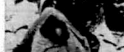

Customs show 'keen interest' in new cargo system

The East African Customs and Excise Department and the Kenya Customs and Excise Services Ltd., Mombasa, had expressed their keen interest in a new cargo system and would do everything possible to ensure speedy movements through Kilindini Harbour.

The managing director of the Kenya Transport Company Ltd., Mr. J. L. Ruben, said last night when attending the general meeting of the Kenya National Chamber of Commerce and Industry in this connection. He said that he was glad to see the Kenya Government and industry officials in Embayo House, Nairobi.

He enumerated the advantages of container shipping, and said that the benefits of container shipping in loading and discharging, fewer rats, making and a saving in ports, automatic time, reduced shipping to find employment for men, and the possibility of loading marks and containers to bonding certificates, but Customs have the right to examine containers at the quay for insurance purposes.

Austrians round up Czech spies

Austrian police have arrested two men on charges of spying for Czechoslovakia in what may be the beginning of a roundup of Czechoslovak agents in Austria.

A Czechoslovak Sofia newspaper, who fled to the west after the Soviet occupation of Prague, reported that a list of agents in Austria for an organisation was in the United States, according to the newspaper's account.

The newspaper said the list for the U.S. shortly before the first two arrests were made, although East Munich police picked up an army corporal on espionage charges.

Police praised after London march

A chorus of praise for London's police arose yesterday from the British Press in its comments on the big anti-nuclear demonstration.

Most of the marches were pretty good, but the most successful was the final march, headed by the mass-organisation Daily March.

A total of 38 persons were injured, including eight policemen, and 20 arrested during the demonstration, which had been held by extensive Press predictions of revolutionary violence from the marchers.

The Times (Independent) commented: "The discipline and politeness of the policemen in the front row were beyond praise." adding: "The principal organisers of the march were true to their undertakings to avoid a clash."

The conditions for revolutionary violence, the Times said, "do not exist in London" (those who are deluded into believing that the conditions do exist are "unusually ignorant").

The Guardian (Liberal) said: "The Metropolitan Police gave an example to the world in calmness and control."

The Conservative Daily Telegraph echoed the catch-phrase of the U.S. Presidential candidate, Mr. George Wallace, in the headline: "A triumph for law and order."

The Right-wing Daily Mail and Daily Express attacked the "provocateurs" against police committed by a majority of demonstrators in front of the United States Embassy in Grosvenor Square.

The Daily Mail contrasted the lack of the police with the "passivity with which policemen

have met demonstrators in Paris, Berlin and Chicago".

The demonstration started off after hardly any violence and only a few arrests.

The demonstration, which embraced a wide range of Leftist groups, had been predicted by the figures at 1000 or half the number that had been predicted.

The principal speaker of violence was seen as a big triumph for the Government, said the Home Secretary, Mr. Callaghan, who stressed that it was the British Government's policy to remain neutral unless and to respond to any provocation by demonstrators and to follow a general policy of passive resistance.

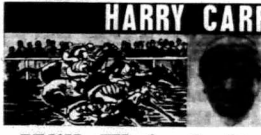

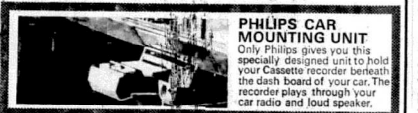

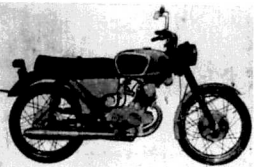

Critical attention has recently been directed to the continued closure of the Suez Canal causing adverse effects to the East African economy. Now, says the additional budget of £10 million per cent increase in freight rates to be imposed from the February 1969, will be borne by shipping companies which are members of the East African Conference Lines.

As a 15 per cent surcharge has already been imposed and closure of the canal will now slow East African goods imports and exports by 25 per cent increase in freight rates, it will be borne by shipping companies which are members of the East African Conference Lines.

In a comment last Friday, it was pointed out that the surcharge would be applied in full to goods because the canal has remained closed for 16 months since the June War between Israel and the U.A.R. Employment is being caused by retrenchments in the motor and engineering industries. The E.A.O. has been informed that Kenya is "suffering from the effects" of the Uganda export markets in meat and agricultural products. Uganda and Tanzania, also, are seriously affected.

The U.A.R. canvassed support during the war from African nations on account of its National membership of the O.A.U. Now is the time to review the process. Since correspondents have proposed that the East African Governments should ask the U.A.R. if the U.N. is powerless in the matter, to get the canal reopened in view of the damage being caused to developing countries, allegedly requiring foreign currencies, it is a situation where only the goods of South Africa and the Portuguese African colonies benefit from the Cape detour in shipping routes to and from Europe.

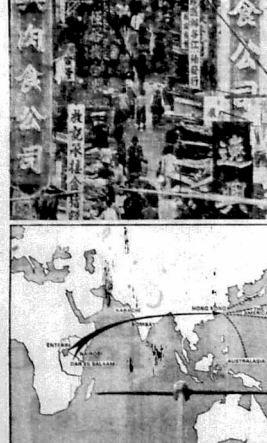

Mr. Johnson's act of faith

President Johnson's unilateral decision to stop the bombing of North Vietnam may not mean an end to the increasingly wasteful war in Vietnam, but it does mean the process of reaching a settlement which has brought consequences for North and South Vietnam, and increase the chances of agreement at the extended peace talks, expected in Paris.

Only the new developments have the timing of the bombing halt a few days before Americans flock to the polls to choose their next President. It is coincidental. Although Mr. Hubert Humpfrey, who is Mr. Johnson's Vice President, has failed to succeed him in the White House, he has studiously avoided any attempt to make political capital out of the decision to halt the bombing.

But if the timing was coincidental, the fact that the bombing halt has been the result of a carefully considered change of policy rather than an election play, and can be expected to prove permanent, Mr. Humpfrey, it elected a committee to study the possibility of "re-examination" of the war. Mr. Nixon is much more of a hawk, but in office is likely to find practical politics demand a Vietnam settlement.

An end to the bombing was long overdue. Whatever U.S. military commanders may say, the colossal bombardment of the north more harm to America's world image and to its cause in Asia than it has to the North Vietnamese, whose fighting potential and morale have not been greatly impaired.

After innumerable precedents that a bombing halt might be accompanied by a reciprocal posture from Hanoi, President Johnson finally dropped this demand and accepted the prospect.

There must be an early response to this act of faith from the North Vietnamese, if the bombing halt is to mean more than a mere respite. First reactions from Hanoi in Mr. Johnson's favour were not encouraging. President Ho Chi Minh said that it was "only the initial victory" that the rebel Vietcong and United Front Committee were to continue to "resisting" the "offensive" to be conducted by the regular North Vietnamese army. Paradoxically, the official Communist daily

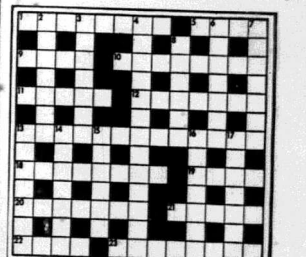
