown from a radio report. A wounded Ecuadorian Army sergeant was also left behind and taken to hospital in Tumaco, the radio said.

There was no word from Cuban sources on when the plane, crew and passengers would be returned to Ecuador.

The Swiss Embassy, which represents Ecuadorian interests in Cuba, said it was taking steps to help the aircraft and passengers freed as soon as possible.

The students said they seized the two aircraft to protest against the repression of student demonstrators at Guayaquil last May.

The pilot of one plane, Mr. Luis Baz, was killed and a mechanic wounded at the moment when the students took control of his aircraft.

When the student hijackers found that the plane's engine had broken down, forcing it to remain on the ground, they decided to hijack the aircraft, which then left for Cuba, landing briefly

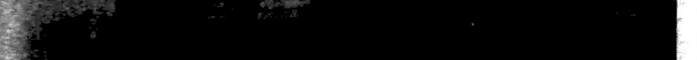

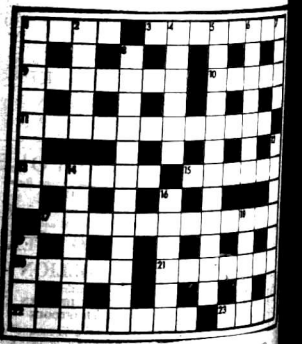

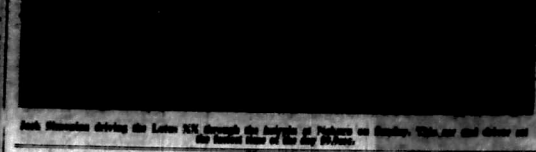

**Towards making tastier dishes**

People in all advanced countries complain that foods are getting tasteless. This criticism is applied especially in the United States where processed foods are used more widely than in any other country. In Britain there is the continuing argument that eggs laid by battery hens are less tasty than those laid by hens allowed to move about freely in their runs - "free range" eggs.

At the Queen Elizabeth College of the University of London, a team of scientists is busy with "matters," the first scientist being Mr. A. J. McLeod. Nearly every day for the past five years he has boiled cabbage for half an hour. Starting with any cabbage he could get, he collected the vapours from boiling cabbage - the vapours that contain the colour-making chemicals - and fed them into a gas chromatograph. This is an analytical apparatus in which different gases move through columns at different speeds, so that mixtures can be separated into their components. The method is very delicate and accurate, present in only a few parts per million can be separated and measured.

It is, in every sense, a sensitive instrument. The volatile substances that have such an effect on our sense of taste, which is associated with

the sense of smell. Smell is indeed part of the taste.

The Agricultural Research Council now co-operates in this work by sending cabbages whose growing conditions are known - different pesticides, different fertilisers and so on. Thus Mr. McLeod can see if the different conditions of growth affect the volatile substances given off, and therefore the taste. A team of tasters has been brought in to taste the cabbage when it is cooked and so report on the results when volatile substances have been driven off.

It has been found so far that the chemical that makes cabbage tasteless is dimethyl sulphide. Experiments are being carried out to try to grow cabbages that result in this chemical. The result is that when the cabbages are grown in close proximity to flavour gets worse. It is too much of a good thing. Isothiocyanate, which is cabbage taste, is also a mustard in it. Work is also being done on analytical techniques that have been perfected. Who shall know the answer to the range and battle whether they really do whether the alleged effect is due to subjective bias or merely on prejudice.

 Apart from negotiations conducted in Addis Ababa by the Consultative Committee, two developments are of major importance: the resumption of "mercy" flights to Biafra and the return to the Federal fold of the country's first President, the famous Dr. Azikiwe.

Already, the Biafran propaganda machine in Geneva is trying to belittle the effects of resumed supplies. Nevertheless, aid is flowing once again, after a six-months' break, to the relief of the starving population remaining in the shrunken area under rebel control.

Biafran propagandists made capital out of the interruption of international relief. Why did this happen? On one side, the Federal Government insisted on its rights, under the 1949 Geneva Convention, that all relief flights to Biafra should put down for inspection in Nigeria, for the obvious purpose of guarding against military material being flown in under the guise of medical and food consignments. On the other side, Gen. Ojukwu consistently refused to meet this obligation, since it would have meant acknowledging Federal sovereignty.

