OPPOSITION TO NEW TAXATION. MORE TENSION IN EUROPE.

Division Among Elected Members.

GOVERNMENT'S ALLEGED FAILURE TO ECONOMISE SUFFICIENTLY.

Appeal by Captain Schwartz.

OPPOSITION WOULD DO INCALCULABLE HARM TO PRESTIGE OF COLONY.

The debate on the Alternative measures of taxation took an unexpected and somewhat sensational turn in the Kenya Legislative Council yesterday when four European Elected Members and one Indian Member registered uncompromising opposition to the first of the Bills, that embodying the Graduated Poll Tax. It was indicated that this opposition would extend to all the measures and there is some reason to believe that at least one other European Elected Member and perhaps some Indians will join the group.

The main grounds of opposition are that the country is unable at present to bear any further taxation of any kind; that the Government have failed to carry out to the limit all possible economies; and that in any event, by a combination of economies and the already improving revenue position the Budget could be achieved without new taxation. It is not believed that the Government will be able to do this.

Captain H. E. Schwartz, Acting Leader of the Elected Members, dealt with the attitude of the opponents declaring that in his view without this taxation there would undoubtedly be a deficit at the end of this year and that the country should wait until the 1934 Estimates were drafted before deciding whether Government had played the game or not.

He declared that if large numbers of Members opposed the alternative measures, that opposition would do incalculable harm to the financial prestige of the Colony.

There were several somewhat heated passages during the speeches and on one or two occasions Members had to be called to order.

Mr. Conway Harvey, a supporter of the measures, declared: "If we vote against this we shall show a clear sense of irresponsibility and be classed as posters until to be entrusted with further control of the Colony's finances."

Colonel Kirkwood suggested as one measure of economy abolition of the office of Governor.

Colonel Durham suggested as a compromise that the Bill should be made effective only until the end of 1938 with an assurance that the whole position would then be reviewed.

Mr. Abdul Wahid claimed that the rights of his community have been sacrificed and maintained that they preferred Income Tax.

Mr. O'Shea charged the Government with preferring to sacrifice the country in the interests of an alien bureaucracy and with failing to produce constructive measures to improve the economic position. He discussed the recent controversy as "an organized snarl."

The debate will be continued to-day.

"A Breach of Faith."

FRENCH ANXIETY OVER RECENT INCIDENTS.

Important Initiative.

CONCERTED ACTION SUGGESTED TO AVOID FURTHER TROUBLE.

Leaflets dropped into Austrian territory by German aeroplanes, and attacks on Dr. Dollfus, the Austrian Premier, by German broadcasting stations, are the latest incidents in the strained relations between Germany and Austria.

Effect of Income Tax Decision.

Governor's Speech to Council.

CIVIL SERVICE CONDITIONS PRIMARY MATTER FOR SECRETARY OF STATE.

Addressing the Uganda Legislative Council this week, His Excellency the Governor, Sir Bernard Bourdillon, in a reference to the recently appointed Committee of Enquiry into the organization of the Department, from the point of view of economy, declared he had come to the definite conclusion that the comprehensive enquiry into Government expenditure sought by a section of the public, was neither necessary nor justifiable.

He declared he did not believe there was anyone in the country who would suggest that a further reduction of Government services was desirable, or on the contrary he had been told that such reductions had gone too far.

His Excellency asserted that if it happened to be proved at the pace at which it ought, the expansion of certain services would unquestionably be necessary as soon as it was financially practicable.

Nevertheless he was fully alive to the necessity for exploring all possible measures for economy. The Committee appointed, he explained, was never intended to be a permanent body. It will continue its work until appointed for a definite purpose only.

Replying to critics of the restricted terms of reference of the Committee, the Governor maintained that changes in salaries and service conditions of European officials were primarily a matter for the Secretary of State who had no authority in the matter.

Discussing the taxation position, His Excellency reminded the Council that despite the abandonment of Income Tax the Government's main object remained—the task of putting taxation on a sounder footing. He stressed that the tax on the non-native was unduly light when compared with that of the African. The task of overhauling the system was not to be abandoned.

Purpose of Finance Enquiry.

His Excellency stated in his opinion, particularly in the light of the fact that development is to be promoted and that it is necessary to provide the expansion of certain services will unquestionably be necessary as soon as it is financially practicable.

The Kenya Enquiry. The new taxation measures were read a first time at the session of the Kenya Legislative Council which opened in Nairobi yesterday.

In his address His Excellency the Acting Governor said that as the measures had been sanctioned in response to unofficial representations he assumed any official criticisms would be confined to matters of detail and not of principle.

He announced that he was still in communication with the neighbouring Governments regarding the Landing Tax and the Packages Tax Bills and in the meantime exemption clauses would be inserted in the Kenya legislation so far as they affected residents of Uganda and Tanganyika and packages imported from those territories.

His Excellency was in the happy position of reporting maintenance of the improvement in Customs, Railway and Harbour finances and in the general outlook of the Non-Native Poll Tax estimated would probably not be reduced.

In regard to the new graduated Poll Tax, which he said, would depend on whether the public as a whole met or evaded its obligations.

He expressed the prospect that the 1953 deficit would be less than estimated.

At the same time the general situation was such that Kenya could not indulge in any undue optimism.

