







# Kenya Agriculture Bill in a few days

## SHORSTAGE OF STAFF IMPEDING LAND WORK

The awaited Agriculture Bill will be before Kenya's Parliament in a few days, said Mr. J. H. A. P. Smith, Minister of Agriculture, Animal Husbandry and Water Supply, yesterday.

He said the Bill would be introduced this week to approve the 1954/55 budget, which includes a programme of land improvement work.

The agricultural vote showed an increase of £2 million over the amount allocated to salaries. "I am glad to see something is being done in the development of agriculture," he said.

The biggest problem was the shortage of staff, he said, and had been called to help them out.

Mr. Smith said that the Agricultural Department had been unable to recruit a sufficient number of staff to meet the increased demand for services.

He said that the Ministry of Finance had agreed to increase the staff of the Land Settlement Department by 2,500 men.

It was drafted last year, but only partly completed, he said.

He said that the Bill would be introduced in the House of Commons on May 19.

Central Provincial Irrigation Committee members had been invited to attend the meeting.

Not quite satisfied

The Minister said he was not quite satisfied with the irrigation scheme at Mayaws, which had been proposed as a model for other areas.

In the original scheme it was intended to irrigate 1,000 acres of land, but the cost of the scheme was increased to 1,500 acres.

He said that the scheme had been delayed because of the lack of sufficient funds.

It had been decided to give the growth of the scheme a chance, and the existing staff had been given more time to complete the work.

Trade handled by the ports of East Africa has increased in value from £30 million to £40 million in the last ten years. Imports are now more than treble the pre-war average.

To serve this ever-growing volume of trade new harbours are being constructed, new berths built and port facilities improved.

At Kilindini, giant earth-moving machines are cutting back the surrounding cliffs to make space for new storage sheds. Millions of tons of earth and stone are being used to build a new lightering wharf and a new causeway connecting the island with the mainland, where future major extensions to the port will be sited. Two new deepwater berths are under construction and will be in operation next year. Plans for two more have already been drawn up.

All these new developments will increase by 50% the cargo-handling capacity of the port of Mombasa.



**SUDAN DUCK BIRDS**, which cause extensive crop damage in many parts of Africa, have been extensively breeding in a small area of the Lofjord in the Arusha District, Tanzania, in an attempt to deal with the swarms which may come through the West Kilimanjaro area.

The wheat crop again looks like being ruined by the Agricultural Research Department, which has taken steps with the spraying unit to deal with any infestation.

**Outside interest**

The experts gathered in the Northern Province to see if it is possible to remove the birds from the area, and the Minister of Agriculture has now decided to make a new contract with the Agricultural Research Department to deal with the infestation.

In a fortnight, agricultural experts will be sent to the Lofjord area, 100 miles from Arusha, and by building the tanks, it is estimated that some 200 tons of seed will be available for all farmers in the Province.



## Shape of Things

To Come

SATURDAY JUNE 12 1954

It is an interesting, encouraging and a constructive year for the future of Kenya. In all the positions of State of Emergency, and the Government and people are engaged in a series of important decisions and movements around the African population, time and opportunity have been sought and are increasing for the study and solution of the problems which arise from the tremendous task of a new society in East Africa. It would be wrong to deny that the nature of the evil forces in Kenya and Mau Mau has not had a stimulating influence on thought and public policy; but it would be no service to suppose that Mau Mau is the sole cause of these impulses. The fact is, of course, that the task of building a new and better society was started by the first European explorer, missionary, engineer, officer of Government, settler and navigator of the emerging Territories. It has been going on for half a century in Kenya in Tanganyika and Uganda.

But important decisions which have a direct bearing on the shape of the new society which is to be made appear this week. Coming at a time when the phase of violence of Mau Mau has passed into a quieter period and defeat is now nearer at hand, these decisions give added emphasis to the future and the requirements and aims.

The thought-provoking report of Dr. C. G. Cowdery entitled "The Psychology of Mau Mau" raises long-range questions of the security of the people of Kenya in their relations, which are of personal concern to every member of the community of Kenya.

The report and the conclusions are especially of consequence in the field of African education in the widest sense of the word.

Though there may not be many revolutionary ideas presented and though some will already find a place in the report, the report deserves and will be given close consideration by the Government of the Colony.

The final chapter of the Cowdery Report will be more familiar ground but a study of the mind of the African and the proposals concerning his welfare will be well-being are most obviously complementary that their requirements can be met by the same methods which must go hand-in-hand.

It is even more apparent in the case of the Colony that there Report that most of the proposals which are advanced have already been made and that the principles on which the latter are based are widely accepted.

Together the two reports—the Cowdery Report and the Scheme for agricultural development provide a framework within which much more work, and, we hope, more effective policies can be formulated and programmes planned. The net effect will be a very great improvement in the social structure which has been under construction for several decades on the broad lines of the best traditions of civilisation the British people brought to Kenya when they chose the Colony as their home, and the system of government and the way of life in it, their greatest contribution to the future of the African people.
