"CZECH PEACE HOPES GOOD" SAYS MR. CHURCHILL

Reference To Talk With Sudeten Leader

THE PROSPECTS OF A FRIENDLY SETTLEMENT BETWEEN THE CZECH GOVERNMENT AND THE SUDETEN GERMAN MINORITY IN CZECHOSLOVAKIA ARE BETTER NOW THAN WAS RECENTLY EXPECTED, SAID MR. WINSTON CHURCHILL, IN A LONDON SPEECH.

Mr. Churchill had had conversations with Herr Henlein, the leader of the Sudeten Germans, who visited London recently, and he said that he could see no reason why the German minority should not be trusted and honored partners in Czechoslovakia.

With regard to German fears that Czechoslovakia would be used as an air base by Russia in war, Mr. Churchill said that there was no reason why positive assurances of assistance against aggression should not be offered by France and Britain to Germany.

London, May 15.—Mr. Winston Churchill, in the course of his usual night deputation, said that the prospect of a friendly settlement between the Czech Government and the Sudeten German minority was better now than had been expected a short time ago. He said that he had had conversations with Herr Henlein, the leader of the Sudeten Germans, who visited London recently, and he said that he could see no reason why the German minority should not be trusted and honored partners in Czechoslovakia. 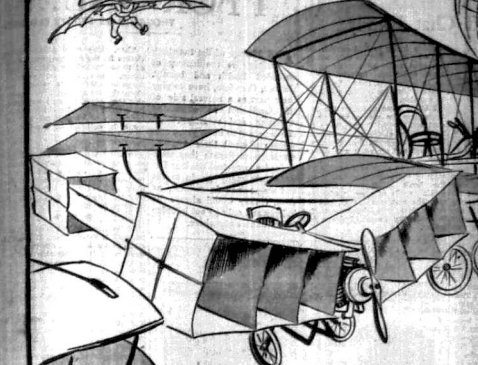

CHILD LABOUR IN KENYA

Archdeacon Owen Protests

(Special Correspondent.)
The following letter has appeared in the Morning Star—
To the Editor of the Morning Star—
Gentlemen,
The Official Gazette of Kenya Colony of July 6, 1933, published the text of a bill to provide for the control of the employment of servants. Some of the provisions relate to the employment of juveniles and amongst the objects and reasons of the bill given at the end of the Gazette is that "whereas it appears that there is need for regulating such employment; and whereas the bill passed through the Legislative Council, but not without opposition from one of the members representing the African community, and whereas the bill passed through the Secretary of State for the Colonies."
The clause which amended, and which still amends, paragraph 18 of the bill (which is inserted in the bill as it appears to be the bill as it is now in force) is as follows:—
"18. (1) A child or juvenile employed in any contract of service."
This clause which children are employed in is inserting. It is stated that the small hands and the children can perform this operation more neatly and with less fatigue than the crop than it is the case with adults.
Behind the courteous phrase of the official document that "whereas it appears that there is need for regulating such employment" there is hidden the real reason which has led to this present contract of service. It is the reward of the child's labour was inadequate according to the low standards which prevail in East Africa. A child could earn eight, ten, or twelve shillings in thirty working days, and it received in addition food and blankets.
