NAZI LEADERS ON ART IN WARTIME

Depressing Speeches On Optimism

November 28.
Dr. Goebbels, the German Minister of Propaganda, and Dr. Goebbels, the German Labour Minister, both made speeches yesterday at the annual meeting of the German Chamber of Culture. They discussed art in war time.

"War," said Dr. Goebbels, "has brought in numerous fresh arrows, but it is only natural that these arrows as they are so new and so heavy."

U. S. SYMPATHY FOR ALLIES

OFFER OF MEDICAL SUPPLIES

November 28.
A magnificent offer of medical supplies for Britain and France has come from the United States and is expected to be shipped to this country this morning.

Two new corporations have been formed in the United States to enable Americans to contribute towards the relief of suffering caused by the war in Britain and France and, as a beginning, it is hoped to raise a fund of £100,000.

The Times says this morning "from the hearts and minds of countless Americans a strong tide of sympathy is flowing to Britain and France."

The editorial concludes by saying that in both these countries today innumerable hearts will be cheered by this first great piece of good news. (Reuter.)

NAZI TERROR IN POLAND

November 28.
More evidence of the brutal methods adopted in the German-occupied area of Poland is given in a communication issued by the Polish Information Committee in Paris.

This says that the German Ambassador in Warsaw and sent him to a concentration camp. Reports received through various sources later indicated that he had been executed.

Other instances of Nazi terrorism which have been reported from Poland show that before a crowd of their Polish men before a crowd of their men to watch the execution, and the execution of 134 college youths at Siedlce.

A Prisoner In Germany

COLONEL BUTT'S REMINISCENCES

The large dining-room of the Nakuru Hotel was crowded last Friday evening when Colonel T. B. Butt, of the King's Own Yorkshire Light Infantry, gave his lecture on "Hind and the Slavdom." Students from the School of Instruction were there in full strength, and mentions of the general public had gladly availed themselves of the invitation to attend. Last-mentioned could only get places by the doors and windows of the adjoining lounge. Brigadier General A.C. Lewis, the Commandant of the School, was in the chair, and introduced Colonel Butt.

The lecture began with a brief explanation of the purpose which was to make known to all hearers the kind of enemy we are fighting and the fate of individuals, homes and countries should we fall into German hands. Colonel Butt went on to say that he had met and interviewed German soldiers during his experiences as a prisoner of war, and that he never gave his lecture without reference to these three—captain of the Chinese, a police-sergeant, and His Highness Prince Max of Baden. The last eventually arranged for him to be sent to Switzerland.

Butt, then, proceeded to the early days of the last war. Lieutenant Butt and another young officer, both severely wounded, were sent first to a French religious house, where they received attention from a food doctor, but for the whole of their stay in the hospital they were served with soup and food which was so unpalatable that it was held woman who, at considerable risk to herself, managed to bring them enough to live on. Moved to Cambrai, again no rations were provided for them, but a French girl fed them with a composition of bread soaked in jam, and later, unexpectantly, suffered for her humanity. Before long he and the companion were sent back to Germany, and on this journey an incident occurred which provided an interesting example of popular German temperament.

Left Out In The Rain

While some eighty officers and men, all wounded, waited at the station in the rain, the British ambulance came on. Orders were immediately given to carry the stretcher cases—and leave them in the rain. The storm continued for about forty minutes, and, so soon as it ended, the stretchers were all carried in again. The train comprised the usual cattle and horse trucks—"Hornes all, Charvax 8"—and the prisoners were crowded in.

Lieutenant Butt, however, and his friend had half a large hamstruck to themselves, the other half being occupied by nine German soldiers. The truck had recently been used for transporting horses and one end had been closed, the rest was indeed deep in fresh mud, but home-coming, deposited, and though the Germans showed a sympathetic attitude towards them, there was nothing they could do to help.

At one station the truck doors were thrown open and crowds of people thronged to the train beginning to move. They were unable to stand up. This was ordered to stand up. This was ordered to stand up. This was ordered to stand up.

Another strange episode which takes place before the train is formed by a German doctor that his leg must be amputated. He heard late that unnecessary amputations were recommended and sometimes carried out, in order to give prizes to young German doctors. He pleaded the surgeon to let him live, but was warned that his leg would never recover if a statement be demonstrated to be untrue.

On several occasions, women, sometimes actually members of the German Red Cross Society, offered food and water to hungry, wounded men, and, when the offer was accepted, poured the water on the ground and threw the food out of reach, saying these were not for English swine.

The strange case of humour proposed by the Germans was further illustrated by the distribution of Christmas cards in September, every British prisoner when he arrived in Cologne. These cards were very well-printed and showed a dilapidated English soldier in a trench coat. They bore an inscription, "Whichever you may prefer Christmas when it comes. Made in Germany, 1914."

