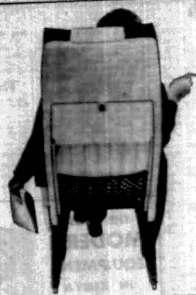

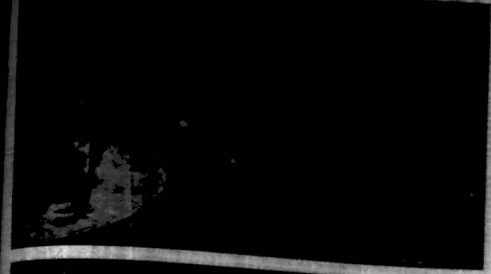

# East African Invasion of Pakistan

## INDIA GAINS THREE-PRONGED PUSH HEADS FOR KEY CENTRE OF LAHORE

India and Pakistan were in the grips of an unrelenting war last night after India had launched a three-pronged invasion of West Pakistan from the Punjab, Kashmir offensive, a counter to the fighting which has been raging in Kashmir, and towards the key communications centre of Lahore — and there were uncounted reports last night that the airport there had already been captured.

However, an official Pakistani spokesman said that the Indian advance had been contained. "He claimed that the Pakistan Army was 'in full and effective control of the situation'."

A state of Emergency was declared in the country yesterday and army and air force units were called up after President Ayub Khan had declared in a radio broadcast: "We are at war with India." But neither side had formally declared war last night and an Indian Government spokesman stated emphatically that the country was not at war with Pakistan or its people from Karachi, the Pakistan Government said it was fully prepared to deal with the situation and could involve the U.N. Charter in support of its position. President Ayub Khan said in his broadcast: "God in His mercy will grant success."

Explaining the attack on West Pakistan, Indian Defense Minister Mr. Chavan, told Parliament it was quite apparent that Pakistan's next move would have been an attack on the Punjab across the international frontier. Indian troops had, therefore, moved across the border to prevent India's own territory.

**Battle reports confused**  
Reports from the Lahore battlefield last night were confused, with India saying the operations were proceeding "according to plan" while Pakistan claimed counter-attacks had recaptured several areas.

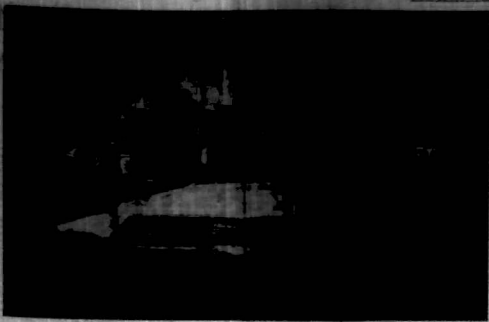
