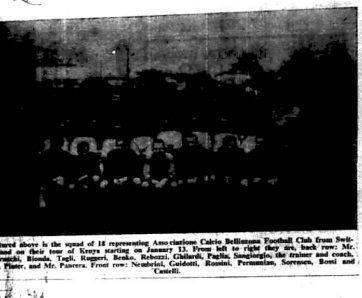

The K.E.C. had been informed of the closure of the Globe by a representative of Grand Theatres Ltd. who was accompanied by a representative of the K.E.C. Afrikaners worried over immigration

South Africa's population explosion will bring into the 21st century with 200,000,000 more Africans than Africa as it is today. This widening gap between the numbers of Whites and Africans in the continent has led to an outpouring of articles and books which have established an old argument for South Africa's immigration policy.

Notably, South Africa has preferred to take its immigrants from the Protestant nations of Europe, especially the United Kingdom, Germany and Belgium. Known in South Africa as the "White Paper" or "White Paper on the Standards or other countries."

But it is the Catholic countries of Italy, Portugal and Spain which have provided the biggest number of immigrants to recent years, and this has caused much concern among the Afrikaners. They are worried because of the fact that the immigrants from the Mediterranean countries could change the Protestant character of the nation.

Catholicism in South Africa constitutes 6.2 per cent of the total population, but the percentage of Catholics among the Whites in the past three years was 21 per cent.

Afrikaners comprise about 60 per cent of the White population, and are alarmed at the steadily rising proportion of Catholics in their own country and their own language. They are determined to do everything in their power to counter any threat to their status.

Most of them as Afrikaner political commentators have called the Catholic threat, the "Afrikanerisation" of the White population. They are aware of the fact that far more immigrants are absorbed into the English-speaking community than into their own.

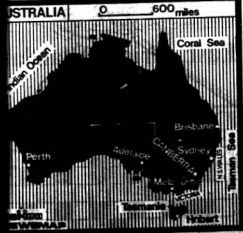
