Pakistan keen to boost trade

INVESTMENT IN KENYA 'WELCOME'

There was scope for expansion of trade between Kenya and Pakistan of the near future, the chairman of the economic development committee of the Kenya National Council, Mr. E. S. Shabazz, said, in a statement to the National Council, Monday, March 11.

Ghana back on road to economic recovery

Today is Ghana's National Day—the 11th anniversary of its independence. This article, prepared by the Ghana High Commission, concentrates on the efforts of the National Liberation Council, which took over the country on the fall of Dr. Nkrumah two years ago, to restore the country's squandered economic resources.

Gold Coast showed independence on March 6, 1947, under the leadership of Kwame Nkrumah. His wealth and the security under the British colonial power had made it possible to establish a viable position to build an infrastructure for a take-off into sustained economic growth.

But through mismanagement of resources the fabulous resources, amounting to £200,000,000 were frittered away in a period of rampant inflation. By the end of 1946 Ghana was saddled with a national debt of £140,000,000.

The National Liberation Council inherited a very difficult economic problem which was not solved until February 1960. Without deterring corruption and somewhat modified action the position of Ghana—as a state of virtual economic bankruptcy—was not only averted but a substantial shortage of food essential commodities and other necessities would have rapidly become untenable.

Essentially these problems sprang from the policy of forced expropriation and excessive spending pursued by the previous Government. In spite of steadily rising tax burdens, the budget showed chronic deficits, covered by inflationary borrowing.

Most of the spending was for investments, the majority of which were built for prestige purposes or were ill-conceived as to their economic contribution. The Government's foreign exchange restrictions, which forced the then Administration to purchase foreign goods, were not needed for its own programme.

Great shortages of many commodities were created and consumer prices were up by 70 per cent in the three years after independence. Ghana as the Empire for Government Programme was no longer able to finance a service of foreign exchange to the end of the 1950s. The Government's excessive spending and the problem of unemployment by increasing the number of public workers that were needed for productive work.

In short, the National Liberation Council had to face the serious problem of inflationary deficit, foreign exchange shortage and unemployment.

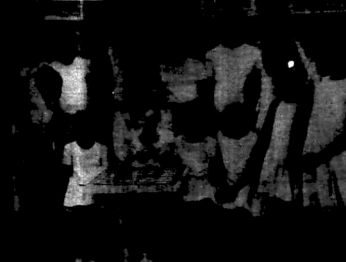



Landlocked States appeal for special aid

New landlocked countries, denied direct access to the sea, are asking for special aid to help them break through their economic isolation.

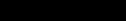

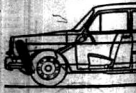
