An odious lie designed to cover an act of veritable piracy," reads a denial by the Abyssinian Government of the Italian allegation that two Italian airmen were beheaded by the Abyssinians.

A semi-official statement issued in Rome concerning the air bombardment on the Somali front admits that "during the bombing a bomb fell on a tent of a Swedish Red Cross detachment and it seems that two Swedish women were killed." The tent is stated to have been one of reprisals for the alleged murder and beheading of an Italian air pilot.

An official denial is given of the charge against the Italians of using poison gas.

BRITAIN'S £40,000,000 CINEMA BILL

18,000,000 Tickets a Week Sold

STATISTICAL SURVEY

One of the "Wonders of the Century"

By Mr. M. J. M. (By Air Mail)

Some astonishing facts with regard to the cinema industry in Great Britain were revealed yesterday by Mr. S. Rowson, President of the British Cinematograph Society, at a statistical survey of the industry presented to the Royal Statistical Society.

Mr. Rowson describes the cinema as "one of the most wonderful wonders of the century."

His paper is the first attempt made by the society to deal with facts and figures relative to the recreations and amusements of Great Britain. The figures given show that:

The people of Great Britain in 1925 spent £40,000,000 on going to the cinema.

They bought 807,000,000 tickets of admission and paid, on an average, just over 23s. for each ticket.

Cinema in Great Britain in that year totalled 4,200, 70 per cent being smaller than the average cinema, the average seating 1,000 or under.

In the year ended March 31, 1925, 667 "palaces" for "long films were registered, numbering 4,200,000 seats.

Of these 120,000 were British, totalling 1,180,000 seats, or 28 per cent of the whole.

Each British film was screened on an average 1,420 times. The corresponding foreign film average was 4,800.

£8,000,000 Duty

Of the £40,000,000 paid at the box-offices the Government received 6,800,000 in entertainment duty.

Exclusion of duty, and other per cent of admissions were not exceeding 42, and another 84 per cent, or not more than 104.

In other words, four out of every five people visiting the cinema pay 1s. or less for their seats.

On the average 14,500,000 tickets are sold each week. There is, however, a considerable seasonal fluctuation.

Mr. Rowson points out that the decline in the cinema returns is caused not only by the competition of outdoor attractions, but by the fact that distribution is failing to release their best films in the autumn.

Thirty Visits a Year

The admission figure of 807,000,000 in the year gives an average of nearly 23 visits to the cinema a year by every man, woman and child in the country.

Actually Mr. Rowson considers that the figure is "very much higher" than 20 visits a year for each person.

Over the whole country there was, at the end of 1924, a cinema for every 10,000 persons in the population and one cinema seat for every 16 persons.

Mr. Rowson expresses surprise at the proportion of small cinemas, pointing out that there were 218 seats in the smallest cinema and 1,000 in the largest.

He also points out that the cinema industry is one of the few which has not only survived but prospered since the war.

CARE OF CHILDREN: PROTECTION OF GIRLS

To the Editor, "E.A. Standard." Sir—I venture to submit the following suggestion for the consideration and support of your readers and I trust the worthy members of the East Africa Women's League who brought this matter up in their committee will all try to see to bring it into being.

In view of the growing tendency amongst the natives (both in Kenya towards ornamental assault on our young girls, I do feel the time has come when we should take every step in our power to prevent this.

One such step would be to install Native women servants in all Native schools on the girls' side. There is far too much risk taken in allowing these girls to be employed in this work. Such provisions in our schools would be a great help to our young girls.

A further step, I submitted to our District Commissioner to press for, is that all schools, private or otherwise, where our girls attend must employ Native women servants.

I would suggest that half the Government funds distributed directly to African schools be earmarked immediately for the training of Native women in domestic life, instead of allowing it to be used for religious instruction purposes before an African that formed the first essentials of civilized life.

It seems the choice as clearly as President Roosevelt's message determined in his preference that at any time since the war."

The "Daily Telegraph" says that if adopted President Roosevelt will mark a profound change in the permanent policy of the United States. "Mr. Baldwin once declared by a narrow margin himself to be in extreme sections policy all he knew with the United States was going to be the policy the British Government will now know. What is even more to the point is that the League will be the line of demarcation between the two policies. The League-Abyssinia war Geneva will be gratified by the other side of the Atlantic.

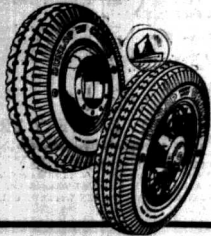

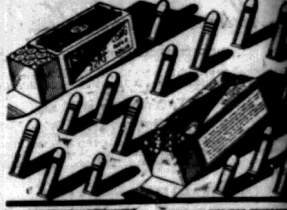

The Problem of Agricultural Debt

INTERIM REPORT BY THE SPECIAL COMMITTEE

Scheme for Short Term Needs

MACHINERY TO DEAL WITH DEBTORS' DIFFICULTIES ON VOLUNTARY BASIS

The Committee appointed by the Government of Kenya in September to report upon the possibility of lightening the burden of agricultural indebtedness has issued an interim report for the purpose of which is to emphasize the urgent need for the early introduction of a scheme of short term credit.

The Committee recommends that from the proposed £300,000 addition to the Land Bank capital, £200,000 should be earmarked to provide this short term assistance to farmers and planters who apply for it.

Details of the machinery for dealing with these applications are given and include the establishment of local committees and a Central Conciliation Board.

An applicant to a local committee is at once given the benefits of a "stay order" which is to be examined. Thereafter the facts of his case will be placed before the Conciliation Board and the continuation of the "stay order" depends on whether a majority of its creditors agree to the proposed adjustment of the farmer's affairs. Should they not do so a "stay order" can be granted and the ordinary legal remedies will be open to creditors and creditor. In any event these "stay orders" are only temporary and the farmer has a period of four years in which the creditors decide otherwise.

### Conclusion Reached

The machinery proposed to deal with short term. There is the possibility of a consolidation board of five members, one of whom is to be drawn from the Land Bank Board, with one of H. M. M. Jones as chairman, the appointment in various districts of local committees composed of the District Commissioners as chairman and two members of farming and business ability. The proposal is suggested in that when a farmer desires to borrow it is necessary for him to obtain assistance he will apply to the local committee, stating his requirements and filling a certificate by its individuals which will be open to inspection by any of the local committees. On receipt of the certificate the chairman of the local committee will call a "Buy Order" over the whole proceeds of the applicant. This will have the effect of temporarily vesting the property in the local committee, pending the application to make delivery and any agreement with the local committee with the approval of the Land Bank. The chairman of the local committee may also appoint a person to visit the applicant's farm and report on his assets. At the meeting of the local committee the position of the applicant's affairs will then be discussed and the conditions under which in the Committee's opinion an equitable adjustment is possible, a certificate could be arranged will be drawn up. This certificate is then to be referred to the Consolidation Board, but before this is done every opportunity is to be taken of discussing the position with the applicant and his creditors.

### Buy Order

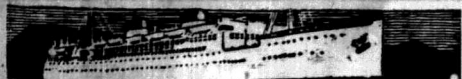

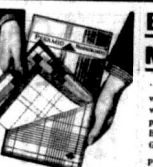