While the impasse continued, and people were reduced to a new low level of starvation, he was stiffened in his resistance by certain outside relief agencies defying the Nigerian right of control. At least two of these agencies have operated surreptitiously from Portuguese colonial territory though, strangely enough, this has evoked little reaction from African countries. The conclusion is that the Federal Government has again demonstrated in its sense of goodwill, establishing that it has no desire to use starvation as a weapon of war.

Leading Biafran supporters are defecting to the federal side in increasing numbers. The greatest of these is undoubtedly Dr. Azikiwe who has gone over to join the 4,500,000 Iboes living in federal controlled territory to help work for a peaceful solution and reconstruction.

...Dr. Azikiwe is the outstanding Ibo, he was the first President of the former Western Nigeria and first Nigerian President. He did not voluntarily surrender presidential office but was removed by a military coup, whereupon he left Lagos for the Eastern Region. In the course of time, he became Biafra's loving ambassador, rallying international support to the break-away cause. He repeated the propaganda tale that Ibos would not survive any contact with the other Nigerians.

Had there been any intention on the part of the Federal Military Government to exterminate the Ibos, would he not have been hauled off to jail, instead of receiving a glorious welcome? He has Nigeria of which he was one of the principal founders, branding the accusation of genocide leveled against the Federal authorities as "patently false" (his words). In doing so, he joined forces with observers from Sweden, Poland, the U.K., Canada and the U.N., who have consistently maintained the Biafran slogans of genocide were based on false propaganda, to deprive the world in general and especially the Ibos.

The O.A.U. policy has remained firm in support of the Ibos, and against secession movements. Those people who continue to advocate tribal secession should be allowed, on the grounds that the Ibos are often artificial colonial divisions, fail to comprehend the problems of Nigeria, which form a microcosm of Africa's wider problems. ment of the tremendous increase in productivity in industry which was brought about by systematic methods improvement.

The Organisation and Methods man is now a familiar figure in the offices of many companies and there is no doubt that the application of the O. and M. approach to the office has produced astronomical savings of money and time (and especially of temper) throughout the world.

There is however a popular misconception that all you need in order to raise office efficiency is more and better methods.

But, while the efficient and often highly sophisticated office machines now available have played an important part in increasing office productivity, their value can only be fully exploited by a corresponding improvement in management practices.

An office which has previously only used manual methods invariably requires changes in both the philosophy and procedures of management when machines are introduced. Unless these changes are effectively brought about, it can easily happen that the process of mechanisation actually lowers rather than raises office efficiency.

One of the purposes of the current office organisation and management course at the centre is to train the participants in the principles involved in achieving all types of office management objectives.

This means that they can then go about improving efficiency and effectiveness in a systematic way and also design the methods and procedures best suited to their

particular conditions, at any given point in time.

There is a saying among O. and M. men that "there is always a better method", which implies that the search for methods improvement must be a continuous one. What may appear to be the best method today could be hopelessly outdated in 12 months' time.

But unless a close and above all enlightened watch is kept by the Office Manager or O. and M. man, a Company may continue indefinitely with old and wasteful methods, which means that potential profits are being poured down the drain.

The Office Organisation and Management Course given at the Centre is divided into three parts. The first fortnight is spent at the Centre during which intensive full-time training is given.

The various sessions are designed to allow the participants to play their maximum possible part in the Course and considerable use is made of the latest audio-visual aids and other modern teaching methods.

During this period the participants also select a project to be carried out during the following three weeks, when they return to their various places of business.

The object of the project period is to enable them to apply something of what they have learned during the first two weeks of the course to solving their actual management problems.

During the project period all the participants are visited by their Course Leader in a consultative capacity. He also takes notes, if necessary, with Company manage-

ment in order to smooth out any problems that may arise.

During the sixth week of the course participants return to the centre where their projects are discussed and additional training sessions are given.

The course itself includes sessions on such subjects as— The function of the Office; basic purpose of clerical operations; the organisation of the office; the sub-division, grading and routing of work.

The Office Manager and the O. and M. Specialist; essential personnel and training; the Office Manager's responsibilities for cost and security; general office services; approach; creating, filing, telephone, mail, messengers, etc; handling incoming mail; accounting; cash control; payroll; purchasing and stock control.

