EVEN DEPORTED BY LESOTHO King's legal adviser among those to go

Lesotho Government yesterday followed its arrest of King Moshohoe with the deportation of seven people, including the legal adviser to the King.

King Moshohoe, who is 29, was placed in "protective custody" — at first termed house arrest — at his palace after disturbances on Tuesday in which at least nine people were killed.

The King's legal adviser, Mr. Tshabo, who is also a personal friend, was born in the Orange Free State of South Africa, and was previously Acting Permanent Secretary for Justice. He was given 24 hours to leave the country.

The deportation order said his continued presence in Lesotho, an enclave in South Africa, was a danger to peace, order and good government. He is reported as having South African nationality, as prominent South African political refugees were also served with deportation orders.

Likely to be arrested

These political refugees are considered certain to be arrested as soon as they are over the border into the country.

On Tuesday night, the Prime Minister, Chief Lesobana Jonathan, accused the King and leaders of Pan-Africanist Opposition parties of causing the disturbances as part of a conspiracy to overthrow the Government by force.

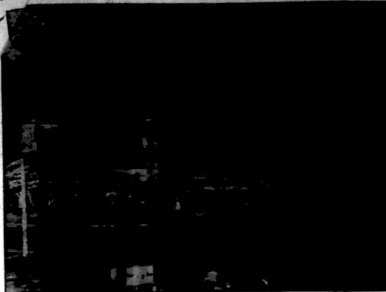

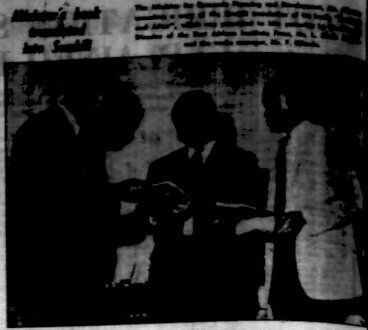

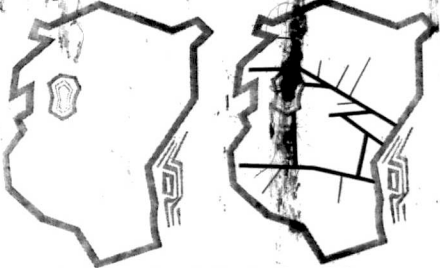

VIETCONG DECLARE TRUCE

Third ceasefire since Christmas

THE Vietcong last night declared a week's truce for the Vietnamese New Year beginning on February 8 until 0700 hours on February 15. The truce will be the third for the Christmas and New Year holiday period in the Vietnam war since December 24.

CHINA TELLS ARMY: BE READY FOR U.S. ATTACK

CHINA yesterday called for its army to be ready for a possible U.S. attack and urged troops to prepare to liberate Taiwan according to the Peking report.

ENVOY TO PEKING BECAME 'UNPERSON'

THE former Netherlands charge d'affaires in Peking, G. van Wageningen, has been declared an 'unperson' by the Chinese Government during his stay in the Peking area.

Van Wageningen was accused of espionage and of being a double agent, according to the Chinese authorities. He was arrested on January 4.

Russian spur aid as 50 life in ship

A Soviet fishing vessel turned down offers of help after 50 lives were lost in a Russian trawler.

The Russian fishing vessel 'Sudak' was wrecked off the coast of the United States in the North Atlantic on January 4. The ship was carrying 100 crew members and was bound for the United States. The vessel was struck by a large iceberg, causing it to sink. The ship's captain reported that the vessel was in trouble and requested assistance. However, the ship was not rescued and eventually sank.

The radio said its truce would last from 0700 on February 8 until 0700 hours on February 15. The truce will be the third for the Christmas and New Year holiday period in the Vietnam war since December 24.

South Vietnam and its allies reacted with surprise to the Government's fresh call to return to their villages for the celebration. Troops must be unarmed and not in groups of more than two or in military formation.

The same truce conditions would be applied by the Vietcong to American and allied forces who could usually observe the Vietnamese celebrations if they wished. But all military operations, air strikes or reconnaissance flights would be considered hostile acts.

American military officials in Saigon yesterday reported 74 Vietcong were killed in the New Year truce with a sharp increase over the number during the Christmas truce.

About 17 of the incidents were considered 'unfriendly' and 57 were considered 'friendly'.

