Rhodesia hangs two: Surprise stay for four

Two African convicted criminals were hanged in Salisbury yesterday. Nine were reprieved and the lives of four more were in the balance last night.

The two who went to the gallows at 9 am, were Frank Chimoro and Yakaruru Jeremiah. They were sentenced to death in 1965 for the murder of an African school-teacher.

They were executed while representatives of some four dozen white Rhodesians were under construction. An official in the Minister's Administration for the Government, said Dupont, said he had reprieved another nine African awaiting execution.

15 cases considered

Rhodesia challenges U.K.

World opinion has been further excited against Mr. Smith's illegal regime in Rhodesia because of the action of the four more Africans bringing to the fore total who have put the death penalty during the past week.

In all the woe of emotion, it must not be forgotten there was a subtle legal difference between the execution of the two yesterday and the first three: the two hanged yesterday were convicted before the illegal declaration of independence and the two hanged yesterday were convicted after the illegal declaration of independence.

There had been a general belief that six would be executed yesterday. Clearly, the Rhodesian Cabinet was deeply disturbed by the world-wide reaction to the original crime of hanging. For those executions must rank as murder.

The decision to proceed with the second set of executions was taken after long and soul-searching deliberations in the Cabinet. Applications for reprieve on behalf of the two men were approved by the Executive Council. None were granted and four remain outstanding for further consideration.

These four men were convicted of terrorist charges — bomb-throwing in buses and buildings — also in 1962.

The Cabinet, it was announced, decided after due consideration that the petitions of the two who went to the scaffold could not be accepted and that "the law must take its course". So it has, and the disquieting question remains: How can a regime illegal in itself, because it is unconstitutional, have any authority to enforce the death penalty?

If not, how will law and order be maintained? A government held incapable of enforcing one type of sentence can scarcely be considered legally able to principles of enforcing other and lesser sentences for crimes. The difference is that, with the

death penalty, no opportunity is left for second thoughts and clemency as the circumstances change as change they must with the advancing times.

What emerges from the two sets of executions is an attitude of defiance. Mr. Smith's administration has arrogated to itself the legal authority of a legally constituted government which, patently, it is not.

The regime regards the executions as an assertion of sovereignty and independence from Britain, while cynically enjoying loyalty to the Queen — to whom they are legally bound — and their associates see themselves as ordering their own affairs despite the British Government's opposition and the pressure of world opinion.

Internally, the executions probably mean Mr. Smith is under severe challenge from the extreme wing and has had to give way to his deputy. If this reading is correct, it contains a metaphorical outlook for the future.

There are about 100 Africans awaiting execution — in Salisbury just some of them having waited under the shadow of death for more than two years. The hangings last week came after the Rhodesian Appeal Court had ruled that condemnations for more than two years of Africans had no right of appeal to the Judicial Committee of the Privy Council. This ruling was the last stage of a constitutional test case brought by Africans detained after the Rhodesian illegal declaration of independence in November 1965.

The arbitrary exercise of authority over life and death, claimed by the breakaway régime, is a direct challenge to Mr. Wilson and the British Government. Are they powerless to deal with a reprobate administration which gains power in a rebellious colony? Not Mr. Smith, but Mr. Wilson, must think again, realising that the time for evasive talk has ended and the Rhodesian illegal régime must be brought to book. It works not months, Mr. Wilson must be brought to task. In Rhodesia will be lost to law and order. The world must be told that Rhodesia is now two distinct entities. It is a separate British-African citizen that can suffer more directly.

New nation will face difficult problems

Much thought has been given to the development of sea fishing, tobacco and snuffsmoke etc. An agricultural development plan of Mauritius should double the island's land farming and dairy farming. Fisheries have been developed and a number of new small industries have been started with Government backing; these include furniture, glass fibre, and plastics and clothing.

During the past 26 years, Mauritius has received nearly £200 million in aid from Britain and the United States. Aid for housing construction alone has exceeded £100 million. In 1962 and 1961 was substantial and has led to the building of about 50,000 houses.

There are eight Government-owned hospitals, and a big one is being built in the north of Mauritius. It is intended to be a model for the creation of a new health system.

