Minister's gloomy forecast

 Farmers were very perturbed by the gloomy forecast for the year ahead given by the Minister for Agriculture, Mr. J. H. McKeen, at a public meeting held at the Agricultural Institute, on Monday evening last.

Mr. McKeen said that Britain's devaluation could cost Kenya's agricultural exports \$100 million. He pointed out a 'Prevent' conference after the meeting of the union and farmers that term planning and to the programme was under pressure of time.

U.N. Assembly ends 'frustrating session'

THIS U.N. GENERAL ASSEMBLY closed its 12th session today with a record of frustration and deadlock. The 18-nation body adjourned after a 10-day session in which it failed to reach any agreement on the Korean armistice, the Congo situation, or the Middle East. 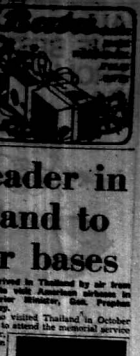

Notice to Kenya depositors in First Permanent (East Africa) Limited (FPL) concerning the transfer of deposits to the Housing Finance Company of Kenya Limited (HFCK) as at January 1, 1968

1. This has been done by the shareholders of HFCK, who have transferred to HFCK all the shares held in FPL, so that the availability to HFCK of substantial funds is enabled to meet withdrawal demands made on it by its depositors.

4. To effect the arrangements for transfer, the prospectus of every depositor whose account is maintained with FPL in Kenya will either be replaced by a new prospectus, or will be amended to reflect the new name of HFCK. This replacement or amendment will normally take place on the first occasion upon which the depositor operates his account after the first day of January, 1968.

It will of course be open to a depositor to have his present bank in the office of HFCK (i.e. the office operated by FPL) in Nairobi and Mombasa) for endorsement of endorsement, even though he may not wish to operate his account.

5. Depositors in FPL are assured that notwithstanding the new arrangements, FPL will continue to accept full responsibility for the payment of interest on deposits and responsibility for the payment of interest on deposits held in FPL passbooks which has not been endorsed by HFCK until a date to be notified later which will in any event not be earlier than the first day of January, 1968. Interest will continue to accrue to depositors without interruption and depositors will not suffer any loss as a result of the transfer.

6. FPL will continue to assist HFCK by providing management services in so far as they can, and they will do so without charge, but attention is drawn to the fact that they will not be able to do so if their resources are exhausted.

7. The directors of HFCK feel indebted in claiming the confidence of the public investors with FPL in Kenya and trust that they will maintain and indeed increase their deposits after the transfer.

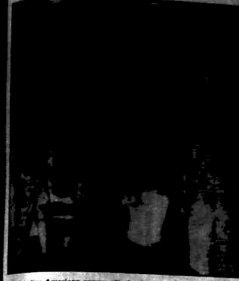

Wood carving becomes big business

ANN MARSHALL visits the wood carvers of Quarry Road, Nairobi, whose work is proving increasingly popular as an advertisement for the homes of Kenya - and the world.

Using a sharp knife with a rhinoceros handle, Mr. Kinya Mwachiki works industriously transforming a pile of lumber obtained from the Kenya Wood Commission into several curved lengths resembling elephant tusks.

It drops when he works in Quarry Road, Nairobi, and he is in a hurry to get on with his work.

The second of polishing his knife as he begins to work, he says, is to get rid of any wood splinters which may have come off the wood from New York.

When his elephant tusk which he will fit to the handle of his carving, has already been paid for by the customer for about 10 shillings.

The carver also has to contract for, say, 12 shillings, if they have to be in the form of a specific and the expert in sculpture in finished order.

Each man concentrates on one type of carving, with his tools and machinery at the end of the production line.

It is no easy task, says Mr. Kinya Mwachiki, who has been carving for 10 years. He says he has had to work hard to get his hands used to the work, and he has sometimes exchanged near pain.

As a young man he rented a small house in Mbagwe where he started selling. Then in 1966 he acquired one store in the present premises in Quarry Road, and moved more to the business.

As well as supplying to several big tourist shops in Nairobi, he now has a shop in Zomba. His main capital has been built up from the profits of his business.