Integrative procedures; office work simplification and work measurement; office layout; control and design of forms; planning and controlling office work in terms of quantity, quality, time and cost.

Office mechanisation; an insight into the use and capacity of all types of office machines; human relations aspects; getting results through people; appraisal of individual performance.

An additional service can also be provided by the course leader in undertaking short management consulting assignments to assist sponsors in solving office management problems. The fees for his services are extremely low and a preliminary survey is usually made without charge.

In addition to the Office Organisation and Management Course, the centre also offers regular management training courses in the following subjects—

General management for senior executives; middle management; staff; personnel management; management accounting; marketing and sales management; sales supervision; production planning and control; supervisory training for foremen; supervisory training for supervisors; supervisory training for instructors.

How to start and manage a small retail or retail-wholesale business; how to start and manage a small manufacturing business; accounting for new African businesses.

There is also a group of special training courses which are given whenever suitable demand arises, which includes— maintenance management; leadership and motivation; inventory control; quality control; business economics; modern business writing; effective public speaking; faster reading; statistics; business; successful management communication; public relations in business; programmed learning; operations research; sys-

tematic control of overhead costs; critical path network planning; value analysis; organisation of executive time; management control; purchasing management; management accounting and office organisation management; better supervision.

The centre is a joint project of the Government of Kenya and the United Nations Development Programme with the International Labour Organisation as the Executive Agency.

As such, it is the principal objective of the centre to train African counterparts to each of the overseas consultants, so that when the five-year project is completed the whole of the operations can be safely left in African hands.

The full complement of counterparts has now been selected and most have already been working at the centre for quite a time.

There is no doubt that the centre has made remarkable progress in a very short time and is already making a notable contribution to management training in Kenya, in pursuance of the National Development Plan.

This is actually the third year in succession that the Centre has staged the Business Efficiency Exhibition which reflects the interest displayed in it by both the public and the exhibitors alike.

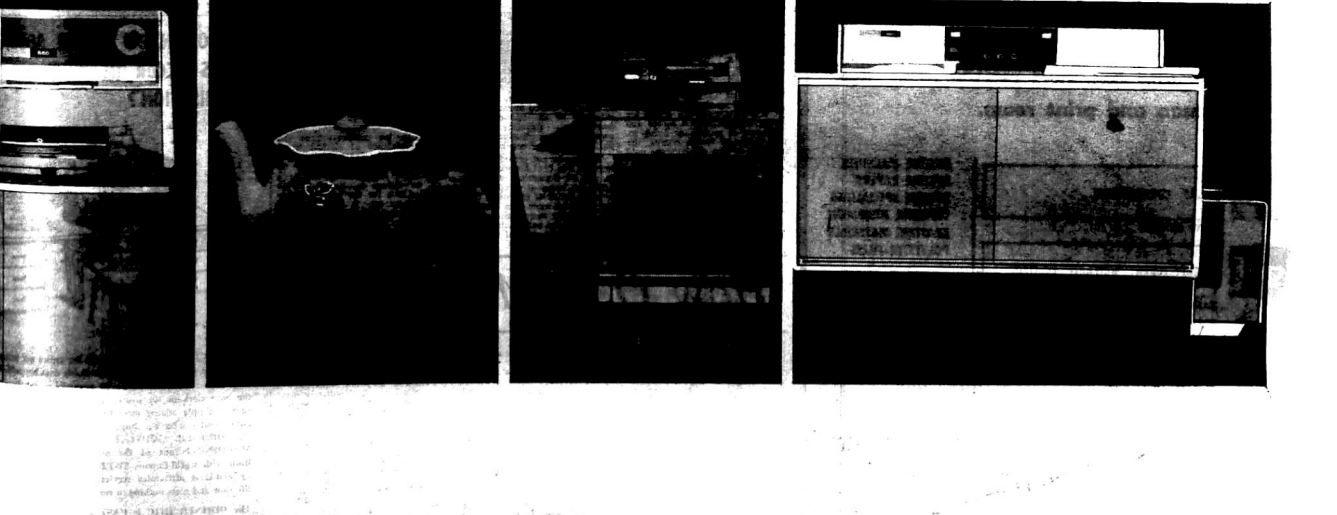

## Copies at stencil price

As a copier (1-5 copies from a document) a modern duplicator makes 60 copies a minute, 1,000 an hour. As a duplicator, the lights work direct from the original document, without the need to make any stencil or master. The prints like all those produced by xerography, are completely dry and ready for immediate use.

