Mystery group starts fight in Jordan capital

Fighting flared in Jordan's capital of Amman yesterday as troops loyal to King Hussein clashed with armed members of a mystery group calling itself the "Phalanges of Victory".

An official statement said members of the group, which it said, claimed to be one of the Palestinian command groups—fired on Government forces and used loudspeakers to "incite citizens to demonstrate and spread chaos."

A crowd of about 100,000 gathered in the city and King Hussein, the commander-in-chief of the armed forces, ordered the military to surround the city and to use force to suppress the riotous demonstration. He pledged that his Government would not use force against the demonstrators and would restore the situation to normal.

King Hussein has had trouble in recent months with Palestinian demands for more freedom of movement for their families, a law for public affairs and the right to work in the West Bank, and the right to work in the Jordan River. He has been unsuccessful in these demands.

Mr. Mungai said that perhaps Mr. Odiga had been thinking of the Warsaw Pact countries and what had happened to a small country a few weeks ago. He assured Mr. Odiga and the House that nothing of the sort would happen in Kenya.

The Minister was speaking in reply to the debate on the Second Reading of the Armed Forces Bill.

Another appalling road accident occurred during the weekend on the Mt. Kenia-Kiunga road near the Mbitani Market. Here a bus and taxi were involved in a collision. Four people were killed instantly, many others injured and a lot of property was damaged. The bus was carrying about 60 passengers as a result of the impact.

This road is one of the blackest spots if not the blackest in Kenya. According to the police, there have been 45 fatalities in the Western Province, and another 40 serious accidents this year. Why will it down this road in Kenya's history for all this morning's tragedy of death and maiming? Has it been thought of by the A.A. of E.A. and police and the inter-ministerial vehicle inspection operations which have been conducted?

What can check the public's casual attitude of the road and the need for personal care? When is the carriage guard to stop?

No country in the world can report a clean sheet for road accidents having become a daily danger in modern life.

Why is there so much delay over forming a Road Safety Council? Such a society, led by a small full-time staff but functioning mainly on voluntary labour, could mobilise the help of all the public by means of a concerted publicity drive.

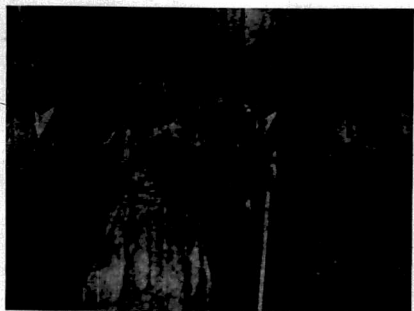

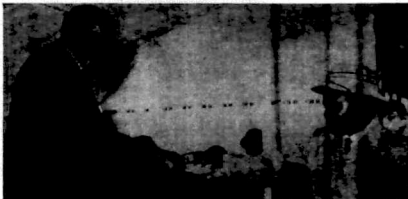

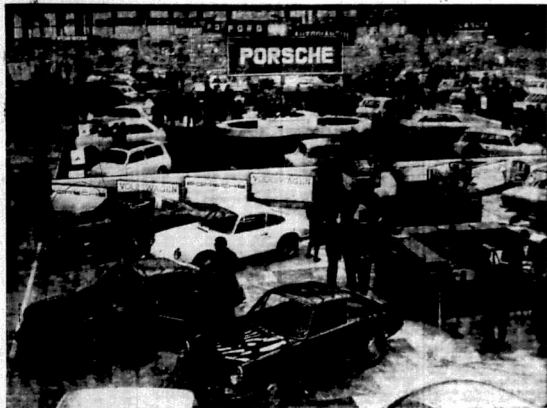

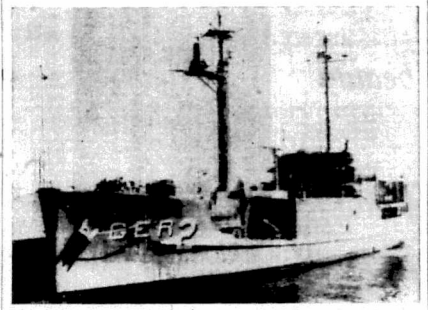
Problem of captured U.S. Navy spy-ship awaits new President

For over ten months now the U.S. Pueblo — the spy ship which almost plunged the world into yet another war — has lain quietly and apparently forgotten in the Women's Harbor, North Korea. She was seized in a daring mid-ocean maneuver which hit the headlines all around the world, and caused the American Government and many other governments to take a long and hard look at the problem of the spy ship. It is now up to the new President to decide what to do with the ship.

