PLAN FOR GERMAN POLISH ACTS AGAINST RUSSIA

King Visits R. A. F.
MEDALS FOR GALLANTY

The Polish Foreign Minister has revealed that in March last year Ribbentrop approached the Polish Ambassador in Berlin with a plan for German-Polish collaboration against Russia.

The revelation is made in this morning's Petit Parisien where he is quoted as saying that "since von Ribbentrop has been indulging in reminiscences we too may have something interesting to recall."

The article also stated that a plan was put forward by von Ribbentrop in October last year in which Germany and Poland were to collaborate in seizing colonies. This suggestion was made to the Polish Ambassador in Berlin during the discussions on Danzig and the Corridor.

Poland rejected both proposals but put forward other methods for settling the Polish-German differences.

The revelation made by the Polish Foreign Minister throws a startling light on some of Hitler's own previous references to Poland.

To Make Room For Germans

In the town of Katowice, Poland, the Poles were driven from their homes by German soldiers to make room for the incoming German population.

2 German Planes Brought Down

There is now very little doubt that the legislation proposed for the raising of the arms embargo will be passed in Washington today.

This means that the Allies will be able to buy arms and munitions from the United States, providing they pay for them first and transport them in their own ships.

Germany of course has a similar right but will hardly be able to exercise it.

President Roosevelt is now with a visit of victory in his long fight against the repeal of the Arms Embargo.

In Washington yesterday the House of Representatives voted that when its delegates discuss the final form of the Neutrality Bill with the delegates from the Senate, they should insist upon the retention of the Arms Embargo.

The German Peace Division, in a broadcast last night, declared: "There is no family in Germany which wants the continuation of this war. Hitler must clear the way for peace."

FOOD RATIONING LEADS TO SPECULATION Points in the Scheme Which Operates in Britain This Month

With the prospect of food rationing beginning in Britain this month, all sorts of questions, serious and not so serious, have been raised regarding the working out of the regulations. Most of the more important points have been put forward by restaurant proprietors.

As the East African Standard's London Correspondent mentions below, the rationing scheme will no doubt be subject to revision or modification according to practical requirements.

London, October 28. (Standard's Correspondent.) The immediate effect of the new food law will be to confine to a limited number of articles the staple foodstuffs which are available in unlimited quantities, mostly from the home production, and to ration the definite articles that are not so plentiful. These include: wheat, flour, sugar, margarine, butter and margarine, and other foodstuffs which are not produced in the home.

In a similar way, most of the big, staple foodstuffs will be rationed, and the small quantities of these goods will be distributed by ration books. The rationing scheme will be subject to revision or modification according to practical requirements.

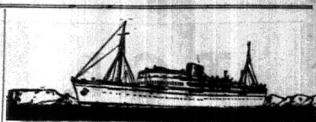

I am glad to see that Government now considers that the subject is worthy of attention.

I therefore would suggest that Government should consider the augmentation of the Committee by representatives of both the European and Indian tenants, with particular relation to the rents charged to the smaller shopkeepers.

There is authoritative knowledge already that in some cases rents have been appreciated and I think with you that the general public will require further information as to the procedure to be adopted and augmentation of the numbers of the Committee.

BIG TOYS FOR Britain and France To Buy At Agreed Prices

The United Kingdom and France, it was officially announced yesterday, will require considerable quantities of East African steel at prices which are described as very satisfactory.

The Information Committee's committee mentions that the total purchases by Britain and France over one year are likely to amount to more than half East Africa's yearly production of 130,000 tons.

It is officially announced that the following committee has been convened by the Press in London: The Steel Growers' Association, the Ministry of Supply, the Colonial Office and the Governments of Tanganyika, Kenya, Uganda for supplies of East African steel to be available for United Kingdom and France.

The usual trade purchase through the steel exchange of the following steel items which are not for export is as follows: 425 for No. 1 steel per ton United Kingdom steel.

231/75 for No. 2 steel. 225 for No. 3 steel. The price includes freight and insurance over the sea, but neither up or export tonnage freight and insurance costs will be levied on exports.

It is anticipated that the quantities required will be considerably in excess of normal output of East Africa steel to the United Kingdom and France. The total purchases over one year are likely to amount to more than half the total East African production of 130,000 tons.

The steel industry is a new development established since the outbreak of war. The Honourable Sir G. G. Harcourt, who is Controller of the Executive Council, Tanganyika, has been appointed Deputy Controller of East Africa. To this he has been appointed Deputy Controller for Kenya and Uganda.

Mr. H. C. Harcourt yesterday, Mr. C. Harcourt expressed the opinion that the reinforcement of the steel industry is a very satisfactory one for the East African steel industry. It will be a great boon for that portion of the steel industry which has been benefited by the increase in demand for steel by Britain and France.

Question In The House

The difficulty of British spinners in terms of purchases of steel was referred to in a question in the House of Commons.

Mr. B. H. Linnell asked the Minister of Supply whether he is aware that since the outbreak of the war in September, 1939, it has been impossible for British spinners to buy the quantities of steel which they require for spinning and obtaining their full capacity.

Mr. B. H. Linnell stated a startling warning about two inches long but which was the result of a mistake. He said that he is not aware that there has been interference with the production of goods into which there has been a restriction on the quantity of steel which is available.

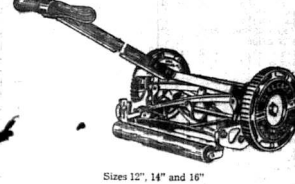

Anna Neagle As Nurse Cavell

"STANBAM" commentary: "Herbert Wilcox has produced his latest Hollywood film in 'Nurse Cavell' which is a notable film in which overstatement and interest are avoided. We see her naturally and inevitably the various scenes of her life. Registration and Raising

"STANBAM" commentary: "I recently wrote in the Standard, London, Oct. 20, General to find out what the exact position is of British subjects returning to England from overseas in regard to national registration and food rationing and in reply I now received the following official statement:

Citizens returning to the United Kingdom should be registered by the National Registration Office of the area in which they propose to take up their permanent residence, who will issue the certificate of the local Council of an all police station.

In the case of a family coming home together, it will only be necessary for one person to present the separate 'R' forms for the various members of the family; but will be the duty of the persons presenting the forms to hold the card of any child who is in his or her charge and to deliver other cards to the person to whom they respectively belong.

If food rationing has not been introduced at the time of the issue of the identity card the ration book will be forwarded by post to the address given on the 'R' form; and if rationing has been introduced the person presenting the form will be referred to the Food Executive Office (who will often be found in the same building) for the issue of the ration book.
