"Settlement" Reached in Spain? Say Rome Reports

COMMONS DEBATE FIRST

ON OR ABOUT NOVEMBER 15, THE BRITISH AND ITALIAN GOVERNMENTS WILL BRING INTO FORCE THE AGREEMENT WHICH THEY RECENTLY SIGNED, AND THE ENFORCEMENT OF WHICH THEY AGREED TO DEFER UNTIL A "SETTLEMENT OF THE SPANISH PROBLEM" WAS REACHED.

Reports to this effect were current in Rome yesterday, but it was pointed out in London that the bringing into force of the agreement would have to be debated in Parliament first. This will be possible in the ordinary way, as Parliament meets before that date.

There was no definition of "settlement" in relation to Spain, except that the agreement no longer constitute a menace to European peace, and it is thought in Rome that the withdrawal of 10,000 Italian, even though it leaves many legionaries and airmen behind, constitutes the "settlement" desired.

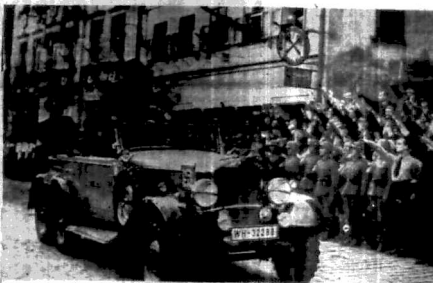



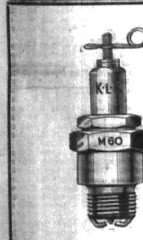
