## Jobs problem formidable says court

Kenya's most formidable problem was employment and the Government had made it abundantly clear that its policy was to increase employment, even if it meant applying some form of brake on wage increases, the Industrial Court said yesterday.

The court, consisting of the president, Mr. Isaac R. Coaker, the vice-president, Mr. Mohamed Jahan, and two members, Mr. J. C. Griffin and Mr. J. C. Molla, was making an award in a dispute between the Kenya Planting and Agricultural Workers' Union and the Kenya Tea Government Workers' Union.

It stated that the dispute affected 21,500 workers engaged in the tea industry and, as tea was one of the country's largest revenue earners, any award would be of vital importance to the economy of the country as a whole.

### Average wage earnings doubled

There were extremely far-reaching considerations at stake in the dispute. It could not be denied that people working on the level in comparison with other workers, received very inferior wages and benefits, and the claimants' arguments in this context were valid.

However, statistics issued by the Government showed that in recent years wage earnings had increased much faster than total output and wage employment. Average wage earnings had doubled since 1958 whereas the Gross Domestic Product had risen by only about 40 per cent.

And, this was expected to create hundreds of new job opportunities. It was the court's view that this prospect was not dependent in any way on the employment of tea workers. The employees had pleaded that only a "realistic" wage increase was granted would they be able to remain contented. They asked for a 10 per cent wage increase for a three-year award.

The court, however, was not prepared to grant the increase requested by the tea tea in addition to the 10 per cent wage increase. The Kenya Tea Government Workers' Union had asked for a 100 per cent wage increase. This, the court said, was not a realistic wage increase. The Government had a responsibility to the community as a whole to ensure that wages were not increased so fast that they would create inflation.

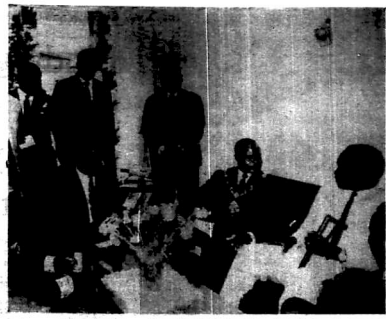

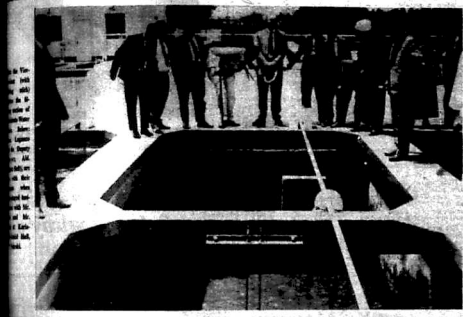

# Finding new future in Kenya fashion

Soon fashionable women wool ties in all colours will highlight the suits of Kenya's best-dressed men — if a project thought up by a Swedish nurse becomes effective.

Certainly the idea of importing handlooms from Sweden so that crumples at the Amari, Chelsope Homes can weave ties from wool as proving worthwhile from a therapeutic point of view, and the looms are creating new interest.

When a member of the staff, Mrs. Akkman, was asked to drop a few words on their hands, she would not have been surprised to find her Swedish friends, north-easterly, decided to approach Swedish welfare workers in her country.

After they organised a mission to buy the first handlooms which arrived in Kenya from Sweden a month ago.

Already four projects have started to forget their disability but have become fascinated with the new gadget, quickly learning to weave the long ties and belts from wool obtained in Kenya.

One of the weavers, Mrs. Lucie Wambui, was a very sight when she first arrived at the Home from Sweden.

Dirty and in rags, the congenial, but slightly nervous, who had lately received a new pair of eyes, not through fear or pain, but because she was afraid the world would spell the clean bed offered her.

She now walks on crutches and enjoys her meals at the looms where she is not visited on orthopaedic visits under the guidance of her weaving teacher, Mrs. Brigitte Fallu, also Swedish.

