## 500 die as earth tremors rock Sicily

More than 500 people were killed in earthquakes which rocked western Sicily on Sunday and again yesterday, according to Italian radio reports.

At least 200 were believed killed in the village of Montenegro, and rescue teams said the mountain town of Gibleina was razed to the ground. Reports that hundreds of homes had been flattened arrived in Palermo from other towns.

Villages were reduced to rubble, as though bombed. Bridges were destroyed and some villages were accessible only by foot.

Over 100,000 people were evacuated and many were housed in camps. The first tremors forced the people out of their homes, and thousands were lightly injured. Reports the night heeded around camp fires in sub-freezing temperatures.

### Communications badly hit

Communications between Sicily and the mainland were almost completely cut off. A Post Office spokesman said all but one telephone line was out of order and communications inside the island were chaotic.

Telegrams from Palermo and villages by Salemi (15,300), Giardini (10,000), Santa Maria (12,000), Montenegro (12,000), and other towns were completely cut off.

At least 100,000 people were evacuated and many were housed in camps. The first tremors forced the people out of their homes, and thousands were lightly injured. Reports the night heeded around camp fires in sub-freezing temperatures.

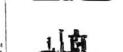

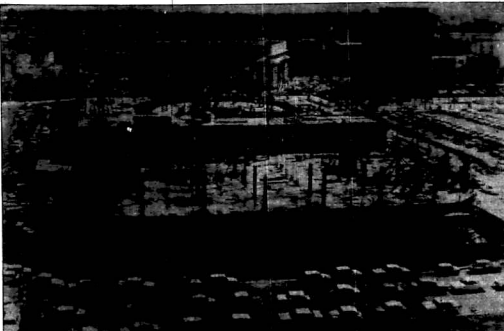

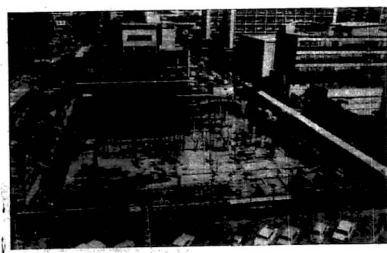
Impressive strides are being made on the construction of the Agricultural Development Corporation building which will be 12 stories high and will cost about 250,000 shillings. It will not only provide office accommodation but will also be available for renting to commercial firms. Work is also well ahead on the East African Power and Lighting Company's building which will be about 100 feet high and will cost 2,000,000 shillings. The main section of the building will be a ground floor for retail shops and a second floor for offices. The new Nairobi Hotel is also well advanced and is expected to cost 10,000,000 shillings.

It is these three aspects that Africans will have to penetrate business world in numbers. 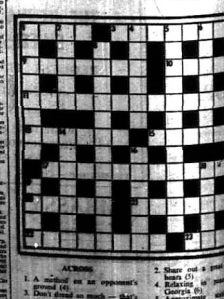

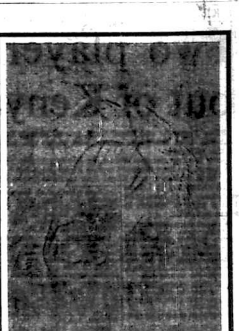

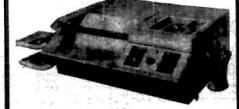

# Versatile products will boost Kenya a agriculture

This supplement marks a key industry in Kenya — the manufacture of P.V.C. piping. Edson Plastics of Kenya Ltd. is making the pipes which will considerably reduce costs in agricultural irrigation and rural water supplies. Major participation in the firm by African shareholders is planned as well as its profit-making capacity has been established.

The primary motivation was the volume of work the scope for a small enterprise. A few years ago, the growth of the country's agricultural sector was the starting point of the idea. 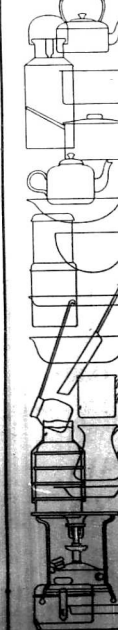

# P.V.C. PIPES PROVE WORTH

## IN KENYA'S RURAL AREAS

It is proposed to use P.V.C. pipe in several new schemes being planned by the Water Development Department of the Kenya Government.

