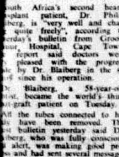

The Faculty has not only been Post-graduate training in more advanced pattern is for students who have taken a first degree and are about to take a higher degree at Makerere. There are two types of students registered for Ph.D. and M.A. degrees.

In addition to the research degrees there are a growing number of post-graduate degrees which are to be awarded by the Faculty. # Pioneer retires after 40 years in Kenya

Forty years ago a series of articles in a London paper extolling the pleasure and prospects of life in Kenya induced a young bachelor to leave a secure job in the Baltic Exchange and buy a steamer ticket to Mombasa on January 17, 1928.

The remainder of that young man's career is virtually the story of one of the biggest firms in East Africa. He is Mr. John Victor Grant, who is a Director and former Sales Manager of the Caltex company in one of the best known and most powerful figures in the oil industry in East Africa today.

Mr. Grant retired on December 31, just a fortnight before the anniversary of joining the company as a stockkeeper at Mombasa employed mainly on the building of the first sea-borne.

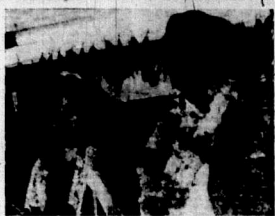

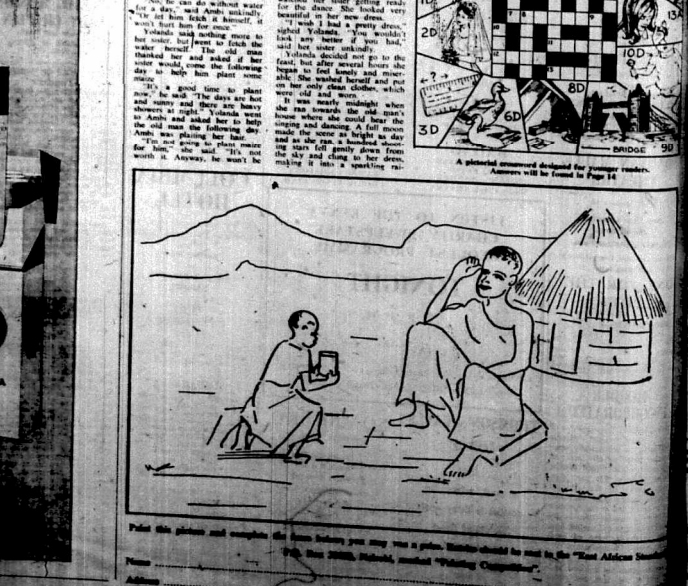

## When mother goes out to work...

Do you criticize mothers who go out to work? If you're not a working mother yourself, the chances are that you do.

For in a recent survey, 67 per cent of women whose social was bounded by their own four walls, were fondly critical of those who still went out to earn their own bread.

Such phrases as "a certain way to break up a marriage" were handed about freely, significantly, all the disapproving comments disgruntled women who spent the day at home, yet not from any one connected with the women whose habits were being criticized. In fact, their attitude was completely the opposite.

For, when husbands were questioned on a recent study organized by a British sociologist, more than half the husbands whose wives went out to work approved unconditionally.

But more than two-thirds of the husbands whose wives did not work outside the home thought a woman's place was firmly among the pots and pans.

What do the children themselves think? Opinion polls among school children showed that those whose mothers were working were in favour, while those whose mothers were not, were against.

Why mother goes to work often is gone to school and is home before 11 p.m., and one is thankful if she has been home for an hour. They had a job, and they had a job.

Why do women go to work? They have their own reasons. Some are doing it for the money. Some are doing it for the excitement. Some are doing it for the challenge. Some are doing it for the freedom.

In fact, although working mothers appear involved in their jobs, their lives are — whether they know it or not — still dominated by their roles as wives and mothers, as well as employees.

Home and family are still the focus of their interest. And their jobs are important, too. There's a very old saying that a woman can only do a job and run a home if she knows how to do both of them first. It looks as though a mighty lot of women have learned the secret.

The attention to the Tariff principally affects goods and the main changes are listed below:-

- (2) A scale 7 quantity export rate for all commodities will be introduced. In addition, except those of any commodity for export will be carried in motor vehicles, a concession on the new minimum weight conditions will be allowed for less than 100kg sugar as provided.

