Nothing so far has been said publicly because the proposal is being studied at strictly private meetings of the executive board of the International Coffee Organisation.

But it is understood that Sir Stuart Gillett, who holds a watching brief for Kenya's Ministry of Agriculture, last week warned the board that it would be political and economic suicide to accept cuts reducing production by more than 45 per cent.

The board can only make recommendations and the final decision will be taken by the council, which meets later this month.

It is believed that Sir Stuart impressed on the board that Kenya had already accepted the need for crop limitation and crop diversification.

Iniquitous reduction

It was already envisaged that 80,000 acres would be eliminated but the proposals prepared by the I.C.O. secretariat called for the uprooting of a further 32,000 acres. Sir Stuart warned the board that the additional reduction would be iniquitous and impossible to carry out. (About 200,000 acres of under coffee in Kenya at present.)

Last week the chairman of the Tanzania Coffee Board, Mr. Makulu, warned the I.C.O. board of the serious threat of desertion unless Tanzania's quota was increased. Kenya's quota for next year is slightly higher than for this year.

Much importance is attached to the new quota assessment. Kenya's problem is in reality a quota which is far above her export capacity. Brazil, however, will not forgo any portion of her quota to assist smaller producers and therefore the trade is predictable about any upward revision of East Africa's share.

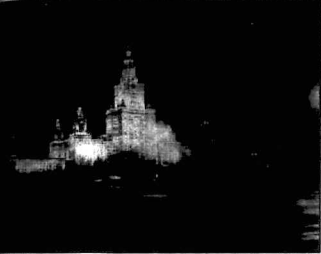

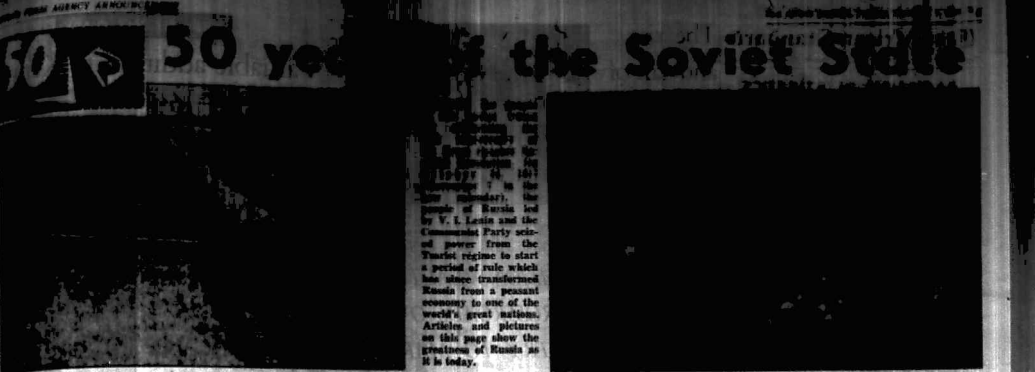

END OF TERMS FOR

ABOUT 12 pupils of the Nairobi School have been suspended after incidents at the school during the weekend. It was announced that the Board of Governors would not be meeting this week to consider the situation.

Most of the pupils were in their ordinary and only a few were permitted to leave the school grounds. The remaining instruction warning students against moving about the grounds after dark was reiterated.

Both the school authorities and the Ministry of Education were reluctant to comment on the situation at the school, but it is understood that there were a number of incidents between pupils who clustered about at each other, and the odd scuffle broke out. A report that several parents had been issued a detainer was not confirmed.

A number of police patrolled in the area of the school after reports of trouble, and some were still on duty yesterday.

During the past month a number of notices have appeared mysteriously on notice boards and stuck to trees in the school grounds. Most of these have read simply, "Black Power" others read: "The liberation committee is in action" and "Familiarity go home".

A Ministry spokesman said the situation did not give cause for alarm and was being dealt with. "There has been some restlessness as is normal among boys, and the Board (of Governors) is meeting as a matter of urgency. We do not consider the situation," he said.

