## Arab walk-out signals failure of peace talks

**Egypt and Jordan have withdrawn from M.A.D. Nations negotiations aimed at ending the Middle East conflict, signalling apparent failure of the effort.**

The Egyptian Foreign Minister, Mr. Mahmoud Muftah Radhi, left New York by air for Cairo yesterday morning. Mr. Nasser and Jordan's Foreign Minister, Mr. Abdul Monem Rifaat, cut short his stay and flew back to Amman.

### Salisbury meeting 'most decisive yet'

Britain and Rhodesia negotiations went into a crucial fourth plenary session yesterday, which could decide the fate of the Rhodesian independence talks to break the Rhodesian impasse.

The meeting between teams headed by Sir John Smith, the British Minister of State for Rhodesia, and Mr. George Wimereux, political observer in Salisbury as part of the Commonwealth Commission.

Opinion was gathering ground that while there was still no hope of a breakthrough, the Rhodesians agreed to agree to their full demands. Mr. Thompson's team would not accept any deal on the current Rhodesian situation.

### Soviet soldiers 'seek asylum'

# Mr. Nixon rules out Vietnam intervention

The American President, Mr. Richard Nixon, who is in a brief holiday with his personal staff at a Florida resort resort of Key Biscayne, has firmly ruled out any permanent intervention in the internal Vietnam peace negotiations unless President Johnson expresses wishes.

The American candidate in last Tuesday's election is concentrating instead on grappling with the problems of replacing the present Democratic Government and forming his own Cabinet, which possibly will contain one or two members of the Johnson team. He is likely to return to his New York home on Monday and take office on January 20.

Mr. Nixon and his wife Pat are

staying at the home of Sen. George Smathers, the Florida Democrat who is retiring at the end of this year. Last night, Tricia, 22, and John, 19, had their first meeting with Mr. Nixon, who is expected to make key decisions by the same way as President Johnson had his Texas ranch.

## Delta post under heavy Vietcong fire

Vietcong forces have continued to harass the Delta post, the South Vietnamese military base, for the past 24 hours. Albeit sporadic, such attacks have been frequent.

The heaviest assault was a two-hour mortar attack on Tuesday, reported to have forced a company of US marines to leave a few miles away from the post just below the demarcation zone.

A US observation aircraft spotted a hand-to-hand fight. Seven men made rockets about a mile and a half from the post. They returned the fire, causing six wounded. Two US marines were captured by Vietcong, while suffering no losses themselves. Ten Vietcong were killed in the course of a twoday battle between the two sides south of Da Nang, Nine Vietnamese.

North Vietnamese delegation to the peace talks in Paris will hold a meeting on Friday morning to discuss the big victory.

A North Vietnamese spokesman said the reception was also to mark the 20th anniversary of the National Front delegation (political arm of the Vietcong), for the talks.

The leader of the South Vietnamese delegation to the Paris peace talks, Mr. Le Duc Tho, yesterday told a press conference that the Vietcong would be "very welcome" if he could be visited after taking up his post.



KEN MacKenzie's century on the second day of the match between the visiting West Indies and South Africa at Adelaide Oval, Monday, 24 June, proved to be the turning point in the South African tour which has been a disaster so far.

England, with 191 runs on Test debut, had been leading after MacKenzie had taken a catch off a long hop from a fast bowler. South Africa had lost 10 wickets and Australian bowlers had a dramatic practical lesson in the West Indies and England's speed.

Bob Matravers and Chapman, who had

read the team sheet before the match began, were asked to do so again after the West Indies' 100. Matravers, though a good batsman, had not been playing much cricket since his days at school, while Chapman was a schoolboy who had not even seen a ball bowled by a professional.

Matravers' century, which was the first of his career, was the result of a single shot from a West Indian bowler.

MacKenzie had been dropped by the West Indies on the third day of the tour.

In the matinee session on Tuesday, Matravers had a record for an eighth-wicket stand of 146 with Wally Bishop.

The previous record of 145 was held by D. R. J. De Britto and W. A. Bradman three years ago at Brisbane.

MacKenzie was the last man standing on the South African boundary. Seven South African batsmen had been dismissed.

A further match record was set by Matravers, who had a century against the West Indies on the third day of the tour.

Chapman's century gave him an aggregate of 200, while his partner had 199, and both batsmen were in fine form.







### Djibouti election brings fear of tribal clashes

DAJIBOUTI registered voters in the French territory of Afar and Issas will elect Members of the recently established Chamber of Deputies on Saturday. The 10-day snap election has brought about a background of tribal inter-clan trouble.

For whatever name the French give to their new partners—Afars and Issas—there is little doubt that the two tribes have been irreconcilably at odds since the French Somaliland—now known as Djibouti—became independent in 1967.

The tribesmen, however, remain the same in the Somali Republic, where they are known as Afars, but under last year's constitution they now have 6 per cent of the votes allocated to the chamber.

Under the same system, the Afars have gained more authority over their own affairs. The Council of Ministers, whose President, Mr. Ali Youssouf, is also Vice-President of the territory,


