MORE TANZANIA FIRMS NATIONALISED

Moves against other concerns expected

SWITCH IN BANKING BUSINESS
TANZANIA'S eight leading flour-milling firms were nationalised by the Government this effort from noon yesterday. This move follows the nationalisation of the country's banks at the beginning of the week. The firms affected by the latest take-over are Tanzania Millers' Charide Industries, Pure Food Products Ltd. G. R. Jirwa, Northstarred Jena, Kevla Sattar Mills (at Mbeya), Associated Traders Ltd. (at Moranga) and Kiswani Mills (at Dodoma).

Minister in Dar es Salaam said yesterday afternoon that the Tanzania Government had also acquired majority interests in a number of the country's leading industries. These were understood to include both Tanzania and Kilimanjaro Breweries, B.V.T., Tanganyika Cement Co. (Morit) Box and Bata in all of which a 50 per cent holding had been acquired. A 50 per cent holding had been acquired in the new cement factory at Wawa Hill— a 12,000-ton undertaking opened this week in which the Government held a 20 per cent interest with 10 per cent in the hands of private investors.



Kenya to set up six tourist offices overseas

Kenya Ministry of Tourism and Wildlife planned to open six offices overseas for tourist publicity and promotion, the Assistant Minister, Mr. M. Mohamed, said at a group of foreign journalists news touring Kenya.

Sponsored by the International Bank for Reconstruction and Development, the tour was arranged primarily to enable the journalists to evaluate the success achieved by Kenya in various projects financed by the Bank. The journalists are from North America, Europe and Japan. Mr. Mohamed said at the "question and answer" session that last year Kenya received about \$1,000,000 from tourists, which was Kenya's biggest earner of exchange. He added that there were any local private companies interested in building hotels in Kenya. Mr. Mohamed said that private enterprise was doing its best to promote development, but it was a question of limited funds.

DEVELOPMENT BOOST WANTED

The largest number of tourists last year came from Britain, followed by the United States. RESULTS

There were 4,019 candidates from Kenya for the Cambridge School Certificate examination in 1962, which was 712 more than the previous year. Of these 4,019 were school candidates. Government-maintained schools presented 3,369 candidates of whom 4,097 gained a full certificate, or 14.9 per cent, three per cent better than in 1962. There were 1,661 private candidates of whom 256 gained a full certificate (19.1 per cent). Of the 2,660 candidates who failed to gain a full School Certificate, 1,676 were awarded a G.C.E. While established schools like Kenya High, Alliance High, Kamukie and Nyeri High Schools, led the way with a high percentage of first divisions, new schools, in particular Kisumu, Gilgil and Ambara, showed that they can compete on equal terms.

PRESIDENT KENYATTA yesterday commissioned the *Harambee*, the first ship to be owned by the Eastern Africa National Shipping Line at Kilindini Harbour, Mombasa.

It had been announced that President Obote of Uganda would take part in the ceremony but he did not travel to Mombasa. No comment about his non-arrival was available from Kampala.

The *Harambee*, a sister to the *Uganda*, was built by Mitsui, Chiba and Nyasa. Yards started work on the ship in Kilindini by the Kenya Navy's patrol boats harbour master and one of the escorts poured on brilliant rainbows of spray at the bow of the hull.

The arrival was watched by President Kenyatta from a balcony entrance. With him were many members of his Cabinet and Uganda Ministers and officials.

Cheers from crew

More than 10,000 people lined the slopes facing the harbour entrance as the President inspected a guard-of-honour mounted by the Kenya Navy and then turned to receive the cheers of the *Harambee*'s crew as it sailed by. Cheers and offers in the harbour had been close in that workers could watch the ceremony.

Later in Kilindini Harbour President Kenyatta boarded the *Harambee* and was greeted by the chairman of the new shipping line, Mr. T. R. Mbiti, who introduced Captain P. C. Richardson and the ship's officers to him.

Dr. KAUNDA CONDEMS LUSAKA VIOLENCE

PRESIDENT Kaunda of Zambia yesterday deplored a weekend riot in Lusaka in which about 200 Africans lost their lives. He said the riot was a gross violation of the windows of a 'policy of non-interference' which he said was the basis of the Government's foreign policy.
