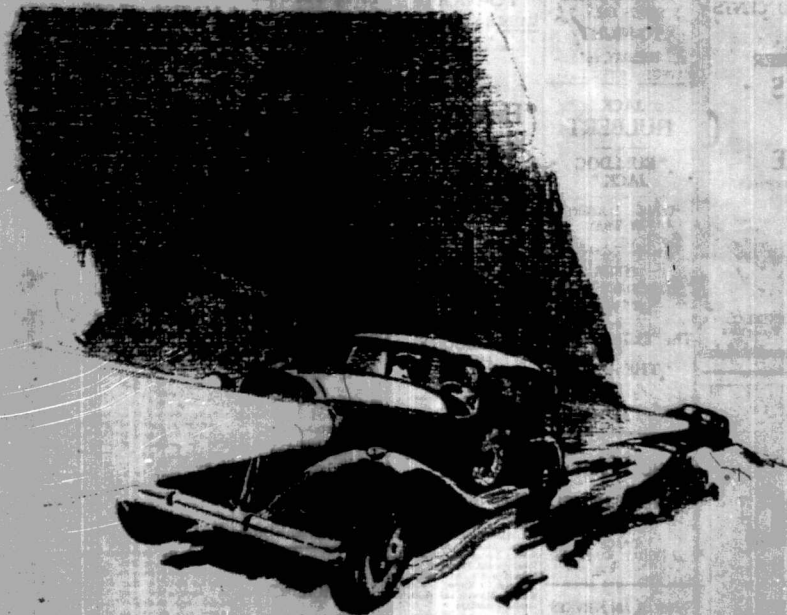

# Non-intervention Committee Bombshell

in European affairs. It is considered that Russia has granted Spain a special Non-intervention Agreement, and that the latter is being "betrayed".

It is pointed out that a just Italian Foreign Ministry would make a result of the Berlin conversation stating that the two Governments will favour the emergence of a Soviet state in any part of Spain.

### Germany Not Surprised

In Berlin the Soviet's action has not surprised official circles, which are regarded as inevitable in Spain as the Soviet was faced with the prospect of her intervention in Spain.

VAN BUKIRK SPECIAL CORRESPONDENT OF THE "EAST AFRICAN STANDARD" WHO IS FOLLOWING THE RACE BY AIR, RECORDS IN HIS MESSAGES PUBLISHED BELOW THE DRAMA OF THE CONTEST OVER THE FIRST 470 MILES TO DODOMA AND REVEALS THE STERN STRUGGLE FOR POSITION WHICH TOOK PLACE ALONG ONE OF AFRICA'S MOST DIFFICULT AND DANGEROUS HIGHWAYS.

#### STILL IN THE LEAD

At Dodoma last evening Car No. 1 was still in the lead and had made the journey in the astonishing time of just over 9 hours. No. 2 was only two minutes behind, having thus lost exactly 60 seconds during the terrific struggle over that distance.

But the real leader is Car No. 42 the last to start. This Ford Sedan driven by Woodhead and Michael Egan was the first car to arrive in Dodoma having made up thirty minutes.

Another successful competitor is Car No. 11 which arrived fourth in Dodoma having gained four minutes.

These narrow margins fully indicate the dramatic character of yesterday's race.

#### A KENYA RECORD

One of the outstanding events of the day was the astonishing record set up by Kenneth McIvor one of the best known Kenyan drivers who arrived at Arusha in three and a quarter hours after leaving Nairobi. Mr. van Bukirk in a message from Dodoma says that McIvor is still maintaining his "mile a taxing 60".

Unfortunately the race has not been without mishaps and two cars have been eliminated by accidents. One of them is No. 17 the replacement Kenya gilt car driven by Lock and Dowling which crashed 28 miles out of Dodoma. The other is Car No. 18 which met its fate at Kondoa Irangi. In both cases the drivers were unhurt. At an early stage the Dutch Car No. 28, was out of action for two and a quarter hours after colliding with a bank just beyond Kajondo. It is still in the running.

#### MARGINS OF MINUTES

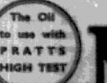

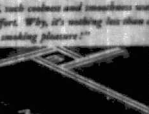

I followed the long line of cars from Nairobi to Arusha this morning and even from the air the scene of speed was impressive. The road while low dry was very dusty and from the record of damage, which I sketched up as the cars came to Arusha I should say that although it may be to be held judged by East African conditions the air-terrestrial route has still a long way to go before it can be regarded as a racing track.

