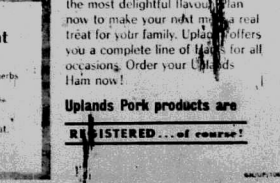

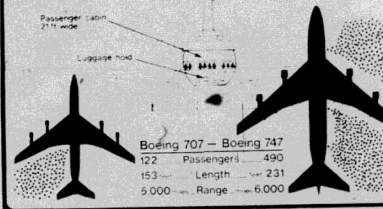

## Power for loan sought after £57,800 error

Mr. M. N. Mwangi, Director of the Kenya Electricity Board (KEB), has sought a loan of £800,000 from the Danish Government to cover a £57,800 error in the 1965-66 financial year. 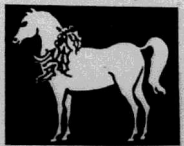

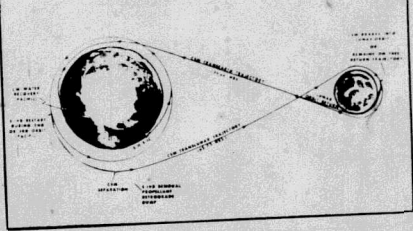

# The shanty-town blaze that made 4,000 homeless



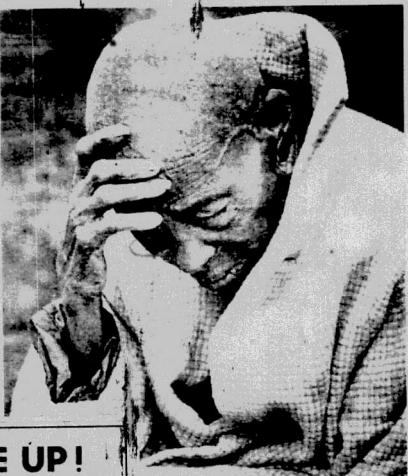
