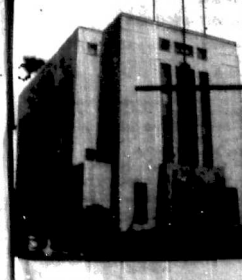

## RHODESIA: NOW WAR SAYS U.K. Mr. Bottomley gives pledge to Press

**STANDARD STAFF REPORTER**  
London.  
"I AM not going to war" Britain's Commonwealth Secretary, Mr. Arthur Bottomley, said when speaking on Rhodesia yesterday at a lunch given by the Commonwealth Correspondents' Association in London. An Asian journalist asked the Minister why Britain could not use its troops in Rhodesia as it had in other dependencies and was this not because of the large White minority.

The Minister replied that the difference between Rhodesia and other colonies was that, in the case of the latter, Britain did not have paramount control. For the past 40 years the Civil Service, the police and the armed forces had been in local hands.

The Minister told his questioner that what he was asking would amount to a full-scale military operation. "I want us to go to war on this matter, I am not going to war. War offered no solution. The only hope lay in a peaceful settlement."

The Minister tacitly conceded that President Nyerere had a point in dismissing from the Rhodesian section of the United Commonwealth. The Minister confirmed that the Tanzania President had failed to get from the British Government a clear commitment that power would be transferred only on the basis of majority rule.

**Rare period of harmony**  
All that Mr. Bottomley would say was that independent Rhodesia could be granted only on a basis acceptable to the majority of the people. Dr. Nyerere would find this more acceptable than the form of the Commonwealth.

Dr. Nyerere said yesterday that Mr. Bottomley did not want to say anything which might disrupt the rare period of harmony which London and Salisbury had enjoyed. It was "clear that the British Government are enjoying the full advantage of the breathing space the majority of African States conceded at the Commonwealth Conference of African States convened at the Minister emphasised that it would be for Britain to decide whether or not to resume a conference progressing satisfactorily and whether a conference should be called.

# More American Maize on Its Way

## 250,000 bags due at end of month

A second commitment of 250,000 bags of maize is on its way by July from America and is due at Mombasa at the end of this month. The general manager of the Maize Marketing Board, Mr. E. A. Andre, announced in Nairobi yesterday.

Mr. Andre had just returned from America where he completed negotiations for a further 300,000 bags of yellow maize for Kenya, in addition to the cargo of 150,000 bags which is in process of being distributed throughout the country to relieve a severe food shortage in some areas.

The urgency with which the Government regards the shortage is demonstrated by the fact that in just over a week, the Kenya representation negotiated the purchase of maize, chartered a vessel and had it loaded with 250,000 bags.

The remainder of the amount required for maize is expected to be loaded at New York on July 23 and to arrive at Mombasa at the end of the month.

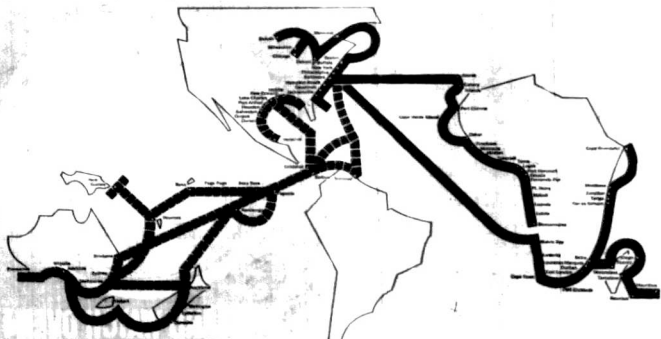

# Go to court, hears 'veins' on runners

Government specialist pathologist, Dr. Geoffrey Timms, told the Supreme Court in Nairobi yesterday how he carried out two of the autopsies on the two men charged with the murder of a Kenyan M.P., Mr. Pio Gama Pinto.

Later on May 13 the doctor went to Kamiti Prison to examine Thuo. Thuo again refused to run up and down the court-yard of the prison.

"He was not running," the doctor said. After Thuo had run leisurely for about 200 yards he came back and the doctor saw on him an enlarged vein which was visible.

# Water-mind theory Kanu take-over

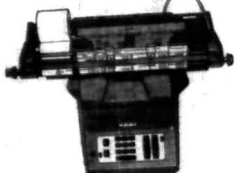

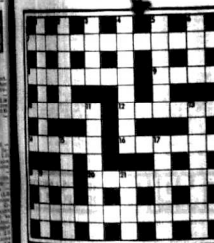

# KENYA PLAN'S AIM WILL BE INCREASED TO 6.2 P.C.

Kenya's 1956-61 Six-Year Development Plan is to be revised to provide an average annual growth rate of 5.4 per cent, up from 4.7 per cent in the original plan, the Minister for Economic Planning and Development, Mr. J. N. Mbowja, announced in Nairobi on the weekend.

Answering questions by students of the International Press Institute at University College, Nairobi, Mr. Mbowja said that in the first year of the 1954-1970 Plan, Kenya had achieved a rate of 7.4 per cent which was above the target by 2 per cent.

The Minister attributed this increase to the good prices Kenya had obtained for her agricultural produce, especially coffee, and the substantial output in industrial products which the country had made since independence. Mr. Mbowja forecast an even greater growth because private investors from both East Africa and overseas had made contributions in Kenya since the publication of the second Paper No. 10 on African Socialism.

### Communist approach unsuitable

Replying to another question, Mr. Mbowja said that the difficulties believed in indiscriminate nationalisation and Communist ownership of the means of production. This approach to Socialism was not suitable in Kenya. It was certainly not true in the context of Kenya.

Mr. Mbowja said the Government was capable to control, direct and supervise the production of goods and services in Kenya. He said the Government believed that private industry had an important role to play in the development of the country, controlled and supervised by the Government to ensure that industry met private investment to exploit the potentialities of Kenya.

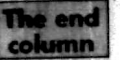

Uganda could also promote world peace and progress by getting an example within the last seven months the Government had gone a long way towards achieving the goals set out by the President in his speech from the Chair in Parliament last year.

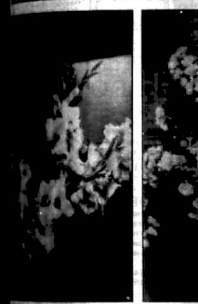