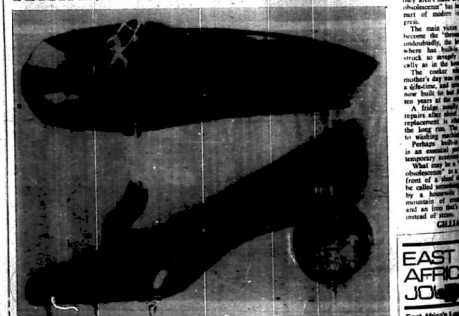

## Wages policy wanted

A wages award in Kenya's tea industry is not only intrinsically equitable but contains a serious message for the Government and everybody concerned in maintaining a stable industrial relations in a prosperous country.

In 1950, the basic wage in the tea industry stood at 3/5 a day; but had risen to 3/9 a day before the present award to the Industrial Court. The Tea Growers' Association offered a five per cent increase (to 4/15) and was accepted (to 4/6) covering a covering period of one year. The Plantation and Agricultural Workers' Union originally wanted 4/10 but later reduced this claim to 4/5. The court's award is binding for two years, a five per cent rise in the first year (to 4/15) and a further three per cent in the second (4/9).

As the court stressed, this dispute affected 281,500 workers and, because the tea industry is one of Kenya's largest revenue earners, any award must have serious repercussions. That is why the considerations at stake were rightly described as far-reaching. The court had to decide between an award as costly as to inhibit development, retarding the growth of employment; and an increase beneficial to rural workers who, in general, receive wages and benefits lower than are customary among workers in urban employment.

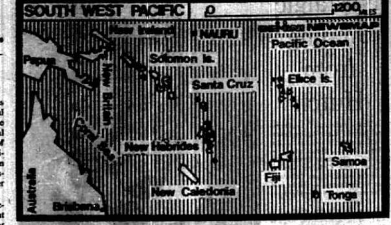
Repetitively, there does not appear to be any relation between wage demands and greater productivity, though this should be the equitable controlling earnings in any industry. It may come a day when the Industrial Court, which has heard more than 200 cases since its inception, will have to take the initiative in giving awards which will cut back demand, resulting in a recession and more unemployment. The absence of a defined wage policy, promised in 1952, may come to be a heavy strain on the Industrial Court, which has heard more than 200 cases since its inception.

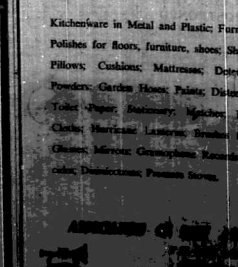

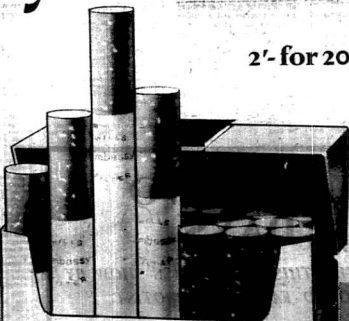

## South African Olympics

In reviewing the state of sport in the apartheid country of South Africa, the International Olympic Commission was required to make recommendations intended to eradicate racial discrimination in the South African participation in the Olympic movement. The report has been drafted by the IOC's chief executive, Dr. Joseph C. Killian, who is to be made available by no later than a complete issue, fraught with danger for the whole of the Olympic movement.

Therefore, it is right that every nation's representative should be present at Grenoble, should be allowed time to digest the report in confidence and give his opinion. Accordingly, a resolution will probably be drawn up for circulation and a postal vote taken on it by the South African National Olympic Committee (SANOC) will take its fate by about the middle of this month.

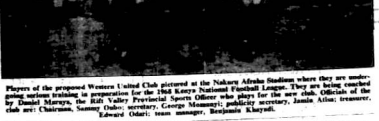

## Americans pull out of Saigon naval base

U.S. aircraft landed bombs on a heavily populated residential area of Saigon in an effort to drive out Vietcong forces, the U.S. Navy base at Vinh 55 miles south-west of the capital, was evacuated in the face of Communist attacks.

