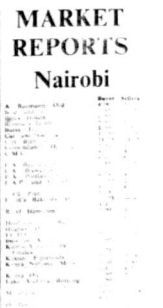

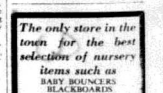

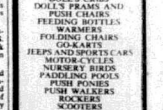

'50-50 chance of Rhodesia agreement'

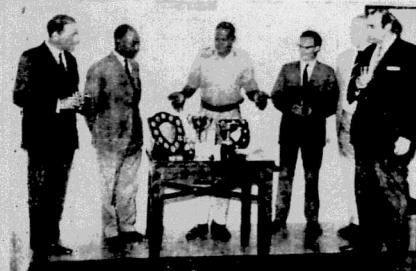

Munich starts on 1972 Games

With Kenya hoping to apply for the 1974 Olympic Games to be staged in Nairobi, this article describes the mammoth task being undertaken for the 1972 Games in Munich at an estimated cost of £100,000,000.

As the first step towards the Munich 1972 Olympic Games, the Munich Olympic Stadium has been opened for the first time since 1936.

The stadium, which is the largest in the world, has a seating capacity of 75,000. It is situated on the edge of the city, and is surrounded by a park.

The stadium will be used for the opening and closing ceremonies, and for the football, basketball, volleyball, and handball matches.

The stadium will also be used for the 1972 Summer Paralympic Games, which will be held from September 6 to 17.

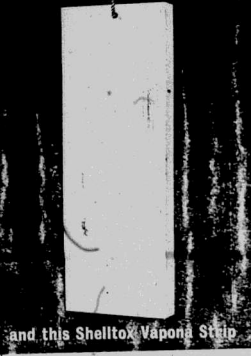

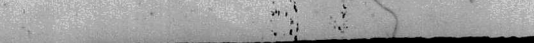
