New Presidential powers could avoid costly strikes

Kenya's Trade Disputes Act may be amended to give Mr. J. H. Kariuki, secretary general of the Kenya Federation of Labour Unions, the power to take a 'lock-out' measure used in Australia and Singapore to prevent expensive strikes.

The proposed amendment would allow the Minister of Labour to issue a 'lock-out' order if a strike is likely to cause significant economic disruption. This power is currently held by the courts.

The current law requires employers to apply to the courts for an injunction to prevent a strike. This process is often lengthy and costly, leading to prolonged industrial action.

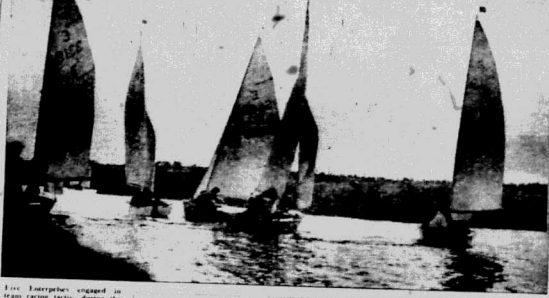

NATIONAL AND GRINDLAYS BANK LTD.

President Kenyatta formally opened the computer centre of National and Grindlays Bank Ltd. in Nairobi's Industrial Area last Wednesday.

In a ceremony attended by nearly 100 Minister-Government officials, leading businessmen and members of the Press, the President presided at a luncheon at the computer centre.

President Kenyatta said that as long as computers contributed to the effectiveness of management and enabled enterprises to expand to fulfil more business kills there could be nothing to fear.

The President, who was welcomed to the centre by the Minister for Finance, Mr. Gichuru, said that a primary purpose of computers was to provide business or research institutions with full and accurate data.

"This mechanical work can be done, and kept up to date, far more rapidly than through the agency of human calculation," President Kenyatta said.

"Far from replacing human functions, a computer can greatly accelerate the investigation of complex problems, or the planning of new projects for the benefit and well-being of man."

The President added that National and Grindlays Bank had played a substantial part in the development of Kenya, and that new investments in this scale reflected the confidence of experts in the economic future of the country.

Thanking the President for performing the opening ceremony, the bank's Chairman, Lord Aldington, who flew out from London especially for the ceremony, said: "This is the first computer any bank has installed in an East African country and we believe in any West African or Central African country."

"It is, however, not the first computer the bank has installed, for we have had one in London for over five years and our London customers are well used to it. But I should add that the advent of this more modern computer in Nairobi has already forced us to consider a replacement in London."

"Over the years we have progressed from hand-written accounting to simple mechanical accounting machines and more recently to sophisticated scientific machines," Lord Aldington said.

"Banking is not solely a matter of keeping figures and records accurately, or simply of accepting and paying out money, but is very much a personal service depending on personal attention, contact and understanding."

"The more scientific and technological advances can help in the accounting, the more time and energy our skilled staff will have for personal service," Lord Aldington said.

The savings bank accounts are the first to go into the Nairobi computer and 30,000 of them are already being handled.

The next stage will be to account for 100 million of Nairobi and later current accounts will be brought on to the computer.

Lord Aldington said that the computer signified the faith which the bank had in the future of Kenya.

"In the past two years the expansion of the bank's services to so many important places in Kenya has increased the number of accounts by approximately 70,000."

"Since independence we have doubled the number of full branches in Kenya to 34 and added 150 per cent to the number of sub-branches — now 45. In addition we cover 250 villages with our mobile banks," Lord Aldington said.

The computer centre together with ancillary equipment has cost £250,000.

75 years in East Africa

1966 is an important year in the history of National and Grindlays Bank because it marks the completion of 75 years of continuous banking services to Kenya.

National and Grindlays were the first bank to be established in East Africa when in 1891 an office of the National Bank of India, a forerunner of today's bank, was opened in Zanzibar.

In 1896 a further branch was opened in Mombasa and subsequently a site in Treasury Square was obtained in 1900 and it remains today the home of the Bank's Mombasa branch.

Thus it is perhaps fitting that the bank which opened the first ever banking premises in East Africa has also become the first bank to install a computer in the area.

The original National Bank of India had been founded in Calcutta in 1861 and thus the new offices introduced into East Africa had the benefit of a well established bank behind them and also their formative years in a part of Africa which at that time was virtually unknown to the rest of the world.

The Grindlays section of the bank joining the National Bank in 1958 and brought with it an even longer banking tradition dating from the 1820s.

Grindlays were also central in the Indian sub-continent and they specialised in particular in banking after the financial interests of military and civil officers of the Indian Government.

It is interesting to note that one of the first Europeans to penetrate deeply into East Africa, the explorer Speke, was a client of Grindlays and that the bank managed his affairs while he was on his travels in search of the source of the Nile.

In 1904 the first branch was opened in Nairobi in a small corrugated iron shack in what is now Government Road.

Among the current accounts in 1906 were "a mixed lot of clerks, merchants, railway employees, settlers, artisans, army officers, one soldier and one small trader."

From the earliest days the bank fostered its connection with agriculture and strove vigorously to promote the growth of primary products and to build up an export industry.

