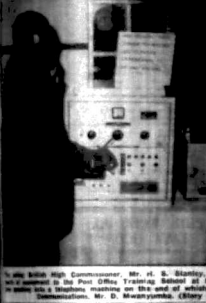

Boat capsizes in 70 feet of water

...including a number of children, are now known to be in the Lake Victoria boat disaster on Saturday. It is believed that the boat death toll will be higher as several passengers in the boat, Kingongit I, which went down in 70 feet of water, are believed to be unaccounted for.

Most of the known dead have been identified. Many of them came from the small fishing village of Kendu and relatives were taken from there yesterday to the Nyiraga General Hospital in Kisumu, where the bodies were laid out originally.

Later the bodies were wrapped in sheets, put in makeshift coffins and loaded on to a quay for transport to Kenya. A special meeting has been arranged in Kisumu by the secretary of the South African Exile Branch, Mr. George Oweze Kar.

Police yesterday were piecing together the story of the disaster from the 40 survivors, who included a priest, two members of Kingongit I, crewed and operated by a two-month-old crew of East African Lake Victoria pilots, with his sister vessel, Kingongit II between Kisumu and Kendu days ago.

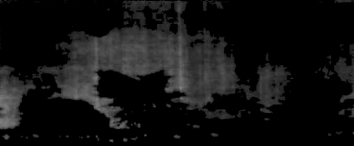

The project has been the subject of a feasibility survey carried out by Yugoslav experts who have recommended that it should be built at Saganu.

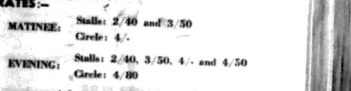
