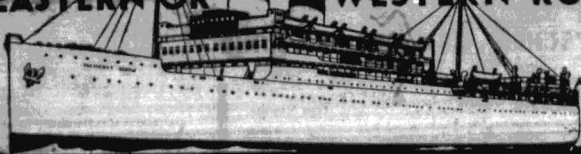

Saar Plebiscite : Huge Vote for Germany

MAJORITY OF 90.7 PER CENT. FOR RESTORATION

Total Poll of 528,005

HITLER'S DESIRE FOR INTERNATIONAL SOLIDARITY AND WORLD WELFARE

The result of the plebiscite to decide the future of the Saar, announced yesterday morning, was of an overwhelming majority of votes in favour of restoration with France.

The figures show that out of a total electorate of 539,541, no fewer than 477,109 voted for Germany, compared with 46,416 for the status quo and only 2,154 for union with France.

Here Hitler, in a broadcast speech after learning the result, declared that Germany had no more territorial claims against France and the time had come for "appeasement and reconciliation."

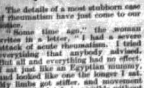

Instanbul, Jan. 9

WHEN considering the use of a pick-up in conjunction with a separate amplifier, it is at the LP stages of an existing receiver, the greatest possible care must be exercised to prevent distortion through the overload of the final stage.

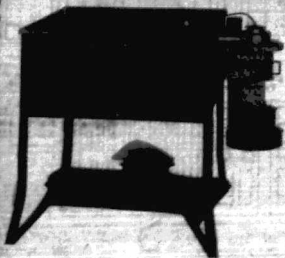

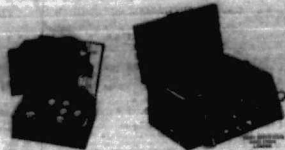

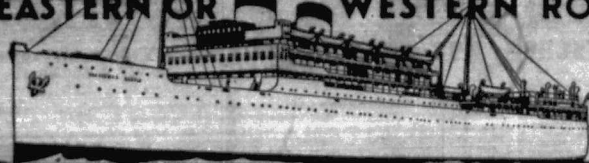

Story of the Massacre of French Troops

ATTACKED AND KILLED BY 800 BANDIT TRIBESMEN

No Official Action to be Taken

AMMUNITION EXHAUSTED; OFFICER'S DEATH IN HAND-TO-HAND FIGHT

Paris, January 25. — The massacre of French troops which was reported yesterday took place near the scene of a recent encounter between Italy and Ethiopia. The Minister for the Colonies will shortly issue a communique describing in full the circumstances, meanwhile official circles decline to comment on the matter but it is described by the "Echo de Paris" as a simple act of banditry.

Paris, later. — The communique has now been issued by the Colonial Office. It reveals that the incident occurred in the region of Dikil near Lake Abba. A French officer called Bernard was on a tour of inspection accompanied by 16 native levies and 58 Inas (Somali tribesmen). They were attacked and killed by Assamara tribesmen.

TEN SWORD WOUNDS

Apparently a party of Assamara had been raiding French territories and Bernard was intending to cut off their retreat when he was attacked by another band of Assamara, about 800 in number. He and his band kept off the attackers for two hours, then the ammunition being exhausted a hand-to-hand fight took place in which Bernard was killed. He had over 10 sword wounds on his head.

Although the French suggested that he would only have 25 years of life to live, he was actually 40 years of age. The Minister for the Colonies has proposed that he be posthumously awarded the Legion of Honour. The Government has cited him as National Officer, paying a glowing tribute to his heroism.

NO OFFICIAL ACTION

The incident is officially regarded as a battle between two tribes, the Inas living on the French side of the frontier and the Assamara on the Abyssinian side, both of whom are continually fighting each other. The French Government do not intend to take any diplomatic action as they recognise that the Abyssinian Government cannot be held responsible for sporadic outbursts on the confines of the kingdom.

Strong forces of police have been despatched to the spot. It will be recalled that in 1932 15 Assamara armed with spears and swords killed a number of Inas but were routed leaving 60 dead.

Story of Sea Barrow

Details of the massacre of the French officer and troops at the spot at Dikil are related by the sea service.

It states that a strong force of Assamara attacked a boat of Inas a common occurrence between warlike nomads after the month of Ramadan.

Machine Gun Jammed

Bernard (the French officer) happened to the scene but was unsuccessful in stopping the onslaught. The Assamara was attacked his force and when the machine gun was jammed by the French officer, the tribesmen were able to wipe out the troops completely. About 50 Assamara were also killed.

Amplification hurried to the spot but the Assamara occupied camps on the frontier.