By 1906 the number of current accounts had reached 200,000 at a time when Nairobi's population was 1,000.

One of the earliest clients was I. A. P. and I. and the bank's premises were one of the first buildings in Nairobi to be wired for lighting.

The prestige and standing of the bank were by now well established as is manifested from the fact that Winston Churchill, on a visit to Nairobi during his tour of Kenya and Uganda in 1907 in his capacity as Under-Secretary of State for the Colonies, met the manager and discussed financial problems in the area with him.

As late as 1909 the National Bank was still the only bank operating in what was then known as the British East Africa Protectorate. The Colonial Office report for 1909 and "The National Bank established" under the authority of the Company's Act, is the only bank doing business in the Protectorate.

By 1911 branches were opened in Kisumu and Nakuru and after the First World War a steady expansion was maintained in the 1920s and by despite the problems of the financial slump in these difficult decades.

Since the Second World War the Bank's expansion in East Africa has been even more rapid as is shown by the extent of the investment in premises in Nairobi alone from 1949 to 1962, when amounted to nearly £1,000,000.

Today National and Grindlays have 79 branches and sub-branches and the mobile bank units visit more than 250 villages in Kenya. But the Bank's contribution to the expansion of the economy in the area is not measured solely in terms of the numbers of buildings built but rather in the infrastructure of banking experience and expertise which 75 years of operations in East Africa has built up.

The Bank's assistance to the growth of Kenya's primary and agricultural production is considerable. The services of the Bank assist in the promotion of Kenya's tourist industry and the opportunities which are being given to more and more Africans all around the country to open current and savings accounts is a major contribution to the expansion of the nation's economy and to the furtherance of the individual well-being of its people.

Not in the investment in the country's agricultural sector just confined to major, highly capitalised projects. It also lies in the field of loans to the small African farmer.

One major aspect of the Bank's activities in East Africa is directed towards the training of staff from abroad in other levels.

In the training school at Nairobi an average annual intake of 170 are given courses in subjects such as basic banking machine operation, and initial training towards promotion to sub-officer level.

At officer level trainees are sent to the head office in London for about 11 years of training, which includes the taking of exams of the Institute of Bankers.

The effect of these training schemes is that the Bank's Africanisation policy is going ahead smoothly and speedily and at present there are 65 Kenyans in charge of branches.

Speech by Lord Aldington, the Chairman of National and Grindlays Bank.

No greater honour can be done to a Bank than that bestowed on it today by the action of His Excellency the President of Kenya in coming here and starting on its long journey the National and Grindlays Computer.

In great humility, I am privileged to thank you, Sir, for this honour and to thank you on behalf of all of our Bank who seek to serve the people of Kenya.

This is the first Computer National and Grindlays has installed in any overseas country.

This is the first Computer any Bank has installed in any East African country and we believe in any West African or Central African country.

It is not the first Computer the Bank has installed anywhere. For we have had one in London for over the years and we and our London customers are well used to it. But I should add that the advent of this more modern computer in Nairobi has already forced us to consider a replacement in London.

Why have we introduced a computer here? There is a simple answer. So that we can speed up and improve our service to the standard of our service to our customers. With the computer from the start, our accounting methods will be the most up-to-date and as we gain experience further improvements will be possible.

This process is not a new one for us. Over the years we have progressed from handwritten accounts to simple mechanical accounting machines, and more recently to sophisticated electronic machines.

In making our plans and programmes, we have had much help from friends and we know that forward thinking people such as the Treasury, the Railways, Kowit and I.D.M. (Kenya) and Telecommunications and the Airways have been thinking along lines similar to ours.

I want to pay a special tribute to the computer's designers and manufacturers and all international computers that have helped to meet it and put it into motion and all those others who have helped.

Banking is not such a matter of keeping figures and records accurately or simply of accepting and paying out money. Banking is very much a personal service depending upon personality, courtesy and understanding.

Therefore scientific and technological advances can help in the accounting, the more time and energy our skilled staff will have for personal service. This is not theory—we know it is true—our customers in Kenya know it is true.

And there is no surplus of skilled men in banking. We need and shall need all the trained and good men—and women—we have—and more. For the computer, too, is not possible to continue our dynamic expansion and to cater for many more customers, it will also

encourage more customers to come to us. Better service brings more customers, more customers mean a wider service, better service means better jobs in banking for those who are efficient and work hard.

Necessarily, the start of this new revolution in our banking has begun carefully planned and types of accounts and branches will be brought into the computer by steps.

Savings Bank Accounts in the Nairobi branches are the first—something over 100,000.

The next are Savings Bank Accounts with Current Accounts with a range of 100 miles of Nairobi. Current Accounts will be brought on quite quickly.

I want to emphasize that this computer installation is a further mark of the confidence which we in National and Grindlays Bank, invested in the future of Kenya so wisely and kindly felt by the President who has the privilege of this far-seeing wisdom.

Yes, Sir, there are many times above your searchlight on the future to guide and encourage your countrymen in their struggle up the road to a better life.

We in National and Grindlays also concentrate our thoughts on the future. We have been investing in the future. In the past two years the expansion of the bank to so many important places in Kenya has increased the total number of accounts by approximately 200 per cent.

