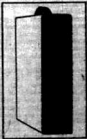

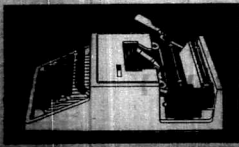

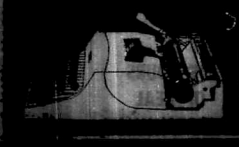

When the British Foreign Minister, Lord Home, says that British troops will be withdrawn from Kuwait in the event of a settlement of the Persian Gulf crisis, it is a statement of some significance.

When the British Foreign Minister, Lord Home, says that British troops will be withdrawn from Kuwait in the event of a settlement of the Persian Gulf crisis, it is a statement of some significance.

Lord Home expressed the belief that this new arrangement can be made with the various States which will work all the better for the absence of troops.

It is not without interest that Britain is a party to an array of treaties with these States, dating back to the early 19th century, and although such treaties have not been maintained in the Gulf, troops were not stationed there permanently until after the Second World War.

An example of the footing Britain has in the area is that of relations with Kuwait and Oman, territories overlooking about 6200 square miles to the south-eastern coast of the Arabian Peninsula at the entrance to the Gulf.

Britain intends to "modernise" relations with the Gulf States before the cessation of military forces is completed, but the form these new arrangements will take has not yet been decided.

New conflicts have recently been discovered in Oman and an annual production of 700,000 tons is anticipated. Last September, the U.N. Committee on "Columbiad" hand in Oman's affairs but Britain's representative worked out, claiming the committee had no right to decide the affairs of an independent State.

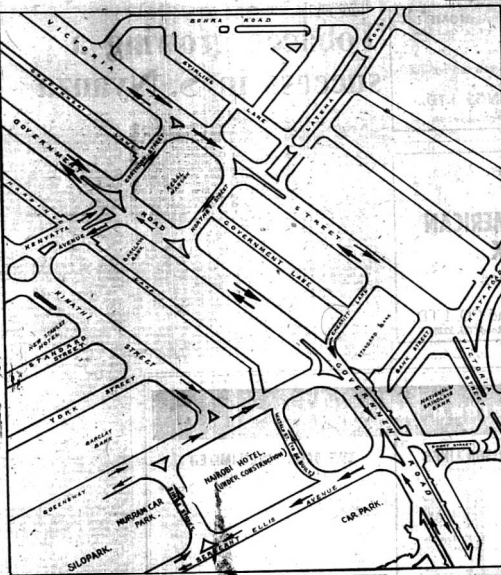
Two new roundabouts

In devising the one-way system the city planners have had to accept the problem that the traffic is rapidly overflowing the planned roads and it is not feasible to knock down buildings to make way for cars.
The construction of a major roundabout at Ngara, with other at the Fort Hill Road end of Victoria Street, is expected to speed the flow of traffic from that side of the city.
The other one-way system the Government is at present arranging bottlenecks at the junction with Donkey Street junction, in this case, the new Nairobi-Kisumu Street junction, at the Victoria Street junction, and at the Victoria Street junction, via Newmarket Street at busy intersection.

Kenya cinema dispute

There is one innumerable fact about the cinema dispute in Kenya: The Kenya Film Council is here to stay. Therefore, if the cinema are to do any business, and the public provided with entertainment, films will have to be obtained by the exhibitors through the K.F.C.

The Government has determined to continue the K.F.C. map on its decision to acquire the films. The first criterion of the distribution of films obtained from overseas is that they must be in the Indian for exhibition in the privately owned cinema. Why should motorists want to be shown where to park, whether they wish to do so or not, simply passing by, when empty bays are plain to see? No service is being rendered in the streets. When it comes to car parks, and especially the one off Othmanway, the self-appointed attendants frequently cause confusion.

They will load one car after another into an already packed parking area, manning long lines of motorists which prevent orderly arrival. They will park their cars in the wrong places, not where they have been "led into" parking lots can find themselves causing obstruction.

Street hawkers take trade from legitimate stall-holders and shop-keepers who pay their taxes honestly. They and the innumerable car park youths offer an nuisance to motorists and no advertisement for Kenya with tourism.

Security Council meets as Pueblo crisis grows

The U.N. Security Council met late last night to discuss the United States' role in the Pueblo crisis with North Korea of the intelligence ship, Pueblo, in Japanese newspapers said the U.S. nuclear aircraft carrier, Enterprise, returned back into South Korean waters.

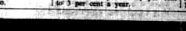

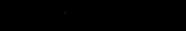

SATURDAY ESSAY

Prehistoric Hippias

Curiously, modern athletics took its origin in Mexico. The history with the Golden Age of Greece when the Olympic Games were conceived.