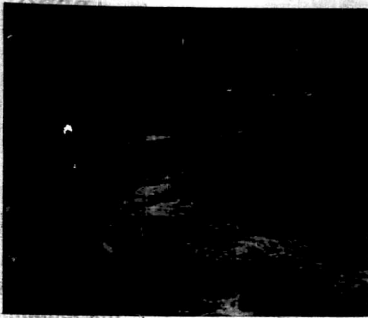

REGIME WINNING SANCTIONS WAR

More than a year after mandatory sanctions were imposed, Rhodesia claims it is no far winning its battle for economic survival. Economists say that economic growth rate is probably even better now than it was before the country gained independence from Britain 28 months ago.

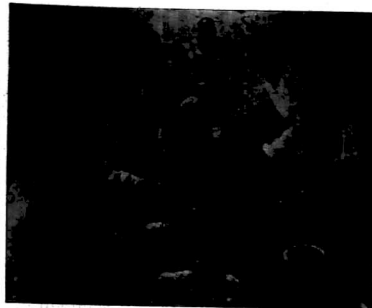

Starvation Still Depresses Nairobi's Industrial Workers
Nairobi's industrial workers are still depressed and hungry, it was stated in a report, issued Monday by the Industrial Area Council. The report says that the workers at these roadside restaurants can get a good meal for a shilling. It says that many people find that a shilling meal is the only thing they have been able to get since the start of the year.

A full lunch at these roadside restaurants can cost as little as 50 cents and a drink of beer and water is sold for 10 cents. Many workers, however, report that most of the food is still sold for a shilling. The report provides very little shelter for the customer when it comes to the system operated at the roadside. After reaching agreement with the trader, customers are either allowed credit, or must pay an amount of money in advance. Some of the traders have made arrangements to take in the form of a note, but this has not been put into effect. The lack of facilities, facilities many workers report their trade with them. The report says that they will be built and run on a co-operative basis.

Until this happens, however, the food stalls will continue to be a source of income for a number of the workers.



For these workers in Nairobi Industrial Area, lunching means a visit to the canteen, a plate of fish and a chat with their friends. They live some distance away so there's no time to go home for a rest. Their food may cost them 40 cents and the compensation is absolutely fine.

Relaxation on permits

Annulment has been noted in the application of the regulations under Kenya's Immigration Act providing for entry (work) permits. It would be desirable to relax the Government's stance to allow the national economy through any bary or ill-conceived strictures.

Where difficult situations are caused because short term permits have been issued to expert staff or to employees who may not hold professional qualifications but whose retention is essential for at least a period of years, until such time as suitably trained, recruited and trained, recruitment can be had to the immigration authorities and until such time as the country exists to help companies. For it is recognised at Government level that undue interference with business even will be detrimental to the country's interest.

Confusing such obstacles, international firms may assist withdrawing their headquarters, as happened in other countries under the irritation of restrictive regulations. At the very least, development could be arrested because these companies may be disinclined to leave their present capital investments, but feel disinclined to venture any more, especially as they have to face a 14 per cent premium on investment if Kenya's currency has not been devalued parallel with their own, i.e. sterling.

These points add up to serious considerations for the Government and officials, down the scale, who are charged with administering the entry permit regulations, trade licensing and the licensing of transport, and Mr. Moi has spoken of a liberal approach.

As regards transport, several instances have been brought to light, including difficulties experienced by transport firms in Nairobi, the disadvantageous effects of people being refused licences to carry their own goods, and the serious shortage of vehicles operating for the transport of this sector's maize in the Trans Nzoia.

The policy of introducing citizens into the transport business should not be pushed too far too fast. Some relaxation has been announced, to the relief of many companies, concerning depositors' bonds under the entry permit system. The period for application for permits in the first category to be called up expired last week. Some applicants, who have been refused, must leave the country when the period of grace expires; others have received permits varying from

a few months to two years which may be renewable; many thousands of applications for citizenship.

In these circumstances, it is desirable that no further steps should be attempted, until the backlog has been cleared. The Government is obliged to deal with the administrative backlog caused by so rapidly proliferated an operation having unforeseen consequences in business circles; therefore, the probability of an early announcement on this subject is highly unlikely. The Government is planning a complete structure of trying to classify widely ranging jobs under a single category will be abandoned as too onerous. Instead, the simplest and most efficacious method would be to treat each category individually and judge each on its merits.

The tendency with any trader, large or small, will be to run down such strings against the possibility of having to close down by and by. If this continues to happen, the effect will be to scale down orders, restrict place with the wholesalers and importers and, in consequence, an all-round reduction in trade and loss in taxation.

