CYPRUS SEEKS U.N. ACTION

British troops patrol city battle area

40-minute shifta raid

WHILE British troops yesterday left their Cyprus bases to patrol the battle areas around Nicosia, under Wednesday's cease-fire agreement, Cyprus representatives at the United Nations accused Turkey of aggression and asked the Security Council to halt the conflict.

The Chief Cyprus delegate, Mr. Zenon Rossaid, in a letter requesting a council meeting, urged that "aggressive actions" by Turkish military units had resulted in clashes with Greek troops in quarters in Nicosia and threatening consequences of international scope.

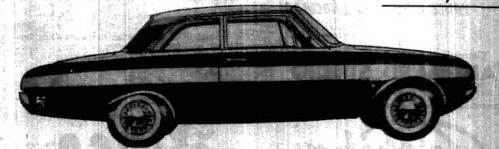