The Olympic Village being built in Mexico for the Games this year is at Piedras del San Angel, in an area occupied by pre-Columbian ruins from the eruption, centuries ago, of the Mexican Volc. While the work has been in progress, excavations have unearthed four pyramids, 400 skeletons, 23 houses of a civilisation which had perished long before the Spaniards came to the valley of Mexico.

One pyramid, made of mud, stands 50ft. high; the others, of a more homogeneous material, are made of volcanic ash. They were erected perhaps 200 years later. Jade necklaces have been turned up, crystal ornaments, gold sceptres, tinajas and ceramic engraved in colour, catalogued as prehistoric relics of life in the valley during the period from 700 to 100 B.C. These are not just rudimentary finds but the discovery of bank-hoard artefacts. They have a record of 2,500 years ago, a prehistoric life in the valley of Mexico. The Olympic Village is being built, and these people were affected by the same diseases as we are today.

Dr. Emilia Jacque-Mueller, who is in charge of the dig, says that in the first few low-land men called the Cuculecos lived in the narrow valley of the Rio de San Mateo. They had half-breeded, painted their bodies symbolically just like the flower people do, and wore coverings and other ornaments, also like the deer people. The Cuculecos were their hair shaved shorter and called fewer ornaments.

Why were they called Cuculecos? The word derived from the small venacular for 'bottle gourd' and it seems they bowed their hair in bottle-gourd shape. Nobody knows why or why they shaved the head but in the real paint, maturing the skin. One excavation was found to have been a

part, connected with a layer of volcanic ash. The Bothe people may not have been the ancient bank-transferring, but they had excellent knowledge of banking in filling and releasing seeds. To possess a bank in an area occupied by an inverted 'T' was a symbol of high society.

The hippie Indians and their pyramids long ago were perished when the B.C. Kite began to tumble wickedly in about 1000 B.C. The pyramids were destroyed, as were the houses, by the volcanic dust of Nevus in A.D. 79.

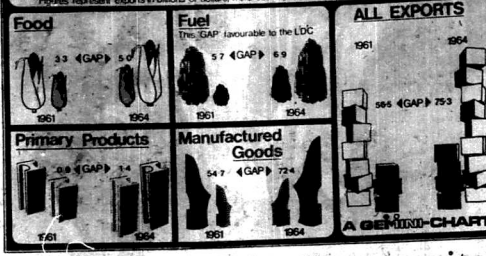
Centuries passed until the next links in the chain with modern times. The ruins of the Nahua nations of Mexico were the Tlulas, who are reckoned to have arrived from their home in the North. Today, 'the place of roots' around the fifth century A.D. These people were all but wiped out by food, pestilence and drought in the 13th century. 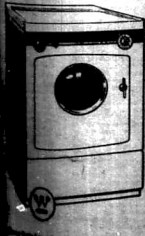

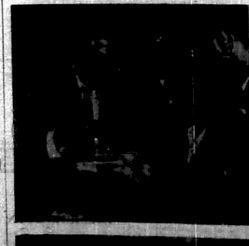

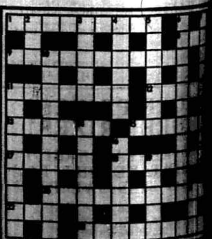

Three to die in Athi case: Two freed—then held

Three men accused of the Athi River murders were sentenced to death. Another later who had been acquitted were re-arrested. They were in face charges concerning the attempted murder of Uganda's Vice-President, Mr. Bahabika.

Abaluhya suspended for rest of this season and next

Abaluhya Football Club, the East African soccer club champions, holders of the Kenya National Football League title and the F.A. of Kenya Cup, have been suspended from all football activities with immediate effect on the whole of the 1962-63 season for boycotting the match arranged in honour of the Football Association of Kenya at the International Football Federation, St. Stanley, Rugby, and International Klusum, Flat Stars.

The decision was made on an emergency disciplinary committee meeting of the Football Association of Kenya on Sunday night and announced yesterday at a Press conference by the president of the F.A., Mr. John Kayunga. Mr. Kayunga said: "I have suspended Abaluhya of Kenya on Sunday night and announced yesterday at the 11 o'clock (dinner) for football activities shown."

However, Mr. Kayunga stressed that the suspension does not mean that the players concerned in the matter are being punished. They were allowed to join other clubs although they have their own club. Abaluhya F.C. has been suspended from all football activities shown."

BOYCOTT AFFECTS ALL OTHER CLUBS

As a result of last Friday's meeting suspending the boycott by Abaluhya F.C. of the match in honour of F.A. of Kenya, the Kenyan Soccer Association has decided not to play any club which has taken part in the boycott.

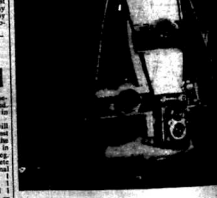