Though it may be impossible to calculate the loss in revenue from Income Tax and Customs Duty, of course a recession and the drain on currency with the flight of capital in the immigration wave, the financial well-being of the country must be seriously threatened and there is some apprehension over the possible financial measures which may have to be applied to close the gap.

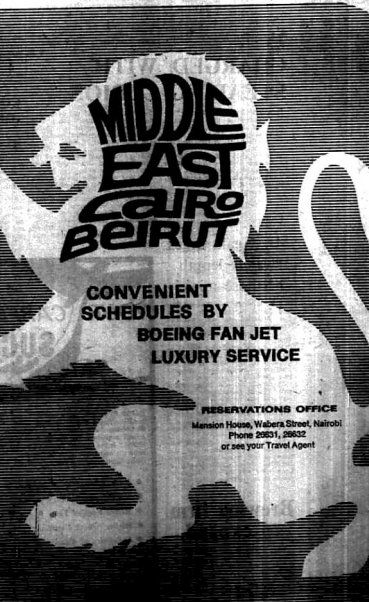

Essentially, conventional rural farmers must be trained to modify their traditional, and often wasteful, farming methods. Although other methods are being used, the Pioneers are being trained in the most modern methods. They will be training about 1000 Pioneers a year by 1970.

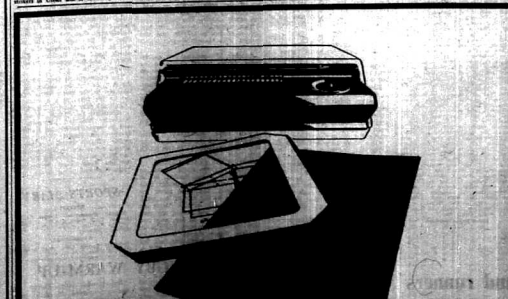

As stock exchanges and gold markets closed in yesterday, the value of the dollar plummeted against Swiss and French francs after the United States had lifted the gold cover on its currency in a bid to end the international monetary crisis.

But while dealings on the Swiss gold and foreign exchange markets were depressed, the Zurich Indian market opened with a flood of demands for gold despite soaring prices.

World gold stamped

What lay behind the world gold rush which became a stampede was mistrust of the dollar and sterling paper money. Led by the French, with their traditional inclination to hoard gold, speculators were gambling on the likelihood of dollar devaluation and, in consequence, a further devaluation of sterling.

Paper currency can, as frequently does, fall in value but, on its record, gold can only appreciate. The U.S. Administration is determined to maintain the price of gold at 35 dollars an ounce, the rate reported as the cornerstone of the American monetary system, and the entire dollar and sterling currencies. Ever since Britain devalued last November, President Johnson and his experts have been at pains to insist there will be no dollar devaluation.

If the price of gold is increased, devaluation must follow. Hence the various measures to hold the price of gold, including the closing of gold markets almost everywhere except in Paris where, because of the consistent buying during recent times which helped to precipitate the crash, the position remained strong.

By raising the discount rate to five per cent, the highest since the disastrous 1929 crash, the intention is to make interest rates more attractive and stop the flood of foreign dollar holders wanting to cash in their paper currency. Emergency legislation has released the entire American gold reserves worth 11,154,000,000 dollars to meet foreign demands and preserve dollar parity, withdrawing the blocked 10,400,000,000 dollars worth held in reserve as backing for currency in circulation, plus the 1,000,000,000 dollars worth stored in Fort Knox Vault.

At the request of the U.S. Government, reportedly made by President Johnson to Mr. Wilson over their "hot line", Britain fell into line, immediately closing the London Gold Market. In order to ally fears, the British

Treasury and the U.S. Federal Reserve Board made a statement, insisting that its closure did not infer devaluation, although the dollar market's outcome of raising gold into the "concessions" price of 35 dollars.

However, this view does not command much support in Johannesburg, where devaluation is being expected in the near future. 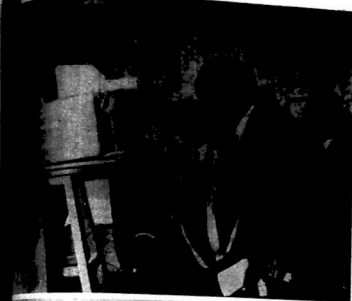