Expects No Opposition to Principle.

A motion of the Kenya Legislative Council was passed by the Assistant Acting Governor in the Memorial Hall, Nairobi, yesterday.

The introduction of the general taxation measures is expected to be approved by the Members of the Council.

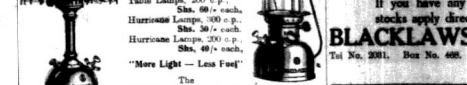

Useful Recipe. REAL FRUIT COMPOTE.

WHAT is the difference between a Compote of Fruit and an ordinary "Stewed Fruit," often called "Compote"? There is a big difference. The compote is delicately and carefully made so that both the color and the shape of the fruit are retained, whereas both are lost in the "stew." The compote the sugar is made in the syrup and the fruit is cooked in this until it is tender, but is not allowed to break. The fruit must be ripe, carefully washed and dried, and then put in a sieve, but it certainly will not do for a Compote. To make the compote, you should have half a pound of lump sugar, a pint of water, and a little salt. The sugar should be dissolved in the water, and cooked in the syrup until tender but still white. When the apples are taken up, reduce the quantity of sugar by further boiling, sharpen it by the addition of lemon-juice, and rub it pink with cochineal. The compote is made in the same manner as the usual fruit compote, but with the addition of a little salt and a little sugar. The apples should be sliced and the sugar should be added and their flavor will be improved. The compote should be served in a short time in lemon juice. 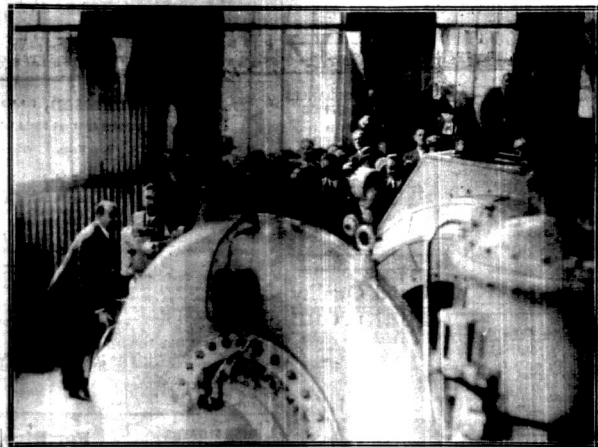

Commercial View on Railway Problems.

OPPOSITION TO THE GIBB REPORT PROPOSALS.

High Commissioner Alternative.

TRANSFER OF POWERS TO A COMMISSION OF THREE GOVERNORS.

A firmly worded memorandum on the Gibb Report on railway finance has been adopted by the Association of Chambers of Commerce of Eastern Africa for submission to the Governor of Kenya in his capacity as High Commissioner for Transport. It sets out the views of the Kenya section of the Association.

Points in the memorandum are—

1. A protest against the reflection cast by Mr. Roger Gibb on members of the Railway Advisory Council.
2. A proposal to transfer the powers and duties of the High Commissioner to a Transport Commission consisting of the Governors of the three territories.
3. Opposition to Mr. Gibb's proposal that rates should be increased and an expression of belief that the only way to improve railway finance is to increase production.
4. Preferential treatment to goods of local produce and manufacture.
5. Opposition to separation of the Railways from the Government while the latter carry responsibility for railway loans.
6. Continuity of policy and no radical changes during the present period of economic readjustment.
7. The General Manager to be a member of the Legislative Council of Kenya and Uganda, where railway matters are being discussed.
8. Avoidance of rate wars at competitive points in East Africa.
9. Elimination of motor competition with main trunk line.

The Association also strongly opposed the appointment of a Railway Board in London.

The view was expressed that the Harbour Advisory Board should continue to function as a separate organisation.

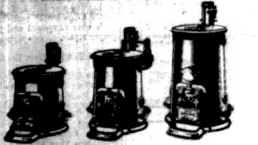

Sequel to Tragedy in Tanganyika.

DEATH IN BUSH OF YOUNG EUROPEAN.

Enquiry Ordered.

REPRESENTATIONS MADE TO THE COLONIAL OFFICE.

The disappearance and subsequent death in the bush near Bahi, Tanganyika, in October of last year of Basil Napier, a 20-year-old transport worker, has resulted in the Colonial Office ordering an enquiry on the spot into the circumstances surrounding the tragedy.

This action by the Colonial Office has been taken as a result of representations made by Mrs. Napier, the mother of the deceased. She has never been satisfied that adequate steps were taken by the police in regard to the search and the further alleges that her son was the victim of an attack by natives.

Allegations of Murder.

London, July 28. (By WIRELESS.) The Colonial Office has ordered an enquiry on the spot into the death of Basil Napier, the 20-year-old transport worker who was lost in the bush near Bahi, Tanganyika, in October of last year. Mrs. Napier's enquiries have been taken as a result of representations made by her to the Colonial Office.

She alleges that it was her son's sole duty to look after the motor car which she had left in the bush near Bahi, and that she was informed by her son that he had been killed by a tiger.

It is stated that Mrs. Napier is now in London, and that she has written to the Colonial Office asking for an enquiry to be made into the circumstances of her son's death.

A CANADIAN LOAN.