The user pays a copying price for all copies up to five (the higher the volume of this copying the lower the unit charge). For runs over six he pays a duplicating price. Thus the user cuts his unit cost both by increasing the volume of work put onto the machine and by using it for longer runs.

The prints can be automatically made up into sets by a linked sorter, speeding up the reproduction of reports. For example, 50 copies of a five-page report can be made and collated in under five minutes.

The sorter is supplied in ten-bin modules. There can be from 20 to 50 sorting stations. Modern duplicators are so simple to operate that they can be used on a "self-service" basis. Any secretary can walk up to the machine and make the required number of prints without getting her hands dirty.

She simply places the original document in position on the machine, and dials the number of

A modern machine for duplicating and copying has been introduced on a rental basis by Rank-Xerox in Nairobi. This self-service duplicator has made modern machines easy to work and how they cost.

The user pays a copying price for the first print, and one second for each succeeding print.

The whole machine is designed to make its operation as automatic as possible. Any number of prints from 1 to 499 can be set on the dial; the number is then shown illuminated on the control panel, and as the machine makes each print the total it has made is displayed electronically on the panel.

When the two numbers coincide, the run is complete, the lighted numbers are cleared and a small panel lights up to say that the machine is ready for the next job.

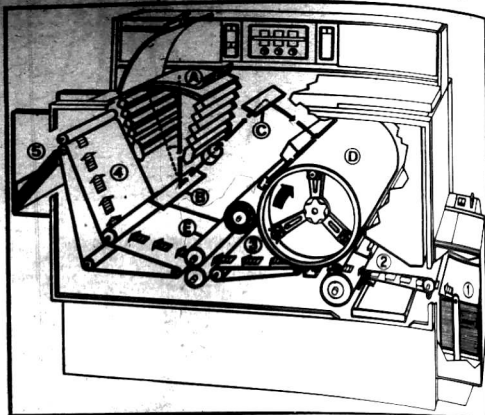
As part of the cost-rental scheme, a member of the user's staff is trained as a "Key Operator" to look after the machine. The Key Operator switches the machine on in the morning, makes sure that it has enough "toner" powder and fills up the paper tray. This can be done easily in five minutes.

The machine can then be used by anyone, but only the Key Operator can unlock the machine and open the cover and doors. If the paper supply runs low or the machine spots some other irregularity, a light flashes on and on "Call Key Operator".

The service engineers will replace any worn parts — even complete sub-assemblies when necessary — without charge to the customer. The regular service is similar to the mileage on a car — except that in this case the service is carried out on-the-spot. This routine servicing is carried out at 50,000 prints, 100,000 prints and then at every additional 100,000.

## Machine in action

The operation of the Rank Xerox 3600, which is in use in Nairobi, is shown on the right. The original document is placed face down upon the curved glass platen (A) where two banks of specially-developed fluorescent lights illuminate it from below. The oscillating mirror (B) scans the document and reflects the image, sending it along the optical path through a lens to a fixed mirror (C). From there it is reflected onto the selenium-coated drum (D). The paper on which copies are to be produced (E) is brought up to the proper level by an automatic elevator. It is fed into the machine and transported along belt (F). At the first set of rollers the sheet of paper is properly aligned before moving to the drum (D) where the image is transferred to it. Then it passes along belt (G) to the heated roll (H) which permanently fixes the image onto the paper's surface. From that point, the paper is simply carried along transport (I) to the output tray (J) that will neatly stack up to 500 sheets. A unique vacuum system holds the paper securely to all three transport belts. On the right is the 3600 in operation.

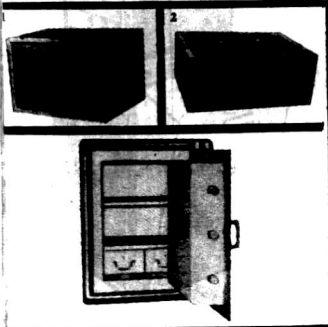

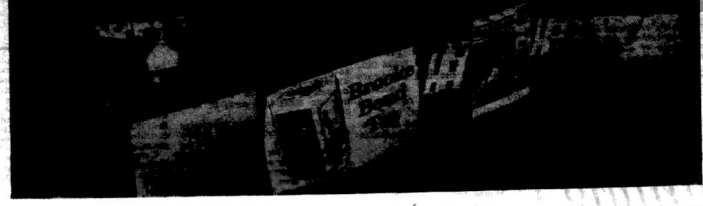

Who

needs a  
safe?

