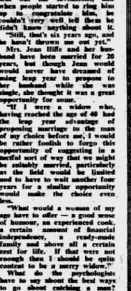

Exodus in perspective

As the debate rages in the British Parliament on the Bill to curb Commonwealth immigration, it is important to have a view on the issue from a proper perspective. Sweeping generalisations are being bandied about, one of the end of an era has been heralded in East Africa, particularly Kenya. Only a few weeks ago, the Government would continue to welcome private investment.

President Kenyatta's remarks when he opened a meeting in Nairobi yesterday were an effective answer to the charge that the Government would continue to welcome private investment.

Faith in the strength of the African economy, and the fact that the Government will invest in the country, has also been expressed by the Association for the Development of Kenya, a report which takes into account the Asian exodus and the uncertainties caused by the Kenya Immigration and Trade Licensing Act.

The Asian exodus, prominent though it is in thousands of people, is not such a crisis for Kenya as for Britain. It has forced the Labour Government of Mr. Wilson to introduce a legislative measure which would have horrified the ideologue Socialists of an earlier generation, and must be causing agonies of conscience among those still serving a party which has changed its banner to one of day-to-day expediency.

The discriminatory nature of the new Bill, which permits thousands of British passport holders from exercising all rights to settle in Britain, has let loose a torrent of criticism which has degenerated into abuse and invective. This is excusable from those who feel themselves victimised, but to label Britain as "white" and South Africa in unfair. It takes no account of the expatriate policy Britain has maintained since the war.

Not does it acknowledge the genuine attempts which have been made to minimise the racial problems which these influxes, such as the 1962 Race Relations Act, which is being expanded to meet racial discrimination illegal in employment, housing and other fields.

Complexities and poor politics and racial discrimination, be behind the Bill, though in effect, it will apply racial restrictions. British officials speak "impressive statistics" to justify the need to phase the inflow to ensure "equitable treatment of immigrants and abas of the people of Britain".

The statistics are correct, some of 200,000 people in East Africa, 150,000 in the

1,000,000 who at present have dual citizenship in their own country and the U.K. who are all eligible to hold British passports but who have not done so in a wish to come to Britain on a time-bomb scale.

Not, that is, until the inflow of Asians from East Africa began to dwindle. Only did British politicians and the Government were then sitting on a time-bomb scale.

This lamentable lack of foresight in the Government for adding other Commonwealth countries which have been inadequately consulted with, was a mistake. It is entirely British in origin. As President Kenyatta has said, Uganda cannot be regarded a refuge camp for Asians.

Unctad delegates favour more trade with East

Delegates at the United Nations Conference on Trade and Development (UNCTAD) have expressed general support for an expansion of trade between Communist countries and the rest of the world.

A conference debate hoped to strengthen ties between trade representatives from Communist countries and Western market economies (East-West trade) was opened by the United Nations Conference on Trade and Development (UNCTAD) on Monday.

Delegates from industrialized and developing countries addressed an increase in East-West trade and South trade and called for the removal of any barriers against it.

Several delegates from Latin America, Africa and Asia pointed out that their countries' trade with the Communist bloc had greatly increased over the past few years.

The Soviet delegate, Mr. V. P. Gerasimov, said the Soviet Union was always ready to help develop trade agreements.

Some countries of Communist bloc should make definite efforts to tackle the problem of payments.

Nippon Mining Co., which last year obtained the mining rights from the Congolese Government, is scheduled to create the new company.

The company will explore and develop the copper resources in the first area of the district which is close to the mining town of Kolwezi.

The company is also to be a member of the State-owned Societe Generale Congolese des Matieres, the company which has been operating in the area since 1962.

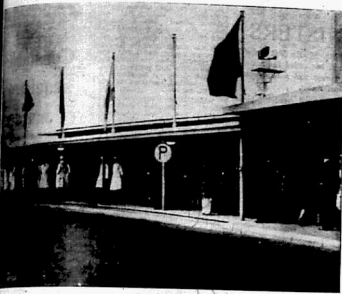

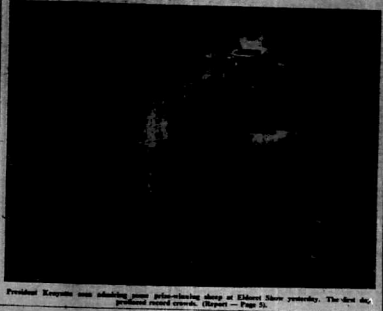

Asians pray for sense as Queen seals the door

Whig groups of Asians made preparations to hold a day of prayer today for "good sense" to be introduced into the situation, there was considerable hope in Nairobi yesterday as to how Britain's new law curbing immigration might in fact work and whether there was still hope of getting in before the door closed.

The Commonwealth Immigration Bill was due to come into force at midnight last night. It had been given the Royal Assent by Queen Elizabeth after being passed by the House of Lords in an 112-hour sitting.

One airline flying regularly from Nairobi to London yesterday said flatly that it would take no Asian passengers whatsoever for the time being. Another was taking them provided it could get them into the air before the British legislation became effective.

Ban by B.U.A.

B.U.A., acting on instructions received yesterday morning from London, put a ban on all Asian holders of British passports until the immigration situation became clear. Even travellers intending only to visit Britain and return to Nairobi were unable to buy return tickets.

A B.U.A. flight left Nairobi yesterday morning with several foreign seats, but all but ten of them were filled at Entebbe. A number of Asians who turned up at Nairobi Airport for the flight were informed of the ban.

B.O.A.C.'s instructions (from London) were different. A spokesman said the airline had been told that British Asians would be allowed to fly to London on the flight to London which had taken off yesterday afternoon. The flight was to leave Nairobi today at 2 a.m. today, said Airline Times.

Officials were talking bookish and seemed not to have any idea what might or would not develop in the next few days. They were saying that the airline will only fly from Nairobi to London if they are asked to do so by the British A. A. spokesman.

Stateless' because Kenya's visa order

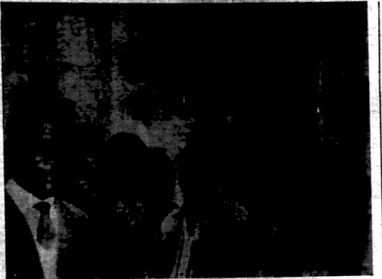

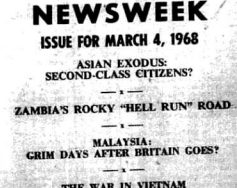