Although the material has not been available throughout the country in recent years it is only now that it has been made available in a way which makes it possible for the Water Development Department to use it in a number of schemes in Kenya.

It is now 27 miles of such pipe has been laid.

The material is made of a high quality resin material from which pipes are made which can

withstand most shocks short of deliberate breakage.

Used properly, it is cheap and easy to install and will give years of service since it has many advantages over steel piping and a longer life.

Indeed it generally has double the life of steel piping which is in common use in a period of 10 to 20 years, and in some parts of Kenya — at the Coast or in the vast areas covered by Black Cotton soil — it can be destroyed even quicker.

Another big advantage over steel is the comparative lightness of P.V.C. which means a great saving in transport costs when considering installations remote from Nairobi.

In early days P.V.C. piping was joined by the conventional method of threaded sockets, just as steel, but this meant that it was no quicker to fit and required the special tools for thread cutting, which had to be kept on the job.

### Faster rate

The new cemented joint which is performed at the factory and cemented in the field has greatly increased the speed of installation, so that up to three miles per day can be laid by an experienced team.

In recent years a number of rural piping schemes have been completed in various farming areas, notably in Kitengwa and Bungoma, using P.V.C. piping almost exclusively. In one scheme alone the aggregate of steel from 1 1/2 to 5 1/2 miles to about 7 1/2 miles.

P.V.C. piping cannot be used in rocky ground or be left exposed, as for instance when crossing gullies. The technique is to insert steel in such sections and the

special moulded adaptor makes this an easy task.

Like all piping, including steel, it must be buried at least 18 in. below the surface, and sometimes deeper if stable land is traversed, but with this elementary precaution and the use of steel when connection has to be made with existing steel, a very efficient piping system will result.

P.V.C. piping when heated in boiling water becomes soft and can be bent or moulded into any shape. Fittings can be reduced to a minimum and a very neat job can be made even in the most difficult corners.

The well-known advantages of P.V.C. as a pipe or lightning conductor from corrosion and simplicity — make it an obvious choice for several functions in irrigation practice.

Where water is being supplied through pressure piping under conditions similar to those applying to normal water supply, it can be obtained and hence P.V.C. will be chosen.

As irrigation normally uses great amounts of water, the pipe used must be correspondingly large and that use of the material will extend as the sites manufactured become.

The P.V.C. pipe is also frequently used in connection with open-channel irrigation as a connection between canal and field, either through the banks by straight pipes or over the bank by pre-shaped siphons.

Without doubt, the light aluminium, quick coupling pipe for sprayer irrigation will probably be replaced by P.V.C. probably. Coupled with the use of P.V.C. stand pipes the use of steel equipment will then be confined to the sprinkler equipment.

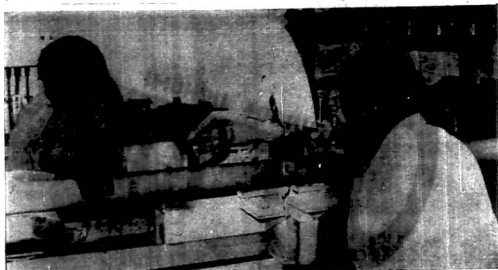


Picture of the Water Development Department joint sections of P.V.C. pipe in a rural water scheme.

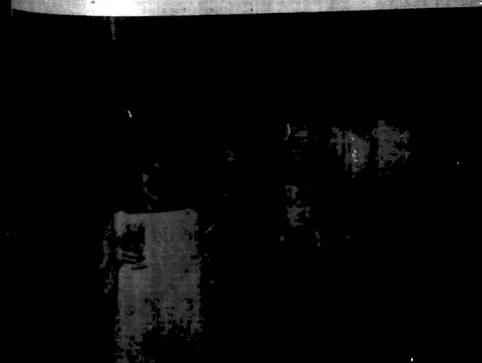

Barrington took a record partnership for the first wicket, his 50 being the 37th in Tests. He had scored 50 in the 1954-55 season.