The new system for maintaining Savings Bank accounts has been introduced by National and Grindlays Bank with a view to improving its service to customers and has been made possible by the installation of a computer.

This system will be brought into operation when the computer takes over the accounting for a branch and it is expected that branches in and within 100 miles radius of Nairobi will all be working on the new system within the next nine months.

The Bank's customer service will be greatly improved. Firstly, there will be more staff available where it matters—

The bank today

National and Grindlays are the first banks to install a computer in East West or Central Africa.

The Bank entered the computer field in London in 1967, not just to be first, but to be first because the banks in Kenya were anxious to use the speed and efficiency in London and had to have one of its West End offices because of a lack of space.

The opening answer was to install a computer. The study, however, is to make it so that staff would not be made redundant and in any case recruitment of staff was a problem for National and Grindlays as well as the other banks.

Because of the decision to install a computer the Bank was one of the earlier users of these machines in the banking industry. The clearing banks were at various stages of computerization, some of the smaller banks were thinking about computers. National and Grindlays and was one of the first banks in the U.K. to make the clearing Bank to install a computer.

In consultation with the possibilities of using a computer in London began towards the end of 1967 and the decision was taken to install a computer in the City, where it could easily handle work for both City and West End offices.

An English Electric KDF 6 was ordered in February 1968, delivered in December 1968 and started live running in January 1969. This one of the shortest times recorded from start of such a project until installation and live running of the machine.

The bank tomorrow

The use of computers opens up a wide area of possibilities for a bank such as National and Grindlays.

The present programme in Kenya covers branches within a radius of about 100 miles of Nairobi accessible by road and involves the processing of savings bank accounts and current accounts.

Applications such as the handling of standing orders, the payment of staff salaries, the maintenance of staff records will be undertaken at a later date.

To obtain the full benefits of computer working, thought will have to be given to connecting the remaining branches in Kenya to the computer in Nairobi.

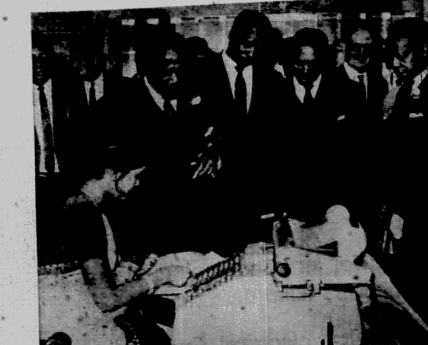
These branches are too far distant to make the transfer of information by road suitable. Movement of information by air is a possibility but due to climatic conditions this method is not really worthwhile.

Telephone communication is an ideal medium for this type of work and with the very great improvements being made in the equipment available it should be found that more distant branches to the Nairobi computer by this means.

By using all the Kenya branches to the Nairobi computer the statistical information called for in the running of a modern institution will be much more quickly available and will, therefore, be a greater benefit to the Bank both in Nairobi and in the Head Office in London.

Transactions between branches in Kenya either on behalf of customers or on the Bank's own business will be much more quickly carried out.

Plans are well advanced for the introduction of a similar type of computer into another country in which the Bank operates and it is hoped that eventually all branches of the Bank except perhaps a few of the most isolated ones will be connected to a central computer in the countries in which they are situated.

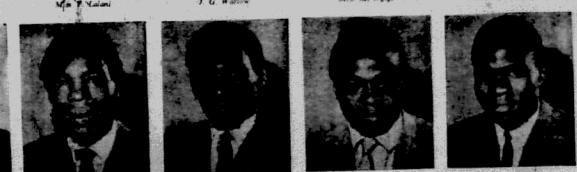

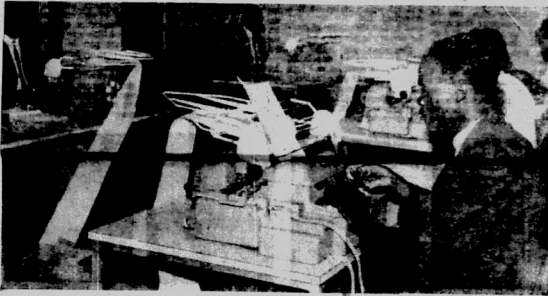

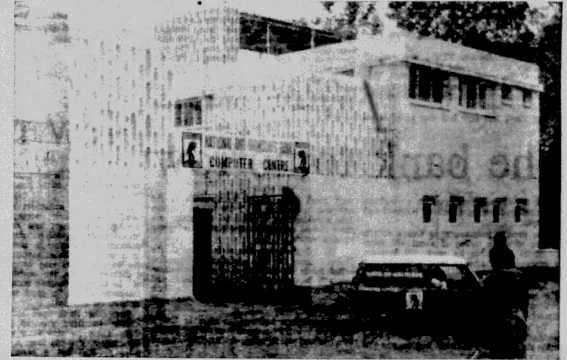

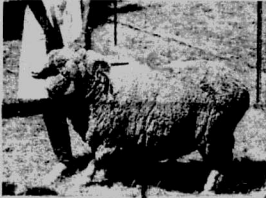
