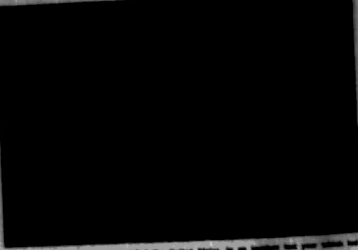

SOVIET SALES SWELL GOLD RESERVES BY £90m.

OFFICIAL monetary gold stocks held by non-Communist countries rose by about £28,000,000 in 1965 — thanks largely to sales by the Soviet Union — International Monetary Fund statistics have disclosed.

However, the increase was one of the smallest for any annual period since the early 1950s, because of unusually heavy private hoarding and industrial use.

Last year's increase came in the final quarter, owing to the fact that the first year in recent times that gold in the form of Western government bonds had not appeared as an asset item.

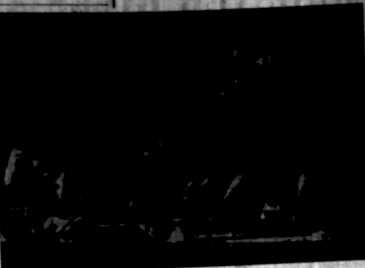

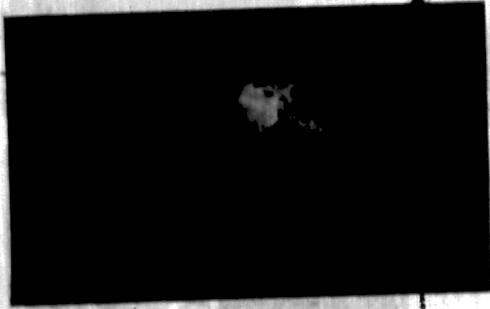

Mombasa wants more seats in Parliament

Standard Staff Reporter

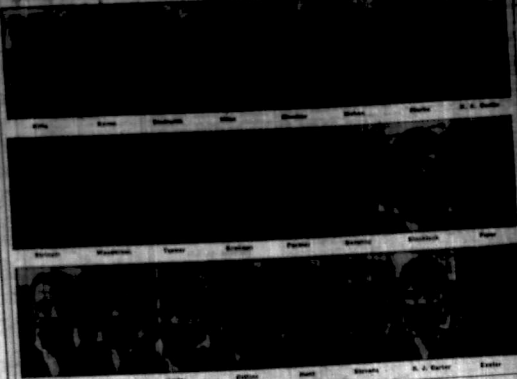



Tanker 'may sail inside blockade'

The mystery of what will happen to the oil cargoes of the tanker Joanna V, its port at Beira, and the Mambela, in Durban harbour, continued yesterday. Both tankers are suspected of carrying oil for Rhodesia and restrictive measures have been taken against them by the U.N. Security Council.

In Beira, shipping sources had said the Joanna V, disarmed in turn by Cyprus and Panama, would begin discharging half her 18,000 tons of oil yesterday. But there was no sign of the operation starting. Flexible pipe used to link tankers with the Rhodesia pipeline installation remained closed on the blockade.

The Joanna V became a ship without a country when the Panama Government in revealing the tanker's gross tonnage of only a few hundred tons, declared her the Greek for the Panamanian flag.

The Panamanian Foreign Ministry said it was not a convention but a matter of course that the Joanna V, if she is to be used for oil, should be registered in Panama.

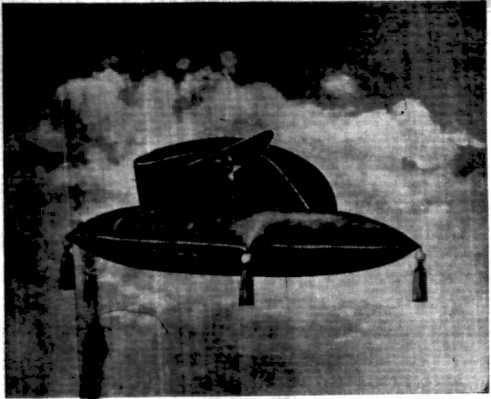



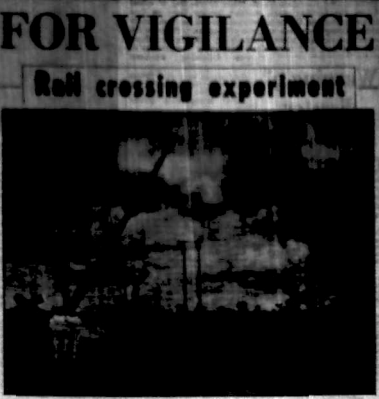
