# Hairdresser opens training school

A fair for styling and the ability to learn are the only qualities a girl in Kenya today needs to train for a career in hairdressing.

A few years ago it was more important whether she would afford the training or not, since she would have to be prepared to pay school fees and the expensive fee for a course. The only other way in to the hair trade in Kenya was to spend years in a salon as a shampoo girl.

Young Selma Naito, born and bred in Kenya, has now set up her own hairdressing school in Nairobi to run her own business. She was only 17 when she started by having opened a hairdressing salon.

At the Kenya School of Hairdressing pupils learn all about hair chemistry and styling, shampooing, using professional coloring and perming. Women are invited to act as models and pay half of the cost of an outfit set. Hairdressing examinations are also taken at the school and successful pupils become qualified hairdressers.

Selma feels that even girls who do not wish to take a career in hairdressing could benefit by attending evening classes at the school and learn to take care of their own hair.

For instance, air hostesses would find it very attractive and Selma has plans to

approach airways companies regarding the training of some of their girls to the hairdressing level, who spend their time in the air.

## Dependants' bonds waived

Further relaxations are being made in the spirit of the liberal policy which Mr. Moi said he would follow in considering applications for entry permits for dependants and trading licences in Kenya.

His Permanent Secretary, Mr. Ombaga announced that help agencies because of the "bonding" of dependants, which in turn will make it easier for them to keep on operating for the duration of the permits they are granted. Mr. Ombaga has shown that Mr. Moi agreed to waive the obligation to put up financial security for all dependants of permit-holders for whom entry permits are issued under original regulations.

The relief from bonding applies to people already in Kenya who are applying for entry permits that do not to anybody in a firm might want to import in the future.

Mr. Ombaga described those people from Tanzania and Uganda who are being exempted from applying for entry permits as "Tanzania and Uganda citizens who are African origin new working in Kenya". Citizens of these two countries are not Kenya citizens but the three countries form the East African Community and it is customary to allow free movement of labour between countries constituting a common market.

The exemption applies to citizens of "African origin". If "African" is defined as anybody born in Africa, the exemption could apply to Tanzania and Uganda citizens of Asian and European origin.

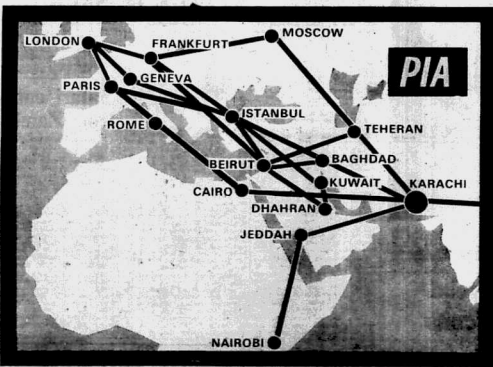

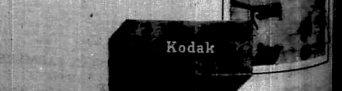

## Prohibited immigrants

Some misunderstanding may have been caused by yesterday's report that 1126 people were served with notices as Prohibited Immigrants and 1000 removal orders were effected during 1966 by the Kenya immigration authorities, taken for the Government.

These figures were taken from the annual report for 1965 of the Immigration Department. On the surface, they are misleading since they give the erroneous impression that the Government had deported an unexpectedly large number of people as prohibited immigrants.

While it is true that during 1966, prohibited immigrants notices were served on 1126 people who were ordered to leave Kenya if they could not fulfil the required conditions, it should not be imagined that they were deported for sinister political reasons.

The total compared with 1477 in the previous year, from which it can be seen there is nothing unusual in the trend. These figures represent the number of people seeking to enter Kenya with out fulfilling the necessary immigration requirements. For example, people of whatever racial origins, or from whatever countries, are expected to possess valid passport, travel documents and to conform with other routine regulations.

The total of people listed was of those who had entered

without entering Kenya without necessary preliminary arrangements in conformity with the requirements. The prohibitions notices were served a fortnight or a month to regularize their arrangements and produce the necessary documents. If they comply with the orders to do so within the specified time, all would be well and they were allowed to remain during the interim.

Of the 1126 cases, the majority were men, the proportions were met by 903, so that in no sense was the immigration authority harassed. As regards people being physically required to leave Kenya, removal orders were issued against 101 in 1966, compared with 179 in 1965, and orders executed were 74, compared with 91.

Deportation orders for undesirable political reasons can be regarded as slight, though efficacious in respect of internal security and has been accurately reported as they occurred. Nobody should be taken away with the implication that Kenya departs people wholesale, without due cause or revelation of the circumstances. The great majority of those served with prohibited immigrants notices was composed of those who have only themselves to blame for seeking to enter Kenya without complying with the formalities and ones of them, given time, they are able to satisfy the immigration authorities.

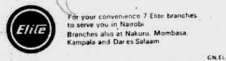

# Half of Kenya pyrethrum grown in Kisii

The Provincial Agriculture Officer, Nyamta Province, Mr. Simon Kamai, has disclosed in his annual report for the year 1962 that the Kisii farmers produced more than half of Kenya's pyrethrum product.

The problem in Kisii, says Mr. Kamai, is that some of the pyrethrum growers rejected the advice of agricultural officers to plant more acreage than their quota allows.