Think for a moment of the way in which cash flows out of banks and eventually back to the banks. Here and there, in these rivers of cash, "pools" form — in shops, hotels, places of entertainment, public transport undertakings, garages, rent and rates offices, public utilities and so on.

It is almost a certainty that sooner or later each of these pools of cash will be carefully considered by a thief. If it looks easy to scoop it up he will attempt to do so, but if the defences seem strong and the task risky, he will look for easier prey.

As everybody knows, the rate of crime in recent years has been phenomenal. These, for instance, are some United Kingdom figures for persons found guilty of breaking and entering since 1955:

There are many more incidents in which the guilty parties were not brought to justice.

The answer to the question at the top, then, is that any person or organization with pools of cash to protect must have a safe.

But it is not good enough just to have any safe for modern thieves make short work of old and cheap safes. Only first-class scientifically designed protection will defeat them.

Moreover it is not enough only to have a burglar alarm — safes and alarms have different but complementary functions. The safe delays the thieves while the alarm calls for help. There is no substitute for physical security.

There are four main ways in which people are moved to buy safes:

**Objections to buying a fireproof safe.**  
"We have a strongroom."

Excellent, provided your staff are not to be expected to return the vital company records to it if your business is to be struck by fire during working hours.

Most fires occur by day when there are people present to accidentally start them. Even the most loyal staff will have a duty to leave the building as quickly as possible — the preservation of life must come first.

Besides, many of your staff are keeping vital records in their desks overnight. They should have easy

access to fireproof safes, as it is only human if they "forget" to take their papers to the strongroom.

Also, people working after hours will find the strongroom locked. More often than not it is your executives who work overtime, and the papers they handle are probably important.

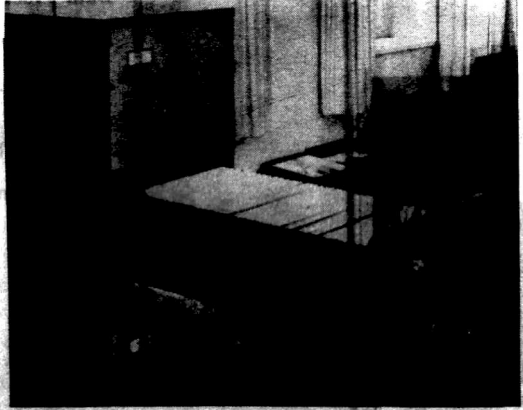

Most old safes were filled with a loose proofing material, usually sawdust or sand. Over the years, with movement and constant door slamming, this loose proofing will have settled down in the body like flour in a sack after shaking. It is likely that voids will have been created through which heat will readily pass.

Try tapping your knuckles at the top of the inside of your safe and see if you can detect a hollow sound.

Try tapping a torch into the bottom of your safe, behind the drawers and into the bolt sockets and see if you can detect the last particles of proofing.

