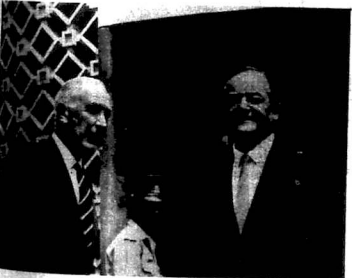

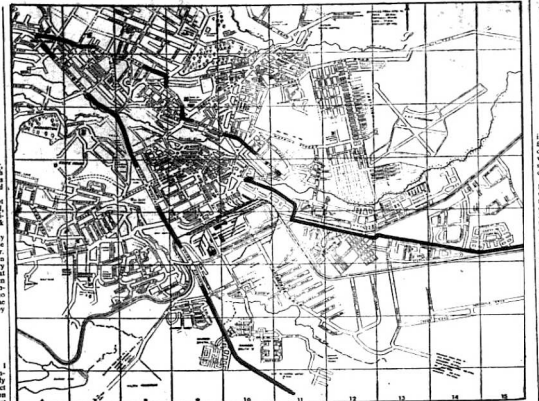

## Plot to murder President Tito uncovered