A company of American troops was flown by helicopter to Vinh Long in an attempt to recapture the key provincial capital.

A few miles away, two Vietcong battalions were locked in battle with two Government battalions and two U.S. companies but possession of Ben Tre, another Delta capital only 50 miles south of Saigon.

### Helicopters spray streets

Following the fierce bombing raid on the residential quarter of Co Vap in Saigon, helicopters flew low over the area spraying the streets and houses with bullets in a bid to finally root out the attackers.

A U.S. spokesman admitted that civilian casualties in the city had been heavy — at least 2,000 since the fighting started — and added that food supplies were beginning to feel the strain of the three-day Communist offensive.

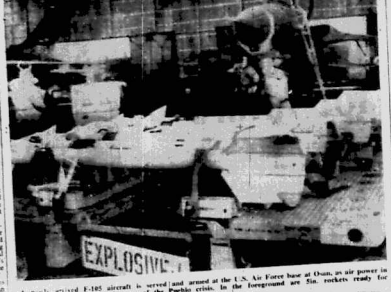

# Laos tense as U.S. rush in more troops

Laos was tense again last night following a Vietcong attack on American troops. Troops guarding the city were ordered to forbid movements as units of the First United States Cavalry Division were rushed in to strengthen the defenses.

In Ho Nang U.S. Marines and Government troops were locked in battle with North Vietnamese troops trying to close in on the city. Da Nang shuddered as U.S. jets bombed Communist positions only seven miles from the city, near the Strategic Highway No. 19.

Reports indicated that the battle, which started on Saturday night, could be the start of a North Vietnamese offensive against the South's second largest city, 100 miles north of Saigon.

In the past week of Vietcong offensives America lost more than 2,000 in just previous week of the Vietnam war. U.S. military authorities said 307 more had died in six days and more than 2,000 had been wounded. South Vietnamese records show that 228 Government troops had died and more than 4,000 had been wounded. U.S. figures put Communist losses at 4,000 dead. More than 500 civilians were reported killed in Saigon.

### Officers captured

Saigon Radio went on the air yesterday for the first time since the massive Vietcong offensive and announced the capture of a company general and two colonels in the streets of the city.

There were conflicting reports from the former imperial capital of Hue, 200 miles north of Da Nang. One said that North Vietnamese troops were trying to escape from Government forces sweeping through the city, and another said they were being contained.

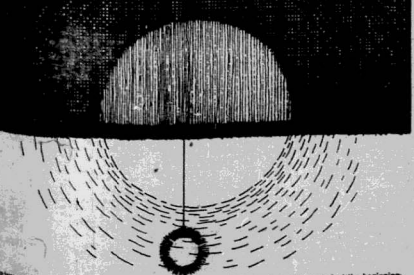

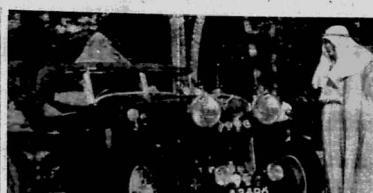

The resolution has been called "The I.O.C. members are not in favour of the South African participation in the 1968 Olympic Games, but they are not in favour of suspending South Africa from the Olympic Games."

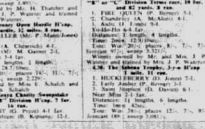

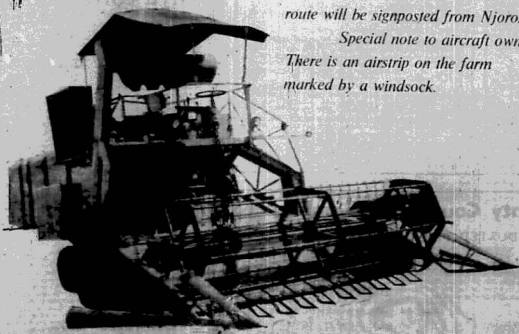