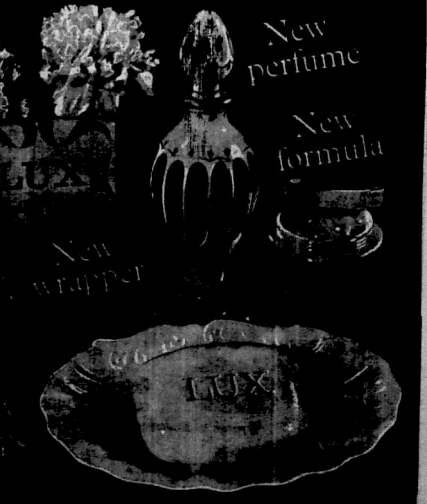

## Currency Board report

Every year since 1960, when its headquarters moved from London to Nairobi, the East African Currency Board has issued an informative annual report. The last in the series, published early in December 1967, recorded the financial activities and was the longest and most interesting.

Despite Africa's withdrawal from the former East African common monetary area and the splitting of the single currency into three currencies of Tanzania, Uganda and Kenya (all having established Central Banks) the Currency Board remains in existence. It will continue for some time to be important because of the important business transactions that it will have to be transacting.

A good deal of curiosity about the Board's decisions during the year June 1966 to June 1967 is satisfied. Normally, the annual report comes out six months or so after the end of the financial year June—but the report has come and gone without any sign of the report's publication.

Why the delay? Besides the academic interest taken in the reports, for example, in the university colleges, they have practical value for the general public. Last year's could be more interesting than that, for it would

have to cover the period when the currencies were split. How did the conversion of the currencies go? The Currency Board has been surveying the decision not to devalue currencies in East Africa although it has actively worked but clearly will be actively working in the future which are held in sterling.

In the past, the Board's reports have been surveys of transactions during the year under review, but the reports point to future policy, and have been non-controversial by nature. It is, therefore, expected, in a general sense, that the Board's present position is and how it will function during the year under review will be of interest to the public.

While among individual support was thrown behind the G.P.T. (Amendment) Bill during the debate on its Second Reading, opposition continues to mount in the country. The Government's proposal to withdraw half the G.P.T. revenue from Nairobi and Mombasa, for redistribution to county councils, is obviously an unpopular idea.

# Uganda bush medicine may provide cure for cancer

Can traditional African doctors teach anything to orthodox medicine?

The answer, it would seem, is a definite 'yes'. Dr. Donald Moody, a British doctor, has been studying the medicinal plants and their extracts in Uganda, and has discovered a 'bush medicine' in Uganda.

And although he has been the first to describe the medicinal plant, he has not yet been able to identify it. He has, however, been able to identify it as a medicinal plant which he has named 'Uganda bush medicine'.

## Awaking new talent with instant art

A new art form which is enabling young Africans to give themselves a previous experience or training to express themselves artistically has been introduced to East Africa by a young schoolteacher in Nairobi.

The form, silk screen printing, is already familiar in the world of commercial art, but it is believed to be the first time it has been used as a creative medium in East Africa, although it has long been popular elsewhere and has Picasso and Braque among its subscribers.

The teacher, Mr. Keith Harrington, has already demonstrated its wide application by producing works of considerable merit from a young Maasai from Namanga and from his first cook, neither of whom had any previous experience or training.

These two young men are part of Mr. Harrington's "club" at his home, on Salaria Road, opposite Nairobi School, where students are full time, and they spend their free time on their own projects which are supervised by the teacher.

The three behind silk screen printing are Kenyan. Patterns are set out on a sheet of stencil paper, the technique needed to make blocks or other stencils. The stencil is then laid on the mesh of paper on which the image

is to be reproduced, and the ink screen is laid on top of the stencil, inked, and a roller rolled across. The ink goes through the holes in the stencil but leaves the rest of the paper blank.

By repeating the process, using different colours and patterns on each stencil, a very complex image can be reproduced.

It can be seen that compared with more traditional forms of visual art, the technique needed to do this is relatively simple. People with no training can express themselves with the limited knowledge of how to operate a screen block and

With Augustine Apaha, a Comorian artist who met at Paris, the artist, John Wood, a teacher of Nairobi, and himself, he had the nucleus of a studio and made his first tentative steps into selling the prints.

All the work from Mr. Harrington's studio is sold at Social Arts in Waters Street, and some of it, especially that of John Lakabasha, has found a good market, notably with the German package tourists who consider they have got a bargain when they pay the 30/- or 40/- at which the prints are priced. It is being printed some of the prints take as long as 12 hours to complete.

Mr. Harrington hopes that at the present, more people will be able to put the price up to a more realistic level, especially as he intends to interest such established artists as Eli Kayunga, who lives close to the studio.

In other countries where serigraphy is established and accepted, such as the United States and Europe, the price is usually well above £10 or £15. Mr. Harrington also hopes to find a profitable market for the prints, as well as more artists to

Other participants are Joseph Apaha, a Maasai from Nairobi, Kenji Kimani, a school teacher, Mr. Harrington's two children, Kevin and Paul, and John Kimani, who has also made colourful if less polished contributions.