Vietcong leave 94 dead after attack on base

A Vietcong battalion, armed with mortars and automatic weapons, yesterday launched a heavy attack on a U.S. base southwest of Saigon, but after two hours leaving 94 dead, American casualties in the attack were reported to be 20 killed and 60 wounded.

The U.S. artillery base is 42 miles southwest of the capital and the Vietcong first had down a mortar battery, before following up with a fierce ground attack.

A military spokesman said that in the southwest, Marine units in the Key Aie base had the other mortars, and have been heavily pounded from North Vietnamese rocket and mortar.

Five Marines were killed and wounded at the base where more than 300 rockets and mortars were fired on the base. U.S. planes have kept up their attacks on North Vietnam, attacking an important dock area southwest of Hanoi for the first time.

In Saigon only yesterday, Vietcong battalions moved out of the coast, headed inland hoping to knock out one of the major arteries into the capital — but they missed their target.

The successful conclusion of the Gatundu Hospital is food for thought for other areas of Kenya, some of which are prepared to wait for help to come from outside. Others have embarked on self-help projects, without a sufficient national overseas, were helped by the Government.

## President urges 'Unite for progress'

**Vigorous welcome from M.P.s**

Members of Parliament greeted the President with a vigorous welcome when he arrived in Nairobi for the State opening of the Kenya Parliament yesterday. The time had come for Kenyans to close their ranks in the renewed determination of Kenya's nationalization.

Those who employ foreign ideology or outmoded tribalism, or who are driven by thoughts of personal aggrandizement, are urged to step out of the picture, an understanding of the nationhood which can give this country greatness.

"We have chosen, in this Parliament, the political leadership of a strong and mature State. But this must not overshadow the Government's duty, to safeguard, on behalf of the people, the foundations of our national identity," said Mr. Kenyatta.

**Emphasis on rural progress**

The President also made these points: Development Plan for 1966-1973 will be prepared placing particular emphasis on rural progress and advancement of less developed areas.

Immigration is to be the intense of the Government to undertake the biggest task of the economy by forcing the pace of localisation beyond the point which the private commercial sector can handle.

Last year's trade performance, valued at 20 per cent reduction in imports and a 10 per cent increase in exports.

Agribusiness: Kenya faces a price problem especially in competition with countries producing more cheaply. Farmers should produce at a lower cost and strive for maximum yields.

Healthcare: Last year's report shows that 100,000 people were treated in 1965. The Government is committed to the development of primary health care services.

Education: Output of primary schools has increased by 10 per cent. The Government has accepted the report of the Kenya Education Commission.

# Zambia keen to increase trade with E. Africa

**Standard Staff Reporter**  
The possibility of exporting Kenya produce to Zambia via a fleet of plant transport planes will be explored this week by members of a Zambian Trade Mission who arrived in Nairobi yesterday.

The eighteen-man team led by Mr. Alan Gibson, high commissioner for East Africa by Special Appointment and Kenya Trade Commissioner in Zambia, will be in Zambia for two weeks to study trade between Zambia and the East African states.

Mr. Gibson explained when he was in Kenya that the team was organized to study trade with East Africa, but he added that the major drawback to this was the transportation of goods.

For this reason the party included a transport expert, Mr. Peter Redfern.

Mr. Redfern said that he would be flying to Zambia to help charter air services between Zambia and Nairobi, using a fleet of 200 light aircraft which would increase much more quickly than conventional heavy transport which was too slow for the carriage of fresh produce.

He mentioned that if agreement could be reached on the use of the transport planes, Zambia would be able to buy fresh food and vegetables and dairy produce from Kenya in order to supply its own needs.

At the same time more of the light aircraft would be available to carry copper, zinc and drilled steel from Zambia to Kenya.

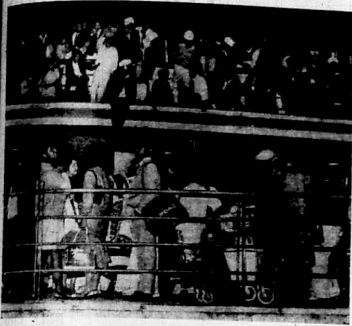

# No slump in trade despite Asian exodus from Kenya

Despite the Asian exodus from Kenya during the last two weeks, traders in Nairobi yesterday reported that there had been a slump. There had been a slump in the last two months, but business was generally little affected, said a number of traders interviewed yesterday.

The vice-president of the Kenya National Chamber of Commerce in Nairobi, Mr. J. M. Patel, in a statement said that he regretted the attitude of the Ministry of Commerce and Industry to a statement he had issued seeking clarification on the effects of the Trade Licensing Act.

Mr. Patel had asked the Minister for Commerce and Industry to clarify the position of traders who would be required to apply for licenses if they were non-citizens.

He said it was a pity that the Minister for Commerce and Industry had not issued his own "popcorn confusion and alarm".

He said that the Government's intention of issuing licenses to non-citizens was a step towards the final separation of the Ministry of Commerce and Industry from the Ministry of Finance.

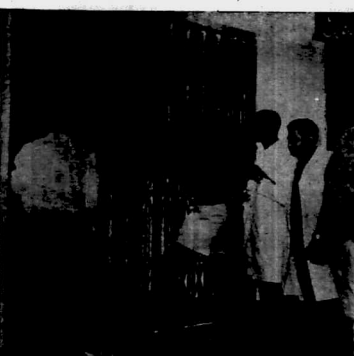