Bitter Feeling

Feeling against the British was extremely bitter, far more so than against the French. The British were hated. The former were looked upon as natural enemies, and treated as such. One joke was to form groups in which the British were quite outnumbered. There were three Frenchmen, five Russians and two British, and to take votes on such subjects as how the food should be prepared. "That is Russian, isn't it?" "Well, know the question was asked, "Which is the better food (meat)?" The Russians gave a majority reply that they liked it raw, to have a week the main food there was raw fish.

Colonel Butt varied stories of almost unbelievable cruelty with light anecdotes of his own and his friends' experiences, such as the ingenious escape of a prisoner planning to escape who was ordered to divert the guard who watched him through a spoke in the door. He contrived the small figure of a somewhat scarily dressed lady, who contrived in front of the spy-hole and was set in motion by a current of air. When the door was opened, the little lady disappeared, and so great was the interest she aroused that at least the Commandant came along to enquire into the matter.

Though at times Colonel Butt spoke very strongly of the suffering he had been inflicted on helpless men, he was not driven to rant out bitterness, and was a straightforward account of actual experiences.

Finally he appealed to the students in the audience, telling them always to bear in mind that they are free to become editors of some of the finest fighting forces in the world, and to do their best, they will never let them down.

Finest Englishmen, speaking an atmosphere of strained attention, testified to the appreciation of a very fine address, one that will be remembered by everybody who heard it.

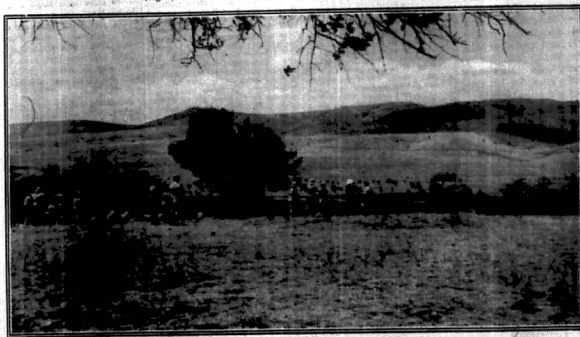

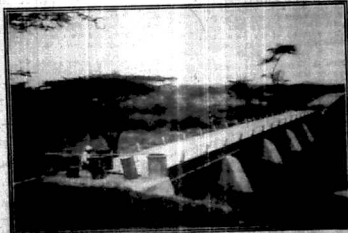

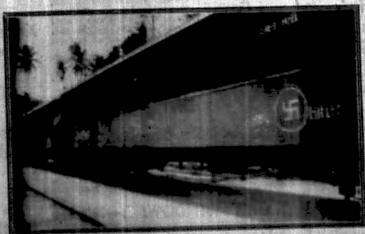

KABAKA OF UGANDA

Many thousands attended the funeral of the late Kabaka of Uganda, which took place today.

The service was conducted at Namirembe Cathedral by the Bishop of Uganda, and among those present was His Excellency the Governor.

Officers' Training School

Cadets' Course At Nakuru

[BY A CORRESPONDENT]

Cadets of the Officers' Training School at Nakuru, are at present undergoing a three months course, which will be concluded on February 2. The course is divided into three military courses and the lectures given by Lt.-Col. T. R. Bull and the other officers of the school. The director chose the whole course to be of modern warfare—the course is by no means entirely technical as in the training received by military.

Although it is difficult to disentangle the line of the students from a description of the course, the reasons of space I have endeavored to do so and the present article will deal primarily with the second of these subjects.

The course is divided into two parts—the second and third months which are spent on outdoor work, and the first month during which instruction takes place for the most part indoors. Every morning from 8 a.m. to 10 a.m. cadets attend a lecture given by the instructor. This lecture may deal with such subjects as tactics, signalling, air cooperation, machine gun, tank, and mountain warfare or with rather more general subjects such as the duties of "Q" department.

If they wished to do nothing they would be in a position to do so, and the fact that they work and work hard, speaks well for their keenness and self-discipline.

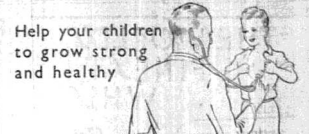

Time which can be given to more important things is not wasted upon unimportant and like manual tasks. Plain clothes may be worn for games and for the evening lecture.

Leaves are not placed out of date. Leave is obtainable two or three times a week. Weekend leave is given from 1 p.m. onwards on Saturday. One personal boy is provided for every 100 boys.

The food is good. There is plenty of it and an assurance obtainable and firmly that there is no shortage of eggs.

The dormitories are adequately spacious. I spent a good deal of time taking and re-taking photographs in poor light to prove that there is ample space for dressing between the beds.

42 Guns Salute
