MR. DAVID MARSHALL, Chief Minister of Singapore, and his Coalition Government resigned yesterday because of the failure of the Executive Council to vote on independence for the Colony. Mr. Marshall had previously advised the Executive Council to resign, but he had insisted that the Government should not resign until the Executive Council had voted on independence for the Colony. He has made no announcement about his future political plans.

MR. COULTS COMMENTS ON 'SERIOUS STEPS'

PLANS to import labour from Ruanda Urundi to meet the shortage of workers on Kenya's real and sugar plantations were announced in Legislative Council this week.

The Minister of Labour, Mr. W. F. Coult, said the scheme had been under consideration for the past two or three months. The time had come to take "rather serious steps" to avoid a fall in the levels of production. The move had been decided only after the most serious consideration, and in the first instance would be confined to one or two estates.

Official Members had prophesied that the move would be a failure resulting in unemployment, as mentioned on the front of Kenya, with a population of about 6,000,000 Africans, having to introduce workers from outside.

In an interview with the East African Standard, the Commissioner Mr. R. B. H. Jones said that the Government plan was to try to make local labour contractors in Ruanda Urundi, and to use them to supply labour to the plantations. This would be done on conditions attached to the importation of workers from outside.

The House ended its debate on the agricultural labour shortage for the current year. A vote of 25 to 17 was recorded in favour of the Government plan.

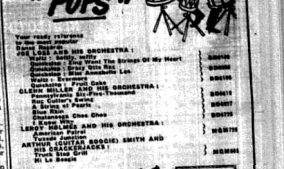

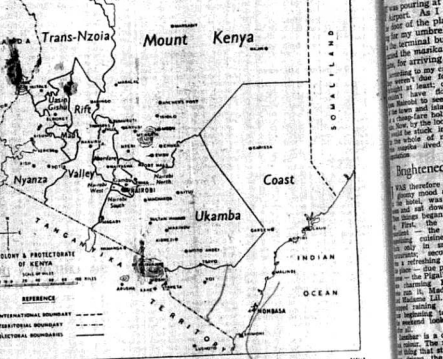

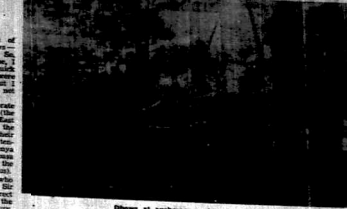

Mysteries Of Mars

By MANSON CLARKE

ASTRONOMERS throughout the world and particularly at Mount Palomar in America, where the world's largest telescope is housed, are making final preparations for the middle of this year, when they hope to conduct the most detailed investigation yet of the planet Mars.

For this year, Mars will come within 35,000 miles of the earth - the closest it can ever come. The planet makes its nearest approach at intervals of 15 months - the period of "opposition" - when the Sun, Mars and earth are in line with the earth in the middle. But owing to the pronounced eccentricity of Mars' orbit, it is only once in 15 years that the planet can come within 35,000 miles of the earth. The average distance at "opposition" is about 40,000 miles.

This year will be the first time that the exact position of the planet at Mount Palomar has been known to the centimeter, at such close range, and it is hoped that many mysteries surrounding the so-called "canals" on Mars will be solved.

It is at least three famous canals, and the way they have been linked with the theory of life on the planet, that so much controversy has raged in the past. It was in 1877 that the Italian astronomer Giovanni Schiaparelli announced the discovery of many fine dark, straight lines crossing the surface of Mars.

HE named them "canals." The late Professor Percival Lowell, a free-lance astronomer who founded the Flagstaff Observatory in Arizona, was so impressed by Schiaparelli's work that he spent 20 years trying to solve the mystery of them. He was convinced that the lines "canals" of Mars were irrigation ditches dug by a highly intelligent people, who were desperately trying to conserve the last traces of water before their planet was to be overtaken and torrid by the sun's ever-piercing rays of fire.

Since Lowell's death, in 1916, many arguments have been put forward to refute his theory. His opponents maintain that there are no lakes on Mars, and that very little oxygen on Mars, so that the idea of a human intelligent life on the planet is impossible.

They still believe in Lowell's theory, however, and have been to communicate with the "Martians" through radio stations planted far trees in Siberia in the form of a huge radio-gram, with a 15 miles long, hanging chain of kites. It is believed that the Martians would spot this obvious message, but the earth is so far, however, no corresponding messages have been observed on Mars.

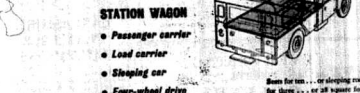
