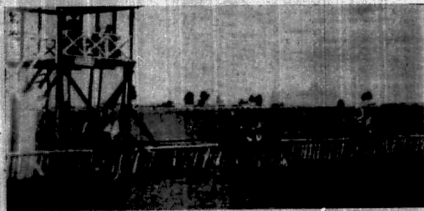

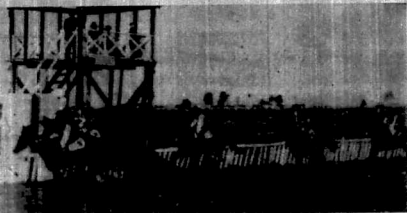

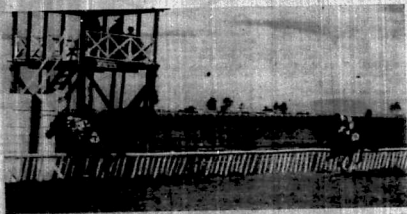

THE WAR IN THE AIR

Great Air Base in German Air Raid on Scapa Flow

Reprisals for Big German Air Raid on Scapa Flow
RELAIS OF PLANES DROPPED BOMBS FOR SEVEN HOURS
EXTENSIVE DAMAGE

While the House of Commons was still in session on Tuesday night the Prime Minister gave members the first news of the biggest air raid yet carried out by the Royal Air Force.

The raid which was directed against air bases on the island of Sylt continued without stopping for over seven hours, relays of planes taking part at half hourly intervals.

All reports agree that the bombing from the aircraft was accurate and that very considerable damage was done. Great fire started by the bombs aided the pilots in their selection of and attacks on important objectives.

One of the biggest air raids on Britain since the war took place on Saturday night. A large number of Nazi planes bombed Scapa Flow and one warship was damaged.

One bomb hit a nearby village, wrecked five cottages, killed one woman and wounded several other people.

British aircraft during the week-end bombed German patrol vessels in and near the Heligoland Bight. One ship was by far the partly lifted out of the water by the force of a bomb.

The Admiralty issued the following communiqué today: At 7.45 p.m. on Saturday, German aircraft made a raid on the Fleet anchorage at Scapa Flow.

About 15 enemy aircraft reached their objective. A considerable number of bombs were dropped. One hit a warship which, however, only sustained minor damage.

Bombs were also dropped on land, but no military objectives were hit. Houses were destroyed.

One woman was killed and seven other civilians were wounded as the result of a bomb falling on a village near Scapa Flow. Five cottages were wrecked.

AMERICAN FINANTS TAX LAW East African Basis Of New Bill LESSONS OF EXPERIENCE

His Excellency the Governor gave an assurance that if, when the war was ended, there should be a general demand for an enquiry into the operation of Income Tax Government would be prepared to recommend to the Secretary of State a purely impartial, outside enquiry.

The Bill to amend and consolidate the Income Tax Ordinance came up for its second reading in Kenya Legislative Council on Monday. Explanations of the amendments caused, firstly, by the decision to have Income Tax on East African basis and secondly by the light of experience gained in the working of the Ordinance were given by the Hon. Mr. H. H. Williams, in the course of speech moving the second reading. Mr. Williams stated that as soon as the Kenya Government became aware of the introduction of Income Tax into neighbouring territories it realised that the question arose as to how to decide whether Income Tax should be applied to the total income of a person derived from all four territories or whether it should be separately taxed by reference to Income Tax laws in force in each territory. If the former were decided upon it meant serious amendments to the 1927 Ordinance for the basis of taxation under that legislation was that the income within the Colony was taxable and had to be reported to the tax authorities.

It was decided however, to prevent any further taxing the question of the taxation of the main reason why Kenya should be "within the territory" basis in 1927 was because of its superior simplicity.

Hence because the right to tax a resident on his total income wherever derived was not a simple matter to decide by reference to the law of the territory to which a person's total income in East Africa or elsewhere he should be reported. In each territory many inquiries were conducted on an East African basis with a kind of one in one of the principal laws and treaties to which Kenya was a party. 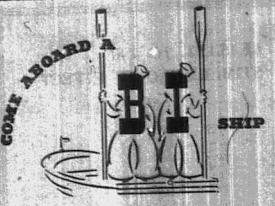