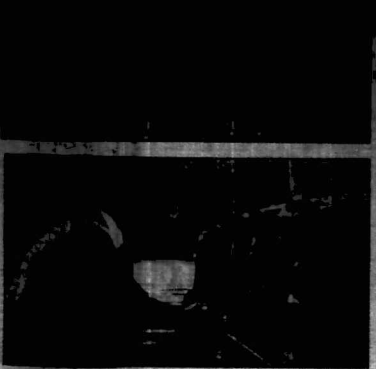

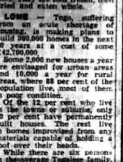

Power and irrigation from the Snowy River

By Michael O'Donnell, Ombudsman.

ONE of the world's greatest engineering feats, the Snowy Mountains River Diversion Scheme, is more than two-thirds complete. In simple terms, the scheme entails turning a river round so that its waters flow on the northern inland coastward instead of southerly into the Tasman Sea. The Snowy River flows high in the River Snowy Alps in the east of the Australian Alps in south-east Australia.

By 1974 the scheme to reverse its course will have cost taxpayers \$1,000 million and will have opened an area of more than 100,000 acres of high country to the south.

The water, which flows from the eastern side of the mountains is being directed to the Macintyre Dam in the Snowy Mountains region, 450 miles from the sea. It will turn the wheels of a large number of turbines to provide large quantities of electricity to New South Wales and the neighbouring States of Victoria.

WINTER DEMAND

With a capacity of 3,500,000 kilowatts, the dam will store more than the whole of the winter power demand of New South Wales, the country's most populous State. The annual capacity of the dam will be in excess of 1,700,000 kilowatts.

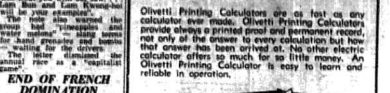

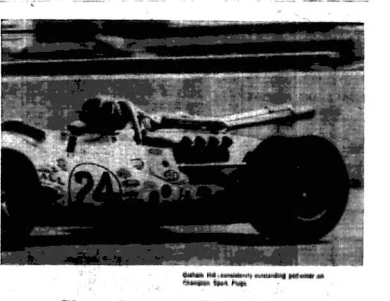

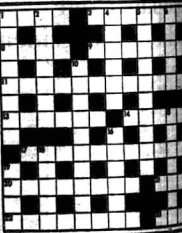

Pressure on Rwanda is stepped up

The Congolese Government yesterday pressed for the extradition of the Rwandan mercenaries from neighbouring Rwanda, and the Congolese General, Mr. Diello Telli, conferred on the situation with the International Red Cross which was told by the Rwandan Government, Mr. Kayibanda, to eradicate the rebels as soon as possible.

At least one aircraft was waiting in Kigali for permission to fly the mercenaries out of Rwanda, either to Malia or Zambia, although the latter has refused now to take part in any evacuation.

Official Congolese circles were said to be angry over the Rwandan leader's insistence that the rebels should not be extradited to Kinshasa. The Congolese Press Agency said the mercenaries were "enjoying the hospitality of Mr. Kayibanda".

'Facts have changed'

The agency said Rwanda seemed to be following the resolution passed at the African summit conference in Kinshasa in September that the rebels should be allowed to withdraw in peace. "But the facts of the problem have changed," it added.

President Kayibanda had no other choice but to hand over the Congolese Justice to betray the African cause, the agency said.

It was a day of a strike in the Congo, the agency said, and the Congolese National Army refused to back up the Government. "Yesterday," talks between President Bomboki and the rebels were believed to centre on the possibility of a ceasefire to deliver the mercenaries to Rwanda.

The Congolese Foreign Minister, Mr. Bomboki, was expected to withdraw the summit conference resolution on the mercenaries, but had become "null and void" after the meeting.

A French Dakota with a large cargo load of arms and ammunition was expected to arrive in Kinshasa on Tuesday. It was expected to be used to evacuate about 25 French mercenaries from the area, but belonging to the Air-Diplomat Company, had been chartered by Air France and placed at the disposal of the International Red Cross.
