HOW'S A BIG-MONEY EVENT

A.S.K. all set for another record

Another show record as its target, the Agricultural Society of Kenya is receiving the enthusiastic support of exhibitors in the area at Jamburi Park who have been spending money on an unprecedented scale to make this year's Nairobi Show a really big-money event.

The Show opens today and continues until Saturday. The official opening is to be performed tomorrow by President Kaunda of Zambia.

The society has spent some £14,000 on improvements—nearly twice as much as in previous years, and this figure does not include the improvements made to the park for the Jamburi Celebrations last year. In the Trade Area, however, new building and expansion by stand-holders runs into tens of thousands of pounds, and most of them have spent more time than usual preparing for the Show.

Today is Trade Day and close competition is expected for the major prizes in the Trade Section. There is no question about it—the trade people are simply heading this year, the society's president, Mr. R. A. Wilson, said last night. "I have seen equipment here that I have not seen the like for many years."

Complete return of confidence

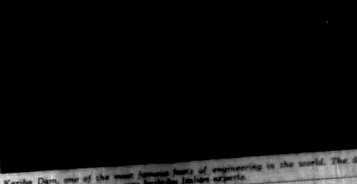

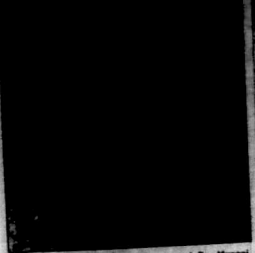

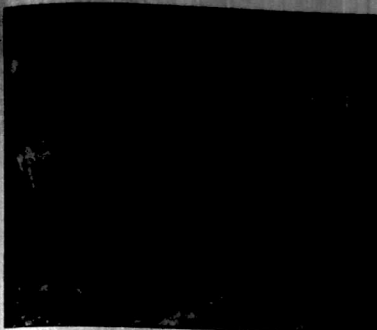
