SPANISH AIRCRAFT DROP BOMBS IN FRANCE

Some Newspapers Blame Insurgents, Others Government

SECOND RAID REPELLED

REPORT WAS TAKEN IN FRANCE YESTERDAY WHEN ACTIONS WERE RECEIVED THAT NINE AEROPLANES HAD FLOWN OVER THE FRONTIER FROM SPAIN, DROPPED BOMBS AT A POINT 15 MILES INSIDE THE BORDER ON THE FRENCH SIDE, AND CONTINUED TO THE TOWN OF TARASCON, 30 MILES FROM SPAIN.

The Premier, M. Daladier, gave immediate instructions to strengthen the frontier defences, and orders were given to attack all aeroplanes of whatever nationality which appeared to be threatening French territory.

Several believe in France were in action yesterday morning when other reports took place. When the guns opened on the aeroplanes returned to Spain, without dropping any bombs. The identity of the aeroplanes is unknown. Some French newspapers blame the insurgents, some the Government.

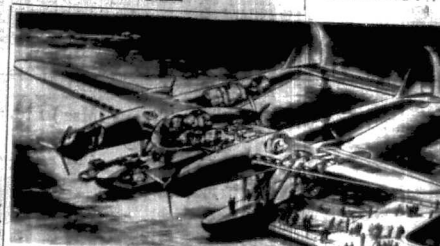

CANTON AIR RAIDS CONTINUE: TEN IN TEN DAYS

Japanese Report Of Sino-Soviet Pact

THE SYSTEMATIC BOMBING OF CANTON CONTINUES, AND THE CITY WAS YESTERDAY RAIDED INSTEAD. IT HAS NOW SUFFERED ABOUT TEN AIR RAIDS IN AS MANY DAYS, AND THE NUMBER OF DEAD NOW RISES INTO THOUSANDS. A FRENCH HOSPITAL SUFFERED A DIRECT HIT FROM A BOMB IN THE SECOND RAID YESTERDAY.

The Dossel Agency in Tokyo reports that a secret agreement has been concluded between China and the Soviet, under which China will have Soviet advisers, two Soviet-equipped mechanized divisions and four air groups, each of 12 aeroplanes.

Canton has now been bombed ten times in ten days, and the death toll is mounting. Nearly 100 aeroplanes are said to have taken part in today's raids and a similar number yesterday.

The main object of the raids seemed to have been the Chinese Government offices and the railway stations. In order to bomb one of the railway stations several hours before the raid, the Japanese had been flying over the foreign quarter and today the British Consul General in Shanghai protested to the Japanese Ambassador.

French hospitals fell directly on a Japanese aeroplanes today, and the Chinese Government has announced that a protest had been made at Nanking. The Japanese Ambassador in Nanking says that the British and American Governments are not likely to take any action.

The Japanese today claim to have captured 100 aeroplanes and pushing forward to the front line of the Chinese Government.

Chinese Reorganisation. The Chinese Government here announced a reorganisation of the Government.

The results for the first four months of the year in the Zanzibar and Pemba trials cover 17 areas for the corresponding period at Zanzibar for 12 inches and 17 inches and 12 inches in the non-growing areas. The results for the first four months were 28.26 inches as compared with the average of 25.26 inches.

Produce Growing—The Government is investigating the possibility of serious damage to the rubber industry and the rubber plantations in the East African territories, already very prevalent on the mainland, jeopardizing the rubber industry. It has been found necessary to furnish reports upon special conditions of some part of the rubber industry.

General speaking—The local food crops are being compared with other countries. The comparison was based on the yield of all local varieties and strains and those receiving the best of them for comparison with those imported from foreign countries where good varieties are known to exist.

"Produce Photo"—The Government has issued its estimates of the crop for the year ending on 31st March 1938. The estimates are as follows: Cotton, 12,750 tons; Coffee, 1,318 tons; Cashew, 4,368 tons; Groundnuts, 19,780 tons; Sesame, 6,473 tons; Sorghum, 6,500 tons; Rice, 682 tons.

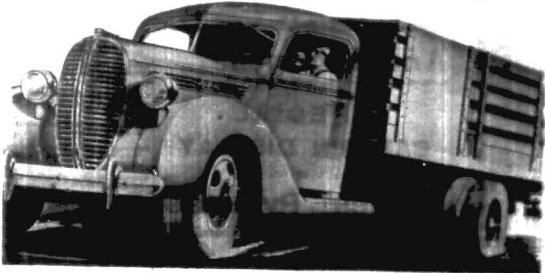

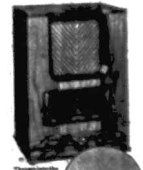

Woman Murdered Near A Seaside Holy Well

A platinum blonde in her early twenties was today found strangled and battered about the head by a beauty spot over-looking Folkestone.

The body was clothed, but the girl was without stockings or shoes. The afternoon Chief-Inspector Hurst, Chief of the Flying Squad, with a detective sergeant, left their headquarters at Folkestone. 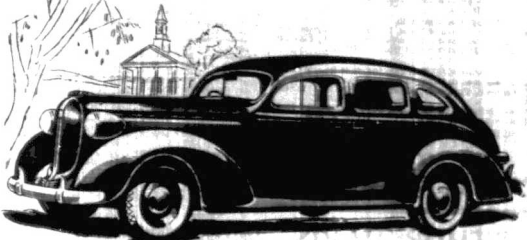

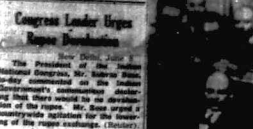