The road of course is narrow and tortuous in some places, and is studded by dry river beds and unimproved gullies which but for the fact that practically all the drivers are acquainted with the route again have piled up half a dozen cars. ## Kenya Drivers' Chivalry in Great Race

FIRST AID STOP FOR INJURED RIVALS

Yet Still Take Second Place

THRILLING STORIES REPORTED FROM SALISBURY

Hopley and Englebrect, Kenya's hope in the race to Johannesburg, are the heroes of a story of true sportsmanship received yesterday from the Standard's special correspondent at Salisbury, whose message is as follows—

Hopley and Englebrect reported that Marcus and Bower, in Number one car, had bucked a front wheel when taking a corner two quick, 60 miles north of Chikha. Bower was unconscious, and Hopley and Englebrect stopped to render first aid. Marcus and Bower were then proceeded when the buckled wheel had been changed."

This chivalrous stoppage may have had a bearing on the results of the race in which only Number Five, the Chrysler of Du Toit and Rosen, took over the lead when Number One was held up.

Number Five arrived at Salisbury at 9:4 a.m., local time yesterday and left an hour later. Number 11 (Hopley and Englebrect) arrived 7:32 and left at 8:32. Number 11 (the Ford of Westcott and Broderick) arrived at 7:50 and left an hour later.

Du Toit and Rosen reported a leakage of oil and they are carrying a rubber pipe in case they have to take out their original oil pipe.

In an interview with the Standard's special Salisbury correspondent, Englebrect said that the first 200 miles from Nairobi were the worst. Passing through Nyanzani they were very hazy, and ran over one at a speed of about 60 miles an hour.

Number Three (Whitehead and McLeod—Ford) arrived at 8:00. Number two (the Rose coaches—Terraplane) at 8:30. Number Seven (Krogman and Uys—Ford) at 9:30. Each left an hour after arrival.

# GOVERNOR OPENS BUDGET SESSION

## Pim Report Regarded as "Incontestably Sound"

### BUDGET CANNOT BALANCE WITHOUT INCOME TAX

#### "OR SOMETHING PROBABLY LESS ACCEPTABLE"

#### His Excellency's Lengthy Review of Facts in Remarkable Story of Colony's Recovery

His Excellency the Governor was unable in opening Legislative Council yesterday to deliver his speech. He has been suffering for some time from the effects of influenza and bronchitis and his address which was an unusually long review of the economic and financial position (and is the last he will make at a Budget session) had to be read by the Clerk of Council.

The Governor set out in striking figures the remarkable advances which had been made in production during the last five years despite the depression and the gratifying extent to which the Colony had already recovered. For instance he mentioned that the domestic exports for the first eight months of this year exceeded in value the total of each of the four complete years 1931-34 while trade imports were now roughly back to the 1930 level.

Among announcements of interest were a resolution into prevention of erosion by the Economic Development Board, a proposal by a Rhodesian firm to establish a meat extract factory, negotiations with another company interested in frozen meat, a new and modified Dairy Industry Control Bill and the adoption by the Secretary of State of a settlement scheme based on small holdings for Indian Army war block officers. Suitable areas have already been selected near Nairobi, Thomson's Falls and Kitale.

Another task before the Economic Development Board is planning the proper use and development of the Colony's water resources.

The Governor was also gratified by the condition of Railway finances which by the end of August were £289,000 more than the revenue estimate. Further concessions to the public are indicated.

Government is proposing reductions in postal charges at a cost of £6,569 dependent upon the Finance Committee's examination of the Budget.

In references to the Pim Report His Excellency disposed of the suggestion that delay in publication had been deliberate or that Sir Alan Pim had been influenced in any of his recommendations by pressure from the Colonial Office.

In regard to the taxation measures His Excellency gave an assurance that constructive criticism would be welcomed by Government who would endeavour to secure the widest possible measure of agreement before giving effect to the Pim Report. That report Government regarded as incontestably sound both as regards expenditures and taxation.

His Excellency invited Council to keep in mind the needs of education, medical services and particularly defence.

Government believed that it would not be possible according to the available data to balance the Budget and ensure financial stability without the introduction of an Income Tax on the lines of the Pim Report or some other and probably less acceptable method of increasing direct taxation.

Another announcement of interest is that the present R.A.F. unit in Kenya is to be increased to the strength of a squadron and is to be permanent.

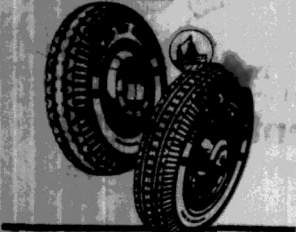