In common with the practice elsewhere, the world at large, more than 10,000 prints are made from each stencil, which is then destroyed. The average number of prints is 10.

This is done to increase the value of each print, to avoid the mass imitations of cheap prints, which is the danger which has done the work of the

number of identical copies there are in existence.

The wide application of serigraphy has to date not been confined by Stanley B. Mr. Harrington has named his enterprise, but it is particularly useful for reproductions on mats and trays.

Although Mr. Harrington originally came to East Africa to do maps and sketches for the Automobile Association, he has spent most of his time teaching Mr. Dar on Salaria and Nairobi.

His arrival in Nairobi coincided with the first interest in serigraphy and it is not surprising that some of the best work comes from young pupils at the school. The bold contours and striking effects which can be produced have a particular appeal to young minds.

Mr. Harrington's method, as anybody who is going to produce the artistic training (of no value) is evidenced by the fact that the materials needed to do it are cheap and easily obtained.

Anybody with some wood and an elementary knowledge of carpentry can build the simple framework for reproduction. Even the most ham-fisted amateur can create something in this medium, which among its many charms, offers that self-discovery as an art form, which is spreading all the time.

From all this it can be seen that serigraphy can introduce a new dimension to East Africa's already exciting art scene.

# G.P.T. Bill depriving towns of progress says union official

The Kenya Government should seriously reconsider its decision to take half of G.P.T. income of Nairobi City Council and Mombasa Municipal Council and to give it to county councils because it would deprive the towns of the progress they need, the general secretary of the Kenya Local Government Workers' Union, Mr. James Karube, said yesterday.

His union supported views expressed by the Association of Local Government Authorities of Kenya making the Government permanent ready to the financial situation of the county councils.

A system whereby a permanent solution could be found should be sought. Deduction of part of the G.P.T. income to subsidize county councils could help to give them a breathing space while they put their houses in order.

**Highest cost of living**  
Mr. Karube warned that there would be slow progress in the towns concerned. If Nairobi City Council raised rates and taxes people would be faced with a higher cost of living because of the impact of the deduction.

His other fear was that Mombasa Municipal Council rates were higher than those of Nairobi, and if the council raised rates further they would lose revenue as people might not be able to pay.

Mombasa was also faced with serious repercussions because urban property was on a long-term basis. The value of property was raised to meet the recession caused by the deduction of G.P.T. people would not be able to pay for it and property owners would have to take it to make a deal.

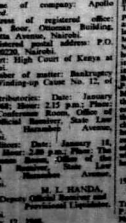

## Cautionary reports

Two Ministers have spoken this week about Kenya's economic achievements and prospects. Agriculture will hold the centre of the ring as the most important activity, though there are notable boosts in tourism and building.

Mr. McKenzie pointed out last year's anticipated surge towards farming, but that was not entirely materialised, though deliveries for most marketable products increased and he warned farmers against difficult times ahead last year began badly because of the drought, but conditions improved towards the end of the year. One of the 12 months could be coming April to which tourism picture would emerge.

Production and marketing difficulties experienced with the established crops both point to the necessity for diversification, which has been one of the Ministry's chief preoccupations, particularly with regard to crops which can be processed inside Kenya, relatively easily and without large capital investment. In this category, there are bright prospects for papaya — paw-paw juice — macadamia nuts and the export of cut flowers which will help to develop horticulture.

The disappearance of the market among British resorts formerly stationed in Aden is probably the most serious of the shifts in traditional markets. Every effort should be directed to develop trade between African countries and in this direction, the Ministry of Commerce and Industry can greatly help to push Kenya's inter-continental trade.

There is a promising market on the doorstep now that relations are returning to normal with Somalia. Trade in cattle has started and Somalia can take Kenya's farm produce, besides drawing on large quantities of factory instead of taking supplies from Europe on the long route round the Cape, while Suez remains closed.

Although Kenya is still ahead of any other country in Africa, except South Africa, an agricultural production,

Mr. McKenzie noted the rise in the contribution made by tourism to the gross domestic product of about 10 per cent of the total production in 1967 to 43 per cent last year. This factor, with its huge potential, is obviously one factor for concentration.

Naturally, Mr. Mwiba welcomed the boom in construction and tourism. As far as the building, he is concerned to reduce the costs, which have been rising steeply. 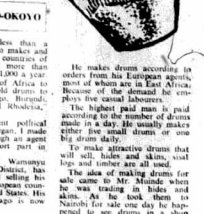
