## PLAN FOR REMOVAL OF FOREIGNERS APPROVED

### Non-Intervention Committee Progress

ALL THE MEMBERS OF THE NON-INTERVENTION SUB-COMMITTEE HAVE ACCEPTED THE PLAN FOR THE WITHDRAWAL OF FOREIGN VOLUNTEERS FROM SPAIN, WITH THE EXCEPTION OF SOVIET RUSSIA, TO WHOM URGENT REPRESENTATIONS FOR A RECONSIDERATION OF HER ATTITUDE ARE BEING MADE.

Two resolutions will go to Spain to count the foreigners on each side and supervise the withdrawal, with 10,000 on a basis, and a proportionate increase from the side found to have the most foreign fighters.

Frontier control on the Pyrenean and Portuguese frontiers will be resumed for 30 days from the beginning of the work of the Commission.

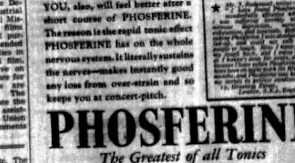

# "All In" Wrestler Sued

## £200 DAMAGES FOR CLUB'S BAR MANAGER

London, May 31.  
Damage of £200 against the manager of a club in a wrestling, for alleged assault and battery, were awarded yesterday in the King's Bench Division. The case followed some time at Lane's London Club. ## MORE "CONSCRIPTION" QUESTIONS IN COMMONS

### PREMIER AND SIR THOMAS INSKIP'S SPEECH

"Might Have Been Expressed Differently"

### CHILD LABOUR IN KENYA

Colonial Office Considering Change In Law

The speech of Sir Thomas Inskip in which he spoke of a "competent authority" in time of war with powers to put every citizen in his proper place has given rise to innumerable questions in the House of Commons on the conscription issue.

London, June 1.—The Colonial Secretary yesterday afternoon that he was asking the House of Commons to support the Government's proposal for the amendment of the law relating to child labour in Kenya. He was considering whether the policy being followed in various territories was adequate to prevent employment of children at work and under such conditions that no serious social and economic problems would be taken.

Yesterday the Prime Minister, who said that no scheme had been worked out for the conscription of industry, though considerable attention had been given to the most efficient utilization of the Nation's manpower in time of war, said that Sir Thomas might have expressed himself differently if he had had more notice.

London, June 1.—The Prime Minister made another statement in the House of Commons this afternoon.

### Three Killed In Antioch

At Antioch yesterday three people were killed and wounded during demonstrations. The authorities have reported military barracks and have suggested a system of inspection of traffic.—(Reuters).

### Cost Of Withdrawing Volunteers

The withdrawal of foreign troops from Spain was again discussed by the Non-Intervention Committee yesterday. The question before the Committee was, whether, in view of the money of individual members of the committee, it was possible to pay for the transport of the troops from Spain to the United States.

### More For State Generals

The State Department of Washington today announced that the United States would be prepared to finance work necessary to enable the international railway to be carried out. The international railway and to develop electrical power from the rugged hills in the mountainous region.

## CANTON MASSACRE WAS CAUSED BY CHINESE, SAYS TOKYO

The Canton raid rumors, in which, after four days bombing, 1,400 people had been seen shot and injured, were caused by wild firing on the part of Chinese anti-aircraft guns.

This is the official Japanese version of the raid, the Foreign Office spokesman declaring that no Japanese aeroplane ever endangered civilians if it could be possibly helped.

### More British Air Bases

London, June 1.—A Japanese Foreign Office spokesman today denied that Japanese aeroplanes were being based in the Canton area. Each of the army and navy were used solely for the purpose of bombing.

### Union Pilgrims In Westminster Abbey

London, June 1.—The South African expedition team who are visiting this country on their way to the Republic of South Africa, yesterday departed for Westminster Abbey.

### Liners On Great Lakes?

A five hundred tonnage liner scheme for the development of the Great Lakes is put forward in a draft report which has been submitted by the United States Government.

### Another Czech Shooting

Two Sudeten Germans were wounded by shooting in a frontier area last night, near Sigmund, the place where the two Sudeten mobile police units were engaged in operations.

### Two SudeTens Wounded In Frontier Brawl

The Czech version says that the other first of the group, that was being immediately arrested, gets that it will remain in being held. It says that the raid was carried out by the United States mobile police units, which were in contact with a party of 100 men who were in a very serious situation.

### N. Rhodesia Wants "Closer Union"

London, June 1.—The Legislative Council of Northern Rhodesia yesterday adopted a resolution, approving the principle of the amalgamation of Northern Rhodesia with the Union of South Africa.

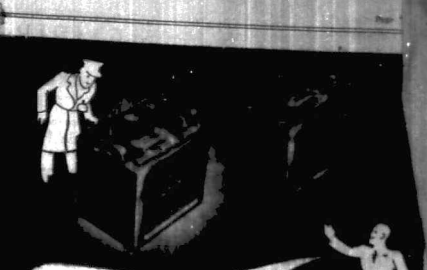