While the U.S. Navy's intelligence ship Pueblo sits quietly and apparently forgotten in the North Korea harbor of Women there is a growing suspicion in America that Government officials are waiting for the new Administration to take over and take up the problem. G. R. LANE reports

But the Pueblo maintained her course. At about 10:30 a.m. on Nov. 23, North Korea vessels came to the scene and surrounded the Pueblo. They took up positions on the American bow, beam and quarter and their two MiG fighters appeared and began circling off the Pueblo's starboard beam. It was then said the Koreans showed intentions of boarding the Pueblo that Uncle Busher refused

to allow and that she had been requested to return into Women's Harbor. The last message she sent was: "We have been surrounded by enemy planes and are now going off the air." Washington — It has been behind Korean time — the news arrived about 10:30 a.m. that a White House aide Mr. Walter Rostow, was convinced that the situation was serious enough to call the President.

The charges are that, at the very least, there are other U.S. spy ships operating along the coast of every country in the world that would be involved in a war. Other than are more than one and the Russians have been known to concentrate as many as 50 spy ships — one officially classed as "detection trawler" — on one area — say, off the Americas.

In fact, in the First World War in the Pacific, the U.S. Navy had a fleet of the intelligence vessel U.S.S. Liberty and kind vessels. It was an error and the Israeli paid compensation.

The last now in the U.S. is that any one of these could find itself in a similar predicament on the black day last January. She was in the Sea of Japan, 20 miles off the inshore, headland of North Korea, attending to her "normal duties as an oceanographic surveyer." WOMEN'S WORLD

A beginner's guide to floral display

Hidden away at the back of the programme of the successful floral exhibition of the Kenya Floral Arrangement Club, I found some useful hints on flower arranging which I have "borrowed" for the sake of readers intrigued by this art.

Flower arrangements are designed for the particular position in which they are to stand, so choose your flowers to suit your container, remembering where the arrangement is to be placed so that everything is in harmony.

Have some definite design or shape in mind before you start.

Remember to condition your flowers before arranging — the flowers are brought, cut a little off each stem and placed in deep water for several hours before arranging. Remember also that foliage needs conditioning as well as flowers.

Make sure before starting an arrangement that your mechanics (spade, chicken wire, etc.) are firmly fixed or disaster may follow! Time spent on wiring correctly is never wasted.

Remember that in modern arrangements there is depth as well as height and width. Some flowers are brought forward and others placed further back to give a three-dimensional effect.

Use your fine-pointed flowers and foliage, and both, for the outside of your arrangement with the ball-flowers and larger flowers and leaves towards the middle and base.

As a general rule put the lighter colours to the outside and darker ones towards the base. This will make your arrangement well balanced.

As a rough guide your tallest stem should be no less than 1 1/2 times the greatest measurement of your container above the rim.

Your focal point, or centre of interest, is also your centre of balance and should be directly in front of the tallest stem.

Voting for the election of the U.S. President is indirect, taking place through an electoral college. To win a candidate needs 270 out of the 538 electoral college votes.

Because of Mr. Wallace's intervention from the right, Mr. Nixon could possibly gain an electoral college majority through polling fewer popular votes in the country than Mr. Humphrey. The third man stands the chance himself, but his own diary, on polling day, was that it was too late to answer the New York Post poll which a final public opinion poll given by Mr. Humphrey could tip the scales, since uncommitted voters, notoriously want to swim with the tide.

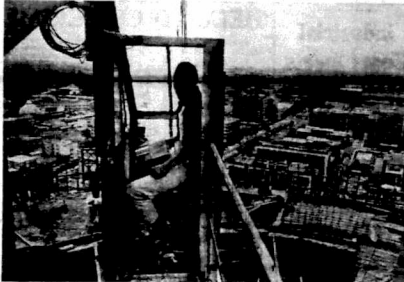

The Vice-President, Mr. Moi, today a meeting of the Christian Housing Fellowship at the All Saints' Cathedral, Nairobi, on Monday night that the Government recognizes the problem faced by young people studying in Nairobi in securing suitable accommodation.

Mr. Moi disclosed that in 1966 he, with a number of other African officials, initiated a series of discussions on the problem of young people under 30 years of age. He said that the group had been most helpful in this regard and that the Government was now working to meet the requirement of the students and young workers by reducing the proposed hostel expenses to a level repayable from fees paid by pupils. This is the only source of income.

The Christian Housing Fellowship aims at raising the total capital cost of each hostel at the outset thus meeting the recurrent cost entirely from current revenue.

In considering the difficulties which pupils might face in paying the suggested small fees as well as a donation of clothing from the voluntary committee, he suggested the provision of hostels by the Government. He said that the Christian Housing Fellowship had similar concerns about the problem of accom-

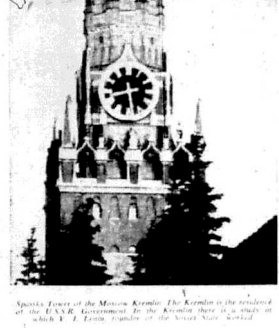