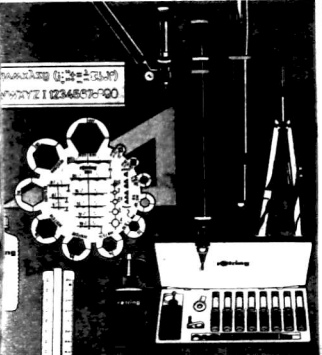

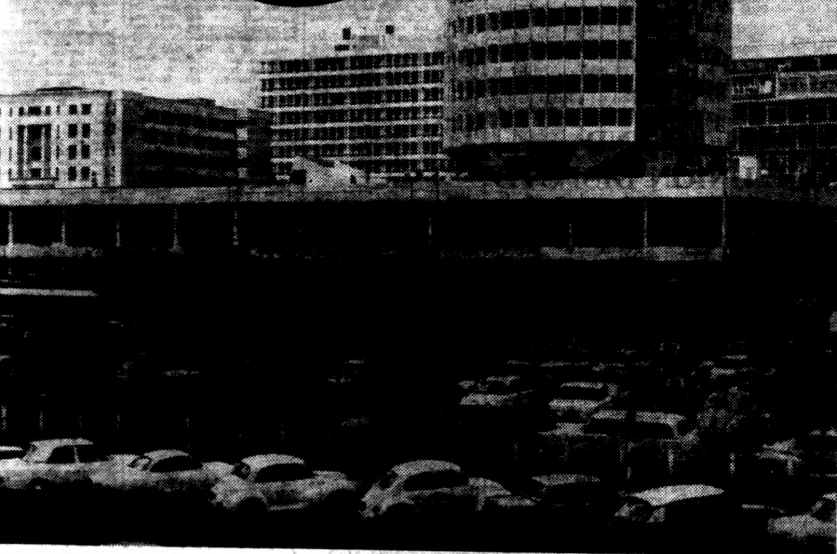

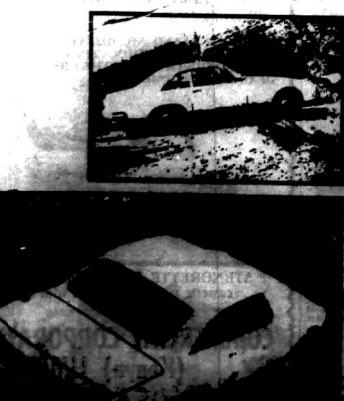

Rakayi Tangwena and his people live on the remote, hilly land beyond the Gaerai River which marks the boundary between Rhodesia and Mozambique.

His predecessors lived there for centuries before the first white man came to colonise the territory which used to expand far into present-day Rhodesia.

Rakayi is a chief who said "no" to the constitutional proposals in Rhodesia's June referendum and therefore, though properly elected by his people, is no chief in Ian Smith's eyes.

He and his followers have been told they must move from their inherited land.

He depends on the loyalty and support of his people, which he has, and not the badge of honour and chief's allowance, which he has not. Of the chieftaincy Rakayi says:

"I was elected on January 9, 1966. I went to Inyanga to have my appointment recognised by the District Officer, but he said he had to delay recognition at the request of Mr. Hamner, the managing director of the Gaerai Ranch Co."

Mr. Hamner wanted labour agreements signed by those living on the land which he thought was his. I was not happy about this

as I sent to the Provincial District Officer.

"He said that there would no longer be a chieftaincy in my area as the tribe was now required to move from the land."

"I went to Salisbury to the Chief District Officer's office, but they told me to return to the D.O. in Inyanga."

"He was upset that I had been to Salisbury and said that my people must now enter into labour agreements with Mr. Hamner or move to Gokwe, where land was available, or else cross the border with Mozambique."

"I was not prepared to accept any of these choices. So on February, 1966, the D.O. was still not prepared to recognise me as chief and has not done so since."

On September 17, 1966, Chief Tangwena received a letter from Mr. Hamner, which said "I understand that you are living in the Tstete Kraai area in Gaerai Ranch. You have never worked for me to my knowledge, and I never gave you leave to settle on this property."

"I therefore gave you notice to leave the property by October 12, 1966, with your dependants and personal property."

Tangwena did not move. In February this year Mr. Hamner and a policeman arrived at his chief's village to ask if he had received the notice.

## Interest in Dr. Nkrumah fades in Ghana

In police stations up and down the country the posters are peeling off the walls but the legend is still clear enough — "Reward of 100,000 new cedis or 350,000 to anyone who can bring Kwame Nkrumah to Ghana."

The former President is still public enemy number one in Ghana and a recent bomb explosion in Parliament House served as a reminder that clericalists exist eager to disrupt the orderly return of a democratically elected Government.

Police have no idea who planted the device which blew out a door, two windows and part of a ceiling, only hours before the promulgation by the Constituent Assembly of the new constitution.

But it did awaken memories of violence during the election campaign in 1954 and the assassination attempts against the deposed Osagyefo, or Redeemer, as Dr. Nkrumah liked to be called.

Dr. Nkrumah, according to the posters, "is hiding in Conakry, Guinea."

Hiding is a little far from the truth, as recently Ghana's former leader was seen openly accompanying Zambia's President, Dr. Katunga, on a tour of Guinea.