It is believed that the truce was announced as a result of the new Vietcong strategy to reduce the number of their operations and to concentrate on the main areas of the country. This is in line with the Vietcong's long-term strategy to establish a permanent government in North Vietnam.

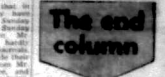

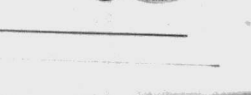

The biggest air battle of the Vietnam war was fought yesterday when seven Soviet-built MiG jet fighters were shot down by United States Air Force planes over the Red River delta in North Vietnam.

A U.S. spokesman said no American Air Force planes were shot down during the air battle. The MiGs were all brought down by F-4C Phantom IIs — the most modern operational jets in American use in the Vietnam war — and F105 Thunderchiefs.

The American planes were attacking surface-to-air missile sites in the Red River area, North Vietnam's industrial center.

This brought the number of MiGs shot down by American planes over North Vietnam to 24 since the air war began in August, 1964. There was no indication whether those shot down yesterday were MiG 17s or the more modern MiG 21s.

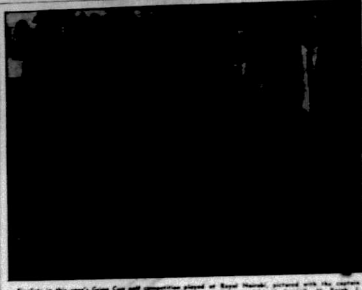

General shortage of maize denied despite drought

He was answering questions about complaints from farmers in several parts of the country that poor rains at the end of 1966 had led to the failure of maize crops in their areas. Beans, sorghum and pineapples were also said to be affected in some places.

"Over large areas, the short rains were confined to a 50-day period in early November, and amounted to only a fraction of the normal total," Mr. Mirie said. "This was not true in all areas, but in those areas where it was, the crops were affected and many crops which had started well were now suffering. 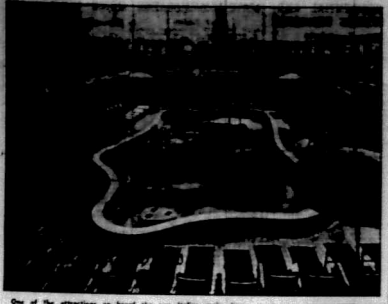

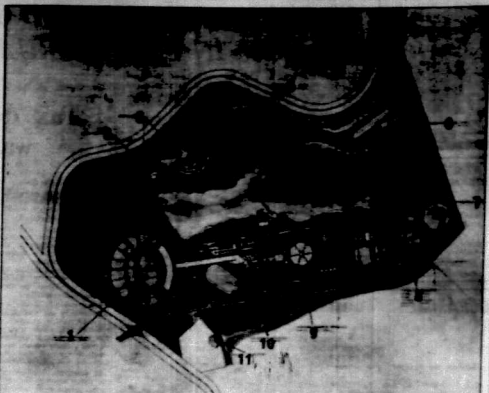

TERROR GRIPS CHINESE CITY

Fighting spreads to capital

The eastern China city of Nanjing was yesterday reported to be in a state of terror as supporters of the head of propaganda, Mr. Tao, were recently denounced by Red Guards as opposed to Chairman Mao.

According to a Japanese correspondent there has been widespread bloodshed in the city of about 1,500,000 people.

The correspondent quoted wall newspapers in Peking which he said appeared for him after 40 people had been killed and 500 others seriously hurt in the violence. Six thousand others had been arrested by pro-Tao groups, the newspapers said.

The Tao supporters were said to have cut off all water and road traffic and imposed controls on telegrams. The newspapers said the news had been broken in a telephone call by one person who had escaped from Nanjing.

Opposition in Army

Ill-health causes more loss of time than strikes

The main reason for the loss of time in industry is ill-health, according to a survey of factory workers in Kenya.

The survey, conducted by the Kenya Industrial Development Corporation, found that ill-health causes a loss of time equivalent to 10 per cent of the total working hours of factory workers in Kenya.

The survey also found that strikes cause a loss of time equivalent to 5 per cent of the total working hours of factory workers in Kenya. This is a significant finding, as it shows that ill-health is a much more serious problem for industry than strikes.

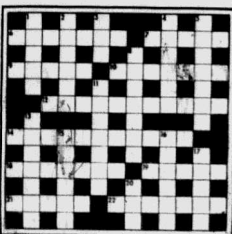