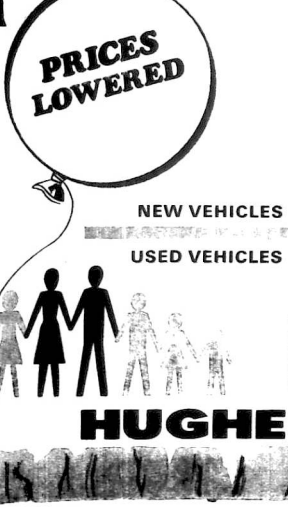

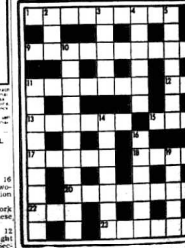

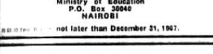

LOCAL AUTHORITY FINANCES

INCREASED CHARGES for some services, announced by Nairobi City Council this week, were proposed a year ago and considered the result of a cost-cutting exercise. The increase was caused by the Government's insistence to draw a further £200,000 to £250,000 from the Council.

The delay in making the increases has been caused by changing the by-laws, since the scales are laid down by the by-laws. This time the law is important because it means to effect the recommendation of the Local Government Commission to the Nairobi City Council in the National Assembly, requiring the council to surrender 50 per cent of the increase to the Government.

Already, the council was paying £200,000 a year, but required to disburse the additional sum to help those local authorities which have to be helped through G.P.T. quotas. Ald. Rubia made the point that this is not the proper way to help the weaker areas. It should, he pointed out, be made to make them viable, not to rob Nairobi and Mombasa.

Both he and the Finance Committee chairman, Ald. Joram, criticised the Ministry of Local Government for allowing the council to make its own arrangements for 1968 without prior consultation or notice of the intention to make a financial cut in revenue which, obviously, upsets all calculations.

A similar point was made recently by the chairman of the Eldoret Finance Committee, Ald. Joram, who pointed out that the Government had made it its policy to plan ahead realistically. Eldoret Council has a sound record, the accounts for this year showing a surplus of £3,700 compared with an estimated deficit of £5,500, but it is having to cut down accumulated balances to £1,200 next year (to be replaced by a grant of £1,200) because of increased expenditure on account of rising costs, not being matched by increased income.

Mr. Macharia pointed especially to the higher costs of primary education, a problem with every local authority and especially serious for Nairobi which stands in danger of taking severe cuts with the alternative of raising fees (supposing this course is permitted) if the G.P.T. drawback is effected. More than a quarter of the Eldoret's rate income will go on primary education next year, Mr. Macharia quite rightly renewed the plea he made a year ago for the Government to lay down a permanent policy whereby local authorities can be assured of specified financial assistance over a period of at least four years, enabling them to plan ahead with reasonable certainty.

Removal of G.P.T. indicated

Nairobi's City Treasurer reported that the sudden cut in G.P.T. revenue makes nonsense of the estimates approved and of the rate fixed. Either the council must arrest the momentum of development in greater Nairobi or effect economies in staff and further increase service charges in order to make up the deficit. Sacking staff would not be politically acceptable and increased charges would have to be delayed for a year while the by-laws are changed again.

If the loss in expenditure was "once for all" or even for a couple of years it might be possible to recoup from reserves, but this remedy is out of the question for a continuing operation. The only ready method of raising funds quickly is to increase the general rate. Having already done so, from 11 to 12 per cent, the council is reluctant to go further. If the rate is to be raised entirely from rate income, an increase of one-half or three-quarters of one per cent would be indicated, a heavy burden to inflict on city dwellers and business houses, in order to raise local authorities which have been lax in collecting their own G.P.T. levies.

Having received detailed minutes of the City Council it is clearly understood that it seems to have been a little bit of a surprise to find that the Council had decided to make a firm basis for some years ahead, the situation needs reviewing from year to year, and a tax increase of 10 per cent is warranted and whether G.P.T. itself a legacy of registration and a tax impossible to enforce universally because of the opportunities for "black" money. It is suggested that the Government should be urged to consider, either by increasing rates generally or income tax, or a combination of both.

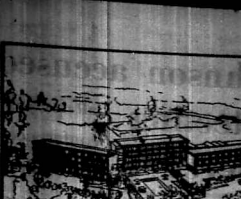

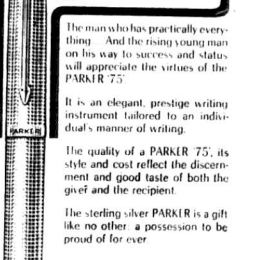

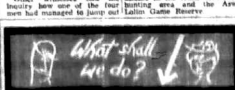