His old friend, President Sekou Touré, bestowed on him the title of co-President of Guinea and President Katunga stated a few weeks ago that in his opinion Dr. Nkrumah was still the rightful leader of Ghana.

Things may be seen in a different perspective in view of the Ghanaian elections. President Sekou Touré in a recent speech said Dr. Nkrumah would revert to being an ordinary citizen when the military regime in Ghana was replaced by a civilian government.

His ardent supporter, the Black Power leader Stokely Carmichael, may think the ex-President is Africa's greatest son but the Ghanaians in the street think differently.

Carmichael's belief that Dr. Nkrumah will return to lead Ghana again in the early 1970s, is ridiculed in Accra by Press and public alike.

The faded posters state that Dr. Nkrumah is wanted on seven counts — two of conspiracy to extort, four of extortion and one of stealing.

Most charges concern "kickbacks" he and his lieutenants in the now defunct Convention People's Party are alleged to have obtained on Government contracts.

The poster accuses him of stealing a car belonging to the Government which he gave to his brother-in-law, the South African-born entrepreneur, Genoveva Maras.

And as if Ghanaians would not recognise him, the poster carries a detailed description of the man whose poster number is 100,000 from every public building and office wall.

The poster says of his dress habits: "Fond of bullet-proof European attire, Chinese official uniform, sometimes in Northern Ghana attire and white round neck singlet and white trousers as medication dress."

He is listed as holding Ghanaian Diplomatic Passport number 100,000 issued in Accra on February 10, 1966 — a week before a military Army-Police coup overthrew him when he was on a visit to Freetown.

The Police Chief, Mr. John Harney, who probed the case of corruption under the old régime, still hopes to bring Dr. Nkrumah to trial.

Talking to journalists recently he said: "I have not given up hope that he will be arrested" but he admitted that there were difficulties as Ghana did not have extradition treaties with many countries.

Dr. Nkrumah has not been known to have left Guinea since he arrived there via Moscow. Rumours, however, have cropped up periodically that he addressed a peace rally in Algiers, talked to students in Khartoum and visited his brother, Fatsima, in Cairo.

The latest of the unsubstantiated stories circulating in Accra is that he is swapping his present place of exile for Zambia as a condition for his triumphant return must be reeking Kwame Nkrumah Avenue has long since become Independence Avenue.

# Danger of falling down

While the debate rages on, the western side of the dome area continues to slowly break apart and slide infinitesimally down Capitol Hill, towards possible disaster.

Another major problem is the fact that the Capitol is not one structure, but several, each one built at a different time, and with varying materials.

The first two buildings, which serve as links between the new House and Senate wings, were finished in the early 1800s and are made from inexpensive sandstone picked by George Washington for economical reasons.

Serving as headquarters for the Senate, the House, plus the Supreme Court, Circuit Court and Library of Congress, the two box-like structures were originally connected by a wooden corridor.

But, after the British burned them in 1814, the destroyed corridor was replaced by a centre building with a wooden-framed dome.

This central section was also made from soft sandstone. Since the building had no framework and was constructed entirely out of brick and stone, these sandstone walls were designed to support brick arches which, in turn, supported flatstone floors and ceilings.

Sand filling the space between the arches and ceilings, was supposed to absorb the loads from above. It is these three original buildings which are now claimed to be in jeopardy.

# Coalition Government re-elected

Prime Minister Sir Borton's Coalition Government of four non-Socialist Parties has retained power for another period of four years, according to a near final election figure announced in Oslo.

Although the Social Democratic Labour Opposition still had not formally conceded defeat, and Mr. Borton refused to speculate on Government changes until the last postal vote had been counted, experts at election headquarters said there was no chance of Labour recapturing power, which they lost four years ago after 30 years of nearly uninterupted rule.

The coalition was certain of at least a 76-74 majority, it seemed. As vote counting progressed during the night, first one side then the other seemed to have the advantage and even the computers were foxed.

Then, as the voting in two northern areas became known, it became evident that a swing there towards the Liberal Party had tipped the scales back in the favour of the ruling coalition.

Marginal seats lost by Labour four years ago swung back to the present opposition in many counties, although Labour's net gain in votes only slightly surpassed the losses sustained by the Socialist People's Party and the Communist Party.
